The Infinite Dignity of Every Human Person ⁽¹⁾ (part 2)

Gender theory and sex changes

The document states that Gender ideology “intends to deny the greatest possible difference that exists between living beings: sexual difference, and further states that all attempts to obscure reference to the ineliminable sexual difference between man and woman are to be rejected” and that “only by acknowledging and accepting this difference in reciprocity can each person fully discover themselves, their dignity, and their identity.”

As human beings are made in the image of God, we are called to accept and respect the body as it was created: “The body participates in that dignity as its endowed with personal meanings, particularly in its sexed condition.”

“Any sex-change intervention, as a rule, risks threatening the unique dignity the person has received from the moment of conception,” the document states.

To respect human dignity, the declaration also condemns unjust discrimination, aggression, and violence directed toward individuals based on sexual orientation.

“It should be denounced as contrary to human dignity the fact that, in some places, not a few people are imprisoned, tortured, and even deprived of the good of life solely because of their sexual orientation,” the Vatican states.

War and poverty

As war rages on in Ukraine, Gaza, Sudan, and elsewhere in the world, the declaration confirms that self-defense is permissible, but that “war is always a ‘defeat of humanity,’” citing Pope Francis’ address to the United Nations in December in 2023

“No war is worth the tears of a mother who has seen her child mutilated or killed; no war is worth the loss of the life of even one human being, a sacred being created in the image and likeness of the Creator; no war is worth the poisoning of our common home; and no war is worth the despair of those who are forced to leave their homeland and are deprived, from one moment to the next, of their home and all the family, friendship, social, and cultural ties that have been built up, sometimes over generations,” the declaration reads, quoting the current pontiff.

The declaration further discusses the problems of poverty, which it states are linked to the unequal distribution of wealth.

“If some people are born into a country or family where they have fewer opportunities to develop, we should acknowledge that this is contrary to their dignity, which is the same dignity as that of those born into a wealthy family or country,” the declaration adds. “We are all responsible for this stark inequality, albeit to varying degrees.”

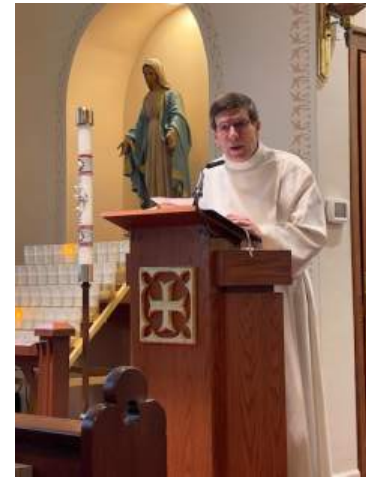

HIS PRIORITY - A reflection for April 21, The Fourth Sunday of Easter

During this never-ending election season, candidates have one top priority: They want to win. That priority drives candidates to publish position papers, make speeches, run television and radio ads, establish a social media presence, interact with voters, engage in debates, etc. Candidates are driven to expend all their time, energy, and resources to succeed.

But it is not only political candidates that are driven by their top priority. We all are. Whatever we make our top priority, that priority guides our decisions, affects how we live, influences our relationships, and determines where we allot our time, attention, and money.

Jesus also had a central priority that influenced his life and ministry - it was to carry out the will of his heavenly Father. As Jesus said, *"I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me"* (John 6:38). Doing the will of the Father led Jesus to proclaim the kingdom of God, to preach the Gospel, to forgive sinners, to heal the sick, to embrace the outcast, and to call people to love God with all their heart, soul, and mind and to love their neighbor. That priority motivated Jesus to be concerned for all the people he was sent to serve. For as he said, *"This is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me"* (John 6:39).

In Sunday's Gospel (John 10:11-18), Jesus chose the image of the "good shepherd" to describe himself - the good shepherd concerned for all the sheep that the Father had placed in his care. Jesus was the shepherd who was willing to lay down his life for the sake of his sheep. He was not like "a hired man, who...sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away...because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep."

On the cross, Jesus demonstrated his absolute concern for his sheep. He laid down his life so they might be saved from the "wolf" of sin and death that had been attacking humanity from the time of Adam. This Sunday, the Gospel presents us with the beautiful image of Jesus as the good shepherd who watches over his sheep and whose love for them is so great that he laid down his life to save them.

But Sunday's Gospel suggests another image: we are the sheep whose eternal welfare is the priority of the Good Shepherd. As we watch political candidates making every effort to win election, we can be reminded of the efforts that Jesus, the Good Shepherd, made and continues to make through his Church to win our salvation. We are his priority.

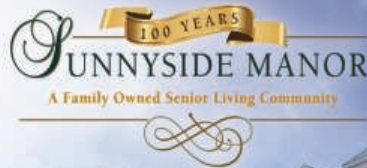

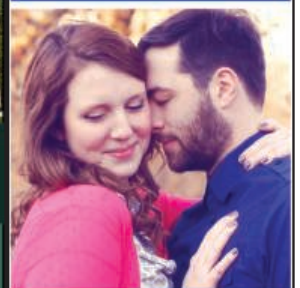
