

# Where Did Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus Come From? The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated throughout the world on the Friday following the Feast of Corpus Christi.

Every year, 19 days after Pentecost, the Catholic Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. But where did that tradition originate?

Devotion to the wounded heart of Jesus has its origins in the eleventh century, when pious Christians meditated on the Five Wounds of Christ. There grew up among the faithful prayers to the Sacred Heart, prayers to the Shoulder Wound of Christ—private devotions which helped Christians to focus on the passion and death of Christ, and thus to grow in love for our Savior who had suffered and died for us. It was not until 1670, however, that a French priest, Fr. Jean Eudes, celebrated the first Feast of the Sacred Heart.

Around the same time, a pious sister by the name of Margaret Mary Alacoque began to report visions of Jesus. He appeared to her frequently, and in December 1673, he permitted Margaret Mary—as had once allowed St. Gertrude—to rest her head upon his Heart. As she experienced the comfort of his presence, Jesus told her of his great love and explained that he had chosen her to make his love and his goodness known to all.

The following year, in June or July of 1674, Margaret Mary reported that Jesus wanted to be honored under the figure of His Heart of flesh. He asked the faithful to receive Him in the Eucharist frequently, especially on the First Friday of the month, and to observe a Holy Hour of devotion to Him.

And then in 1675, during the octave of Corpus Christi, Margaret Mary received the vision which came to be known as the "great apparition." Jesus asked that the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated each year on the Friday following Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice which Christ had made for them.

The devotion became popular after St. Margaret Mary's death in 1690. However, because the Church is always careful in approving a private apparition or devotion, the feast was not established as an official feast for all of France until 1765.

On May 8, 1873, the devotion to the Sacred Heart was formally approved by Pope Pius IX; and 26 years later – on July 21, 1899 – Pope Leo XIII urgently recommended that all bishops throughout the world observe the feast in their dioceses.

Today, June 24th, the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated throughout the world on the Friday following the Feast of Corpus Christi.

# THE 10 INCREDIBLE SAINTS POPE FRANCIS CANONIZED ON MAY 15TH INCLUDING 3 MARTYRS (part 2)

Pope Francis canonized 10 new saints on Sunday, May 15th. Of these saints, he canonized six men and four women. Three of these saints are even martyrs! Below are brief descriptions of their amazing lives.

- 6) Saint Father Justin Russolillo-Born Jan. 18, 1891, Father Justin Russolillo was an Italian priest who founded the Society of Divine Vocations. He dedicated his life to promoting and educating young people about religious vocations and following God's call in life. He died on Aug. 2, 1955 at age 64. Pope Benedict XVI beatified Saint Justin in 2011. His feast is Aug. 2nd.
- 7) Saint Maria Domenica Mantovani-Born in 1862 Saint Maria Domenica Mantovani was an Italian nun and the co-foundress of the Little Sisters of the Holy Family. She dedicated her life to helping the poor, ill and ederly. She entrusted herself to the Holy Family and to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. She died at age 71 on Feb. 2, 1934. Pope St. John Paul II beatified her in 2003. Her feast is Feb. 2nd.
- 8) Saint Luigi Maria Palazzolo-Saint Luigi Maria Palazzolo was an Italian priest and founded the Sisters of the Poor, or the Palazzolo Institute. This incredible priest dedicated his life to serving neglected children and opened several orphanages. He died murmuring the name of Jesus on June 15, 1886 at age 58. St. John XXIII beatified him in 1963. His feast is June 15th.
- 9) Saint Anne-Marie Rivier-Born in 1768, Anne-Marie Revier was a French nun and the foundress of the Sisters of the Presentation of Mary. She was dropped as a child, causing her to become handicapped. She opened her congregation prior to the French Revolution, even amid persecution. She focused on child education. Saint Anne-Marie died in 1838 at age 68. Pope John Paul II beatified her in 1982. Her feast is Feb.3rd.
- **10)** Saint Titus Brandsma-Born in 1881, Saint Titus Brandsma was a Dutch Carmelite friar, priest, and martyr. For opposing the Nazi ideology, they murdered him in the Dachau concentration camp in 1942 at age 61. Pope Saint John Paul II beatified him in 1985. His feast is July 27th.

### **Receiving Communion:**

- Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand. Those wishing to receive Communion on the tongue should wait until the end of the Communion distribution and receive from the Priest.
- Only Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion with a valid Sacred Heart/St. Pio ID card can receive Communion in a Pyx to take to the sick and homebound. For anyone that is not a Eucharistic Minister and is requesting a Host needs to see the Priest before or after Mass. Hosts will not be distributed during Mass.
- If you need a low gluten Host, please go to the Communion line in the front on the pulpit side, and ask the Eucharistic Minister.

# Sponsorship Certificates Letters of Eligibility

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

## A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

\*\*Children of parishioners over 21 years of age should register independently.\*\*
