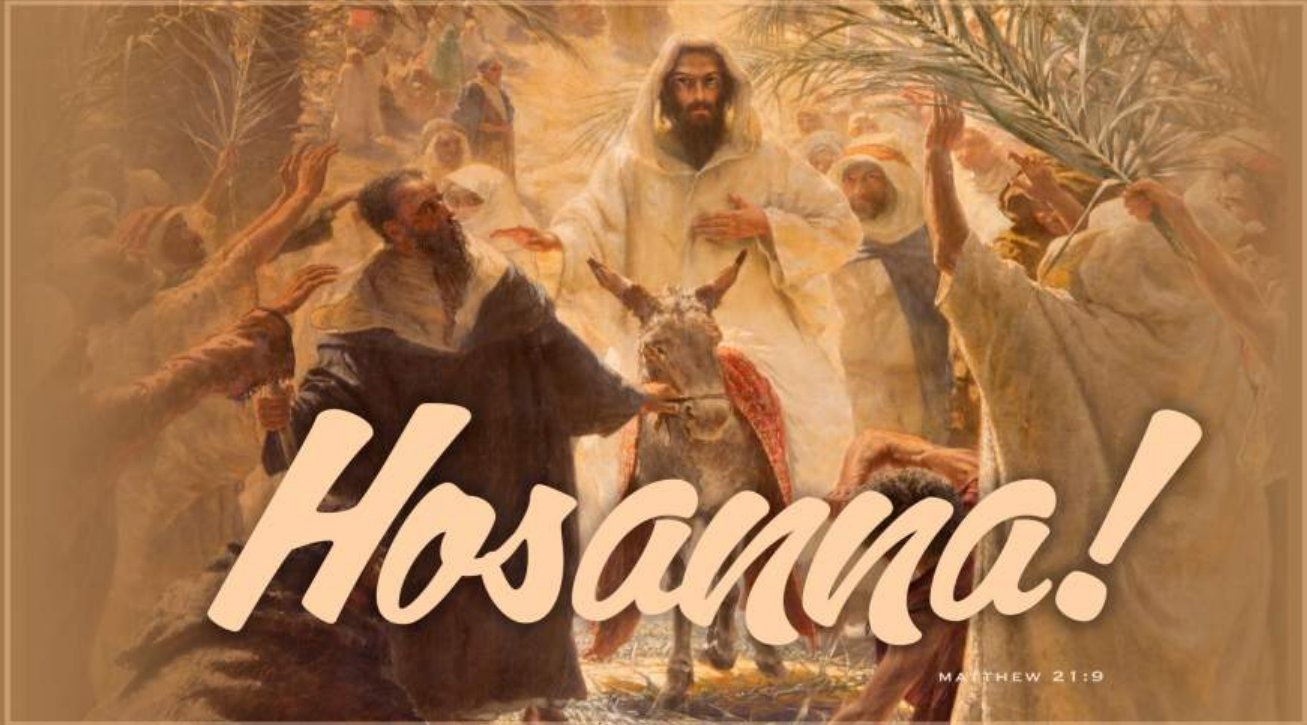

As we enter Holy Week, I thought you would like to follow Jesus in Jerusalem including important sites during His preaching, his trial, crucifixion and resurrection. The map I included is one I found on the website: [conformingtojesus.com/chartsmaps/en/jerusalem in jesus time map.htm](http://conformingtojesus.com/chartsmaps/en/jerusalem%20in%20jesus%20time%20map.htm)

Thursday evening, Jesus was in Jerusalem celebrating the Passover (the Last Supper) with His disciples, probably in the Essene quarter. Afterward they went to the Garden of Gethsemane, where he prayed earnestly. Then during the night was arrested by soldiers led there by Judas Iscariot. They took him first to the home of the former high priest Annas where He was interrogated and beaten. After that he was sent to Annas' son-in-law Caiaphas, (the current High Priest) where a make shift trial was convened. Caiaphas declared Jesus guilty of blasphemy for admitting that He was the Messiah. Caiaphas then sent him to Pilate (who was probably residing at the former palace of Herod the Great). Pilate had Jesus scourged and crowned with thorns and an old purple cloak. When Pilate showed the bloodied disfigured Jesus, the crowd was stirred to clamor for His death. Pilate then ordered Him to be crucified on Golgotha. After His death he was buried in the tomb of Joseph of Arimathea, very close by, The site where He rose from the dead.

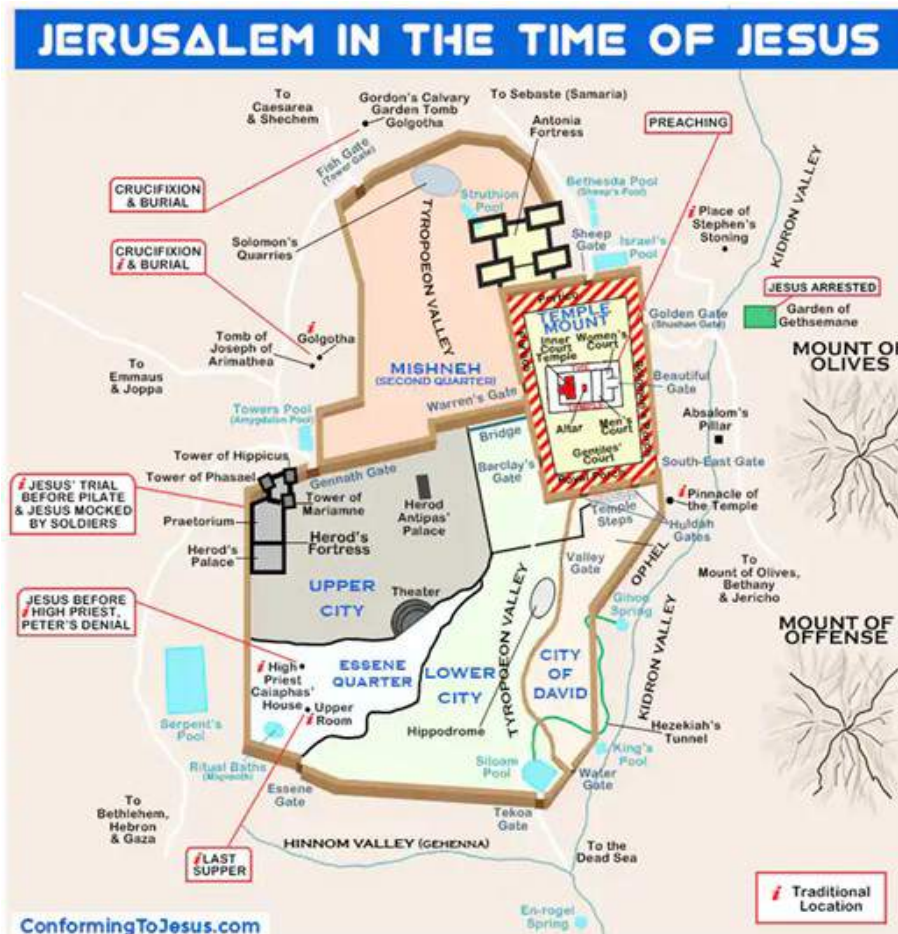

Anointing of the Sick - This sacrament is for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass to receive this sacrament or call the parish office for an appointment.

Receiving Communion:

- Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand. Those wishing to receive Communion on the tongue should wait until the end of the Communion distribution and receive from the Priest.
- Only Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion with a valid Sacred Heart/St. Pio ID card can receive Communion in a Pyx to take to the sick and homebound. For anyone that is not a Eucharistic Minister and is requesting a Host needs to see the Priest before or after Mass. Hosts will not be distributed during Mass.
- If you need a low gluten Host, please go to the Communion line in the front on the pulpit side, and ask the Eucharistic Minister.

Sponsorship Certificates Letters of Eligibility

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

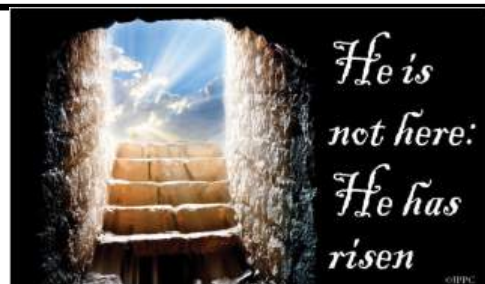

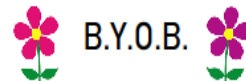

Padre Pio Prayer Anthology

Our first parish prayer anthology will include many types of prayers. We will begin our collection with prayers that you can use to develop a relationship with God that is more personal and intimate.

Prayer #46:

Focus Point: Are we living in a world overcome by darkness or inspired by light? Most of us would agree that the answer is “both”! Through the media, we have a worldly awareness, and can see selfish individuals creating pain, misery and heartache. And thankfully we can also see their selfless counterparts who give their all to bring relief and comfort to those who are suffering! The world has been struggling with the forces of good (those inspired by God’s love in their lives) vs evil (those who have turned away from God) throughout history! God sent Jesus to be the “light of the world”, to guide our hearts to choose a life that models that of His Son. So think about where you fit in. The fact that you are reading this means that you are probably “part of the good”. This Holy Week, as we follow Jesus through the events of His passion and death, may we come to realize the depth and intensity of His love, and the magnitude of His sacrifice for our salvation! Our individual salvation must be earned through prayer and good works. As Fr. Joy explains it, “There is a great need for people to minister to the community. Everyone is welcome to serve the Church. Jesus is calling each of us to serve Him in a very special way!”. May we find our own personal lights, and actively use them to “spread the Light of Christ” through our community and our world.

Prayer for Commitment to “Spreading the Light”:

Dear Lord, Shine Your Light upon me to strengthen me. Shine Your Light through me that I might make a difference in Your world. Inspire me to use my talents to help make positive changes in others, for Your glory! May my actions reflect Your peace and hope in a world that needs to feel Your presence and Your healing so desperately! May all of us “working for the good” overcome our personal hesitations, elevate our priorities, and model our lives after that of Jesus. Imagine how brightly our lights will shine! Amen

EASTER THOUGHTS FROM FR. JOY



Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again to judge the living & dead. In the darkness of the vigil night, we experience the light of a new fire. The light symbolizes the glory of God in His Son, Jesus, who is the light of the world. We are no longer people of darkness. We are people of the light. During the procession with the Paschal Candle, we sang the “Light of Christ.” The Paschal Candle is lit during the Easter season, at baptisms & funerals to remind us of the light of the risen Christ. At the Vigil, we bless the baptismal water, renew our baptismal promises & sprinkle ourselves with holy water. The baptismal water symbolizes death to sin & a new life in Christ.

Jesus triumphed over sin & death. He won for us redemption, salvation & eternal life. What would we do if we were Christ? For 3 years we would have taught peace, forgiveness and healed the sick. Then we would have been arrested on a false charge & betrayed by one of our trusted friends. We would be condemned to death, tortured & left to die on a cross. Through the power of God, we will find ourselves awake, alive and emerge from our tombs. What would we do first? Most of us would go back to Pilate, his soldiers & high priests who condemned us. In the fullness of our resurrected glory, we would show them the evil things they had done. The risen Christ, instead, gave peace to all.

Jesus’ first appearance is to Mary Magdalene. She came to the tomb to provide respect & dignity to Jesus. She soon recognizes the risen Lord. She was commissioned to proclaim the Good News of the resurrection to His apostles. Jesus then appeared to His apostles & disciples & strengthened their faith. The Risen Christ greeted them with words of peace, not with words of anger.

We are an Easter people. People of the Resurrection. Easter is filled with the promise of new life. Nature, too, is awakening with new life. The Easter promise of new life is realized through forgiveness, reconciliation, peace, compassion & love. The Easter promise encourages us to rise above the violence, hatred, guilt & shame of Good Friday. We become people of the resurrection by becoming selfless, self-giving, free persons of love & peace, like Christ. Let this Easter season be a time of new beginnings in our lives. It is the perfect time to bring the peace & joy of Christ’s resurrection to our families, friend circles, communities & the whole world. The faith of the Church is truly based on the hope of resurrection & eternal life. May we joyfully anticipate Easter’s ultimate realization of resurrection and eternal life at the end of our earthly journey. Let go and let God! May God Bless You.
