9 Things You Need to Know About Divine Mercy Sunday

Here are 9 things you need to know



1. What is Divine Mercy Sunday?

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter. It is based on the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, which recommended a particular devotion to the Divine Mercy.

2. When Was it Made Part of the Church's Calendar?

In 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and, during the ceremony, he declared:

3. If This is Based on Private Revelation, Why is it on the Church's Calendar?

In his theological commentary in *The Message of Fatima*, then-Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger wrote:

"We might add that private revelations often spring from popular piety and leave their stamp on it, giving it a new impulse and opening the way for new forms of it."

Nor does this exclude that they will have an effect even on the liturgy, as we see for instance in the feasts of Corpus Christi and of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

From one point of view, the relationship between Revelation and private revelations appears in the relationship between the liturgy and popular piety: The liturgy is the criterion, it is the living form of the Church as a whole, fed directly by the Gospel.

4. What Does the Church Do to Encourage the Celebration of Devotion to the Divine Mercy on this Day?

Among other things, it offers a plenary indulgence:

To ensure that the faithful would observe this day with intense devotion, the Supreme Pontiff [John Paul II] himself established that this Sunday be enriched by a plenary indulgence, as will be explained below, so that the faithful might receive in great abundance the gift of the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

In this way, they can foster a growing love for God and for their neighbour, and after they have obtained God's pardon, they in turn might be persuaded to show a prompt pardon to their brothers and sisters. . . .

5. What is the Divine Mercy Image?

The Divine Mercy image is a depiction of Jesus based on a vision that St. Faustina had in 1931. There have been a number of paintings made of this image. The original, though not the most popular one today, is shown above.

A basic explanation of the image is:

Jesus is shown in most versions as raising his right hand in blessing, and pointing with his left hand on his chest from which flow forth two rays: one red and one white (translucent).

The depictions often contains the message “Jesus, I trust in You!” (Polish: Jezu ufam Tobie).

The rays streaming out have symbolic meaning: red for the blood of Jesus (which is the Life of Souls), and pale for the water (which justify souls) (from Diary – 299). The whole image is symbolic of charity, forgiveness and love of God, referred to as the “Fountain of Mercy”.

According to the diary of St Faustina, the image is based on her 1931 vision of Jesus.

6. What is the Chaplet of Divine Mercy?

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is a set of prayers used as part of the Divine Mercy devotion.

They are usually said using a standard set of Rosary beads, often at 3 p.m. (the time of Jesus’ death), but with a different set of prayers than those used in the Marian Rosary.

7. How is the Divine Mercy Devotion Linked to the Scripture Readings for the Second Sunday of Easter?

The Divine Mercy image depicts Jesus at the moment he appears to the disciples in the Upper Room, after the Resurrection, when he empowers them to forgive or retain sins.

This moment is recorded in John 20:19-31, which is the Gospel reading for this Sunday in all three yearly Sunday liturgical cycles (A, B, and C)

This reading is placed on this day because it includes the appearance of Jesus to the Apostle Thomas (in which Jesus invites him to touch his wounds). This event occurred on the eighth day after the Resurrection (John 20:26), and so it is used on the liturgy eight days after Easter.

(It also, however, includes the appearance of Jesus to the disciples on Easter evening, a week earlier, in which he empowered them to forgive or retain sins.)

8. How Did Jesus Empower the Apostles to Forgive or Retain Sins?

That part of the text reads:

Jesus said to them again,
“Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you.”
And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them,
“Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven;
if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.” He thus gave them a
special empowerment with the Holy Spirit to forgive or retain sins.

9. How Does this Relate to the Sacrament of Confession?

It relates directly to it. Jesus empowered the apostles (and their successors in ministry) with the Holy Spirit to either forgive or retain (not forgive) sins.

Because they are empowered with God’s Spirit to do this, their administration of forgiveness is efficacious — it really removes sin rather than just being a symbol of forgiveness a person is already thought to have obtained.

HOLY SPIRITED! A reflection for April 27 — “At sunset, all who had people sick with various diseases brought them to Jesus. He laid his hands on each of them and cured them” (Luke 4:40).

“Everyone in the crowd sought to touch Jesus because power came forth from him and healed them all” (Luke 6:18-19). In these two passages from his Gospel, Luke summarizes the miraculous healing power of Jesus. After the Ascension, Peter and the other apostles continued that ministry of Jesus. They healed the sick, drove out demons, and even raised the dead. In Sunday’s Second Reading (Acts 5:12-16), we learn that that people “even carried the sick out into the streets and laid them on cots and mats so that when Peter came by, at least his shadow might fall on one or another of them.”

Such power was present in these disciples because of the Spirit bestowed on them by the Risen Lord. On that first Easter Sunday night when he appeared to his disciples, John tells us that “Jesus breathed on them and said to them, ‘Receive the Holy Spirit.’” That gift of the Spirit was dramatically seen on Pentecost when the Spirit’s presence was manifested in a strong driving wind and tongue of fire.

Since that time, the Spirit has been active in the Church empowering and motivating Christians to preach the Gospel, to witness to their faith in Jesus, to work for peace and justice, to feed the hungry, to shelter the homeless, to welcome the refugee, to care for the sick and hurting, to educate the young, to open the eyes of society to the sanctity of human life at every stage—and to love as Jesus loved!

The more we allow the Holy Spirit to work in our lives, the more we give evidence that the Lord is risen and alive. In a sense, we become the proof that leads people to profess what Thomas said of Jesus in this Sunday’s Gospel ([John 20:19-31](#)), “My Lord and my God.”

In the weeks ahead, the Catholic Church will publicly recognize a person who truly allowed the Spirit to work in his life in an amazing way. The Church will celebrate the canonization of Carlo Acutis, the Catholic Church’s first millennial saint. He was a British-born Italian teenager who died in 2006 at the age of 15 shortly after being diagnosed with acute leukemia. Carlo was not only a typical teenager who enjoyed hiking, video games, and being with friends; he was also a devoted follower of Christ. He attended daily Mass, received Holy Communion each day, prayed the rosary, spent time in Eucharist adoration, showed concern for the poor and the homeless, led his parents back to the Church by his example, and used his computer skills to create an online exhibit of eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions. Carlo Acutis truly let the Holy Spirit work in his life and even today the Spirit is using him to touch others. Over the past year, more than a million people have made a pilgrimage to his tomb in Assisi, Italy.

Carlo Acutis has truly become a holy influencer for the young, and the not-so-young, because he allowed the Holy Spirit to work in his life.

That same Holy Spirit first given by the Risen Lord to his disciples is with us through our Baptism and Confirmation. May we allow the Spirit to do what he did for Carlo Acutis; may we allow the Spirit to make us saints!

I would like [your congress member] to urge the administration to reverse all terminations of international humanitarian and development assistance programs and to issue all payments in a timely manner. This issue is important to me because...

...Thank you for taking my call and have a good day.

The system may prompt you to enter your zip code so it can determine which member of Congress to connect you with. If you are a CRS text subscriber, we may already have your zip code in our system, in which case you will be automatically connected to your member’s office without needing to provide additional information. When the staff member answers the phone, it’s important to share your name and that you are a constituent. You can share the name of your city, but you may be asked to provide your full street address. If your call doesn’t connect after 30 seconds, you’ll be asked to leave a voicemail. Doing so can be just as impactful as speaking with an office worker. Please note: We have heard instances where voice mail boxes are full. If that happens, please consider following up with personalized emails or even social media posts. Be sure to tag your members of Congress on social media. **Thank You!**

In his own words...

There is an urgent need to see once again that faith is a light, for once the flame of faith dies out, all other lights begin to dim. The light of faith is unique, since it is capable of illuminating every aspect of human existence. A light this powerful cannot come from ourselves but from a more primordial source: in a word, it must come from God.

Faith is born of an encounter with the living God who calls us and reveals his love, a love which precedes us and upon which we can lean for security and for building our lives. Transformed by this love, we gain fresh vision, new eyes to see; we realize that it contains a great promise of fulfillment, and that a vision of the future opens up before us.

Faith, received from God as a supernatural gift, becomes a light for our way, guiding our journey through time. On the one hand, it is a light coming from the past, the light of the foundational memory of the life of Jesus which revealed his perfectly trustworthy love, a love capable of triumphing over death. Yet since Christ has risen and draws us beyond death, faith is also a light coming from the future and opening before us vast horizons which guide us beyond our isolated selves towards the breadth of communion. We come to see that faith does not dwell in shadow and gloom; it is a light for our darkness.
