## **We Need to do Something about Child Sex Trafficking, which is a Huge Business in The United States that Needs to be Stopped!**

**Human trafficking is a \$150 billion industry. (UNICEF)**

I was talking to someone this past week about child sex trafficking, who said he had a friend who works for the FBI. His friend told him that child sex trafficking has become one of the most profitable ways to make money, even surpassing drug money. At first, I did not understand how it was so. I've done a little bit of research on it, whose references are at the end of this page. I found that:

- The United States is one of the most active sex trafficking countries in the world, where exploitation of trafficking victims occurs in cities, suburban and rural areas.
- Children account for 27% of all the human trafficking victims worldwide, and two out of every three child victims are girls. On average, a child enters the U.S. sex trade at 12 to 14 years old.
- "In 2018, over half (51.6%) of the criminal human trafficking cases active in the U.S. were sex trafficking cases involving only children."
- **In the U.S., child trafficking is aggravated by four main factors: the porous southern border, predatory social media use, pornography, and broken families.**
- **Predators can rent a child for a single sex act for an average of \$90.**
- **Often, that child is forced to have sex 20 times per day, six days a week!**
- Trafficking usually occurs in hotels, motels, online websites, and at truck stops in the U.S.
- About 50,000 people, primarily from Mexico and the Philippines, are trafficked into the U.S. annually.
- Traffickers use social media platforms (Like Tic Toc and Craigs List) to recruit and advertise victims of human trafficking.

### **The Southern Border**

The crisis at the southern border is directly linked to an increase in child trafficking in the United States. In April, a whistleblower told Congress' House Judiciary Committee that the "United States federal government has become the 'middleman' in a multibillion-dollar human trafficking operation targeting unaccompanied minors at the southern border."

To make matters worse, in June alone, the Biden administration released 344 kids to non-related adults in the U.S.—most of whom already had multiple children in their care. These children are prime targets for traffickers—for sex or labor.

**Guess who is paying the health, contraceptive, abortion and other medical bills for these poor children? The U.S. taxpayer! ---How could a child survive such an evil slavery!**

It's unfortunate that our Federal Government isn't doing much of anything to stop this. I guess it's too profitable? All Republicans and Democrats seem to be able to do is NOTHING, except fight with each other and amongst themselves! What a sorry, evil state of affairs our country is in now. It has to change.

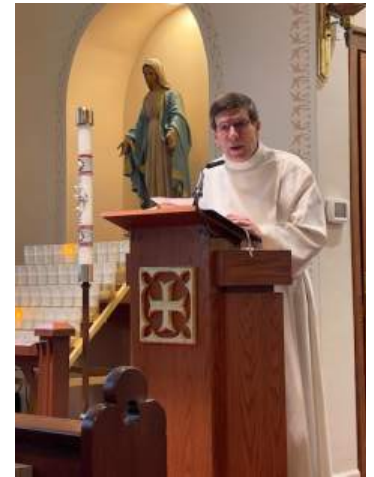

## A NEW EPIDEMIC

### *A reflection for April 28, The Fifth Sunday of Easter*

Our world recently experienced the COVID pandemic whose debilitating effects are still being felt. But there is a new epidemic spreading in our country, one for which there is no vaccine. There is an epidemic of loneliness.

Last year, the US Surgeon General stated, "In recent years, about one-in-two adults in America reported experiencing loneliness... Loneliness is far more than just a bad feeling—it harms both individual and societal health. It is associated with a greater risk of cardiovascular disease, dementia, stroke, depression, anxiety, and premature death. The mortality impact of being socially disconnected is similar to that caused by smoking up to 15 cigarettes a day." (*The U.S. Surgeon General's Advisory on the Healing Effects of Social Connection and Community 2023*)

As humans, we need to be connected with other people; it is part of our DNA. In the first pages of Genesis, we are told that God looked at the man he created and said, "It is not good for the man to be alone." We were made to be connected to other people. That is why we marry, make friends, join clubs and organizations, participate in group sports, interact through social media, etc.

But we were also made to be connected to God. That is why God made man in his image and likeness. That is why God sent his Son to invite humanity to have an everlasting relationship with him.

Jesus emphasizes that connection in Sunday's Gospel (John 15:1-8). There Jesus speaks of himself as "the true vine" that the Father planted in this world. To be spiritually alive, we need to be connected to that vine. Without a connection to him, our spirits begin to shrivel. As Jesus warns us, "Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither."

We remain in Jesus by participating in Mass and receiving Holy Communion. As Jesus tells us, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (John 6:56).

We remain in Jesus by taking his word to heart and following his commandments. As he tells us, "If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love" (John 15:10).

We remain in Jesus by being part of the Church, the living Body of Christ. As Paul tells us, "We, though many, are one body in Christ" (Romans 12:5).

When we remain connected to Jesus, our lives "bear much fruit." Fruit that Saint Paul described as "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. (Galatians 5:22-23).

Perhaps today's epidemic of social loneliness is more severe and damaging than ever since it comes at a time when so many people are spiritually lonely and disconnected from Jesus, the true vine. We need to be connected to one another and connected to the Lord.

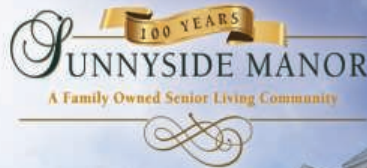

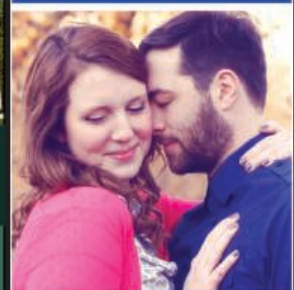

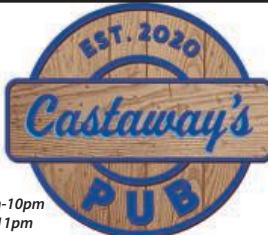
