Dear Parish Families,

This Sunday is called "Divine Mercy" Sunday, ever since St Pope John Paul II declared it to be so on April 22, 2001, when he canonized Sr. Faustina (making her St. Faustina). On the same day he surprised the entire world by establishing Divine Mercy Sunday (the feast day associated with the message) as a feast day for the entire Church. The feast day falls on the second Sunday of the Easter season. On that day, John Paul II declared, **"This is the happiest day of my life."**

I, as your pastor, earnestly request families to learn the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, and pray at least once a week especially after Mass. Jesus promised to St Faustina that if someone prays the chaplet on their deathbed, or if someone prays it for them, that his mercy will rule in their judgment.

A few of Jesus' promises:

"When they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as a just Judge but as a merciful Savior."

"When hardened sinners say it, I will fill their souls with peace, and the hour of their death will be a happy one."

"Through this chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will."

Below is a large excerpt from the homily of St. John Paul II on that day.

The Gospel, which has just been proclaimed, helps us to grasp the full sense and value of this gift. The Evangelist John makes us share in the emotion felt by the Apostles in their meeting with Christ after his Resurrection. Our attention focuses on the gesture of the Master, who transmits to the fearful, astounded disciples the mission of being ministers of Divine Mercy. He shows them His hands and His side, which bear the marks of the Passion, and tells them: *"As the Father has sent Me, even so I send you"* (Jn 20: 21). Immediately afterwards *"He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained" "* (Jn 20: 22-23). Jesus entrusted to them the gift of "forgiving sins", a gift that flows from the wounds in His hands, His feet, and especially from His pierced side. From there a wave of mercy is poured out over all humanity.

Let us relive this moment with great spiritual intensity. Today the Lord also shows us His glorious wounds and His heart, an inexhaustible source of light and truth, of love and forgiveness. The Heart of Christ! His "Sacred Heart" has given men everything: redemption, salvation, sanctification. St Faustina Kowalska saw coming from this Heart that was overflowing with generous love, two rays of light which illuminated the world. "The two rays", according to what Jesus Himself told her, "represent the blood and the water" (*Diary*, p. 132). The blood recalls the sacrifice of Golgotha and the mystery of the Eucharist; the water, according to the rich symbolism of the Evangelist John, makes us think of Baptism and the Gift of the Holy Spirit (cf. Jn 3: 5; 4: 14).

Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska

St. Maria Faustina Kowalska of the Blessed Sacrament was born as Helena Kowalska, in Glogowiec, Poland on August 25, 1905, the third of 10 children to a poor and religious family.

Faustina first felt a calling to the religious life when she was just seven years old and attended the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. After finishing her schooling, Faustina wanted to immediately join a convent. However, her parents refused to let her. At 16 years old, Faustina became a housekeeper to help her parents and support herself.

In 1924, Faustina experienced her first vision of Jesus. While at a dance with her sister, Natalia, Faustina saw a suffering Jesus and then went to a Cathedral. According to Faustina, Jesus instructed her to leave Warsaw immediately and join a convent.

Faustina packed her bags at once and departed the following morning. When she arrived in Warsaw, she entered Saint James Church, the first church she came across and attended Mass.

While in Warsaw, Faustina approached many different convents, but was turned away every time. She was judged on her appearance and sometimes rejected for poverty. Finally, the mother superior for the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of mercy decided to take in Faustina on the condition that she could pay for her own religious habit. Working as a housekeeper, Faustina began to save her money and make deposits to the Convent.

On April 30, 1926, at 20 years old, she finally received her habit and took the religious name of Sister Maria Faustina and in 1928 she took her first religious vows as a nun.

Over the next year, Faustina traveled as a cook in convents. She arrived in Plock, Poland. Soon after she began to show the first signs of illness and was sent away to rest but after several months returned to the convent.

On February 22, 1931, Faustina was visited by Jesus, who presented himself as the “King of Divine Mercy” wearing a white garment with red and pale rays coming from His heart. She was asked to become the apostle and secretary of God’s mercy, a model of how to be merciful to others, and an instrument for reemphasizing God’s plan of mercy for the world.

During that message Jesus explained He wanted the Divine Mercy image to be “solemnly, blessed on the first Sunday after Easter.

In 1932, Faustina returned to Warsaw and on May 1, 1933 she took her final vows and became a perpetual sister of Our Lady of Mercy. After taking her vows, Faustina was transferred to Vilnius, where she met Fr. Michael Sopocko, the appointed confessor to the nuns. Sopocko encouraged her to keep a diary and record her conversations with Jesus. Faustina told Sopocko about the Divine Mercy image. Fr. Sopocko introduced her to Eugene Kazimierowski, the artist of the first Divine Mercy painting.

The following year she reported Jesus said to her “My daughter, do whatever is within your power to spread devotion to My Divine Mercy, I will make up for what you lack.

In July 1937 the first holy card with the Divine Mercy image was created and Faustina provided instructions for the Novena of Divine Mercy which continued to grow in popularity.

Faustina’s health significantly deteriorated by the end of 1937 and on October 5, 1938 Faustina passed away. Her entire life, in imitation of Christ’s, was to be a sacrifice—a life lived for others

Faustina was beatified on April 18, 1993 and canonized on April 30, 2000 by St. John Paul II Her feast day is October 5th and she is the patron saint of Mary.



The History of the Chaplet of The Divine Mercy

In 1935, St. Faustina received a vision of an angel sent by God to chastise a certain city. She began to pray for mercy, but her prayers were powerless. Suddenly she saw the Holy Trinity and felt the power of Jesus' grace within her. At the same time she found herself pleading with God for mercy with words she heard interiorly:

Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world; for the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us. (*Diary*, 475)

As she continued saying this inspired prayer, the angel became helpless and could not carry out the deserved punishment (see 474). The next day, as she was entering the chapel, she again heard this interior voice, instructing her how to recite the prayer that our Lord later called "the Chaplet." This time, after "have mercy on us" were added the words "and on the whole world" (476). From then on, she recited this form of prayer almost constantly, offering it especially for the dying.

In subsequent revelations, the Lord made it clear that the Chaplet was not just for her, but for the whole world. He also attached extraordinary promises to its recitation.

Encourage souls to say the Chaplet which I have given you (1541).

Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death (687). When they say this Chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the Merciful Savior (1541). Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation. Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this Chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy (687). I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy (687). Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will. (1731)

Prayed on ordinary rosary beads, The Chaplet of The Divine Mercy is an intercessory prayer that extends the offering of the Eucharist, so it is especially appropriate to use it after having received Holy Communion at Holy Mass. It may be said at any time, but our Lord specifically told St. Faustina to recite it during the nine days before the Feast of Mercy (the first Sunday after Easter). He then added: "By this Novena, [of Chaplets] I will grant every possible grace to souls." (796)

It is likewise appropriate to pray the Chaplet during the "Hour of Great Mercy" — three o'clock each afternoon (recalling the time of Christ's death on the cross). In His revelations to St. Faustina, Our Lord asked for a special remembrance of His Passion at that hour.



The Miracle of Brendan O'Neill

Brendan O'Neill was a very successful businessman who comes from a very religious family, His mother, in fact, had always a great devotion to Divine Mercy and was a great friend of Fr. Berchmans Walsh, who was the first priest to promote Divine Mercy in Ireland. Brendan's car was stolen on a business trip to Dublin with his overnight bag which contained a copy of St. Faustina's Diary which he had written his name in. Three days later a friend who was living in Dublin called Brendan to say he found an overnight bag in his yard which contained nothing but St. Faustina's Diary. Of all the houses in his development Brendan's bag ended up in his. One night while parked in a park Brendan's car was again stolen. Days later the police call him to report they had found the car but it was burned to a cinder except for one item— the copy of St. Faustina's Diary found on the remains of a burned out seat. No one could believe the book survived. As Brendan stared at his car he thought he heard the words, "How long are you going to keep me waiting." Brendan shortly became a seminarian and is today a priest.

How to Recite the Divine Mercy Chaplet

Begin by touching the crucifix and pray **The Sign of the Cross**.

IN THE NAME of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

(As you say this, with your right hand touch your forehead when you say Father, touch your breastbone when you say Son, touch your left shoulder when you say Holy, and touch your right shoulder when you say Spirit.)

OPENING PRAYER (optional): You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!
(repeat three times)

Pray **The Our Father**, **The Hail Mary**, and **The Apostles Creed**.

OUR FATHER, Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

HAIL MARY, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

I BELIEVE IN GOD, the Father almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into Hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty. He shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen. On the center medal pray the Eternal Father.

ETERNAL FATHER, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On the sequence of ten clear beads pray:

FOR THE SAKE OF HIS SORROWFUL PASSION, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

On the red beads pray:

ETERNAL FATHER, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

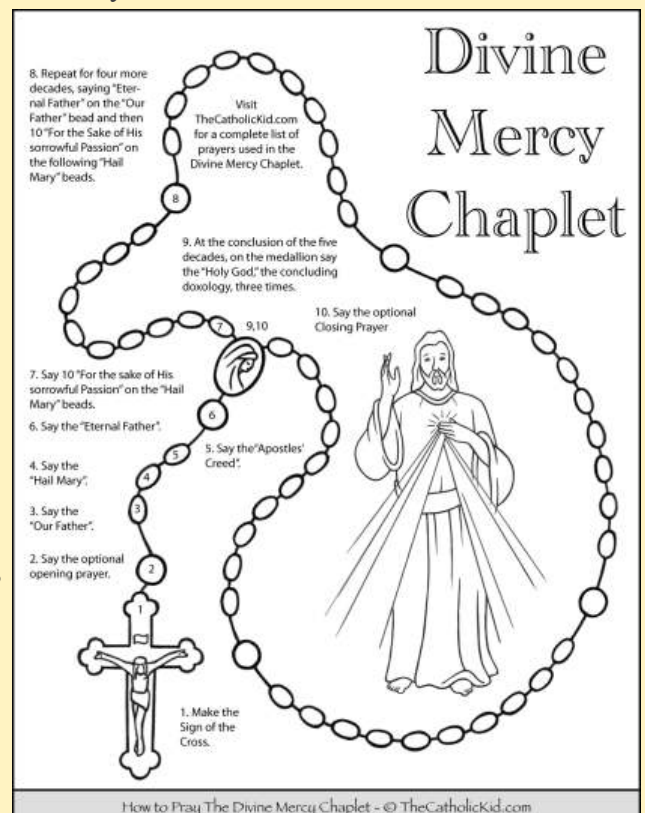
Continue the pattern of praying ten clear beads followed by a red bead until you come back to the center medal.

On the center medal pray three times:

HOLY GOD, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

CLOSING PRAYER (optional): Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless, and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us, and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair, nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself. Amen.

End by touching the crucifix and pray The Sign of the Cross.

Sponsorship Certificates **Letters of Eligibility**

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.
