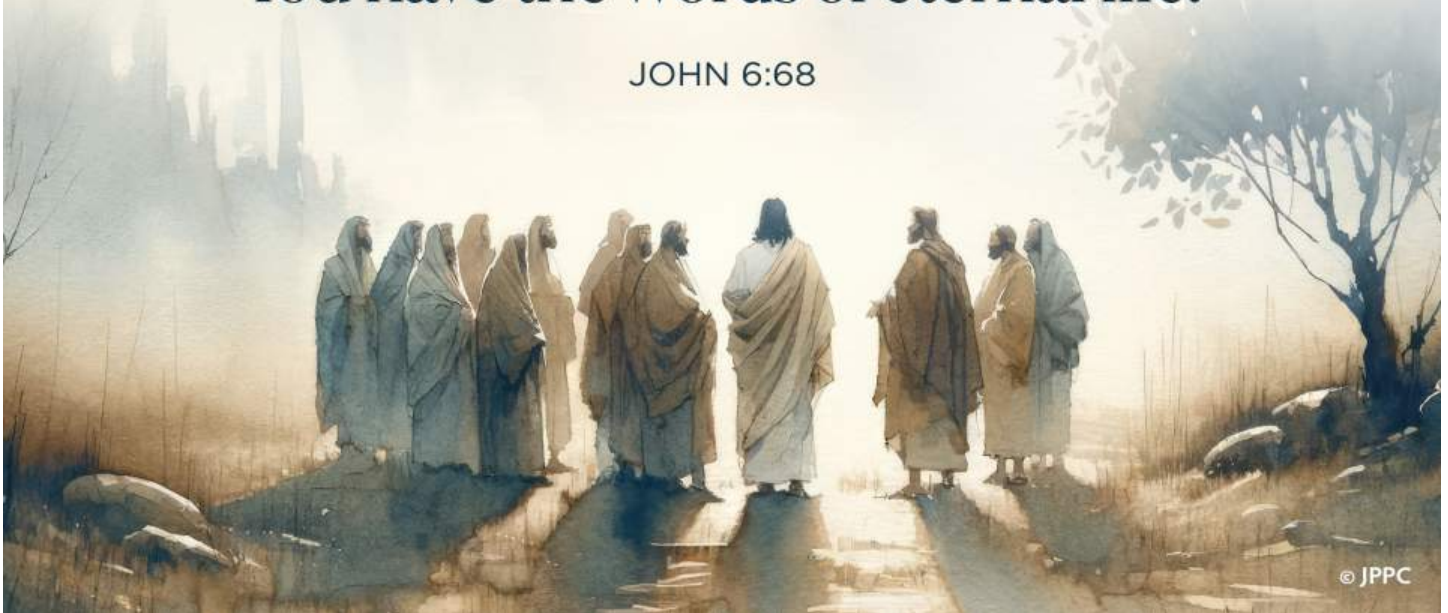

Mortal Sin Prevents a Person From Worthily Receiving Holy Communion at Mass

(Part 2 of 3 continued from last week)

If you do receive, you are committing another grave sin of sacrilege, which may be mortal. If you are uncertain you must go to confession before you receive. The article below is a relatively good understanding of classifying sins as mortal and venial. I have made **edits (bold face type)** and **crossed out a few** words or lines.

As Catholics, we grow up in the knowledge that committing a sin takes us farther away from God. But in the Catholic tradition, sins can be classified into two types: venial sins and mortal sins. In this post, we'll talk about the latter.

What Makes an Act a Mortal Sin? Conditions that make a sin mortal:

For an action to be considered a mortal sin, **all three of the conditions must be present, not just 1 or 2:**

1. Grave Matter

One of the conditions that make a sin a mortal one is its' **gravity**. That's why actions that are inherently immoral, inhumane, and evil are already considered mortal sins. **Sins against any of the 10 commandments can be mortal or venial, depending on the gravity of the sin.**

2. Full Knowledge

To classify an action as a mortal sin, you should have full knowledge about it. If you plan to do something and you already know that it is impure and evil, ~~then it's considered a mortal sin.~~

3. Deliberate Consent

If you choose to commit a grave act without someone forcing you, then it's a mortal sin. ~~Pushing people to sin will only count as a venial sin.~~ **It can be mortal as well.**

A person prays to God to apologize (**forgive us**) for the mortal sins committed.

Examples of Mortal Sins

The Catholic Church does not really have an exhaustive list of mortal sins. But based on the conditions above, **here are some of the most common examples of mortal sins.**

1. Worshipping false gods. There's a reason why the first of the ten commandments states that we shall not have any other gods aside from the one true God. It's simply the most important commandment of all. Thus, acts of worshipping false gods rank high up on the list of mortal sins. These include:

Idolatry. Idolizing other gods is a mortal sin because you are worshiping and putting your faith in a false god. Adoration (of a false god is a grave matter and is considered a mortal sin.

Sacrilege. Heresy is when you dishonor or disrespect something that's considered sacred and holy, such as burning a cross, defacing Catholic churches, or desecrating any elements of the Eucharist.

Atheism. Atheism means that you don't believe in any god, including the one true and living God, which, in itself, is a violation of the first commandment. **(Many people who have not been brought up as Christians and particularly Catholics, who find they can't believe in God because of an apparent conflict of understanding of who God is; if that is the case they are not intentionally committing mortal sin- they may be trying to be honest.)**

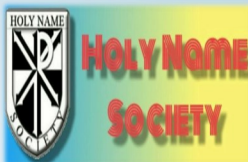

A HARD SAYING

A reflection for August 25, The Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

"This saying is hard; who can accept it?" These words, found in Sunday's Gospel, were the response of many disciples to what Jesus said in last Sunday's Gospel. There he had proclaimed, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world...unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." This dramatic assertion by Jesus does not elicit the same negative response from us. We readily accept that the consecrated bread and wine are the very body and blood of Christ.

However, there are words in our Second Reading that may cause some Catholics to respond, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" In that reading, Saint Paul says, "Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord." That statement can "trigger" a negative reaction, especially from women who may have suffered domestic abuse. However, if we look at the longer version, Paul went on to speak about the role of husbands, who were to love their wives "even as Christ loved the church."

Serving others, putting others before ourselves, is something all Christians are called to do. Jesus gave us a striking example of "subordination" when he took on the role of a slave and washed the feet of his disciples at the Last Supper. He then told us, "I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do."

Saint Paul tells wives and husbands, and all Christians, "Brothers and sisters: Be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ." This saying is hard; but we are called to accept it.

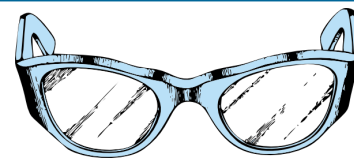
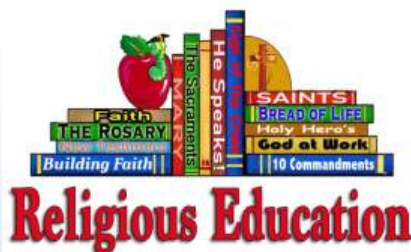
