Reflections on Vatican II – Divine Revelation

In preparation for the Jubilee Year of 2025, Pope Francis encouraged a return to the documents of Vatican II, refreshing awareness of the fruits of that Council. To encourage your own study of those documents, Fr Peter Wygnański here begins a short series of articles about the four major constitutions.



The Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation Dei Verbum, (Latin for the Word of God), was a watershed moment for our understanding of how God reveals Himself to humanity, and how we, in turn, respond.

The document takes its name, as all such documents do, from its opening words: “Hearing the word of God with reverence and proclaiming it with faith, the sacred synod takes its direction from these words of St John: We announce to you the eternal life which dwelt with the Father and was made visible to us. What we have seen and heard we announce to you, so that you may have fellowship with us and our common fellowship be with the Father and His Son Jesus Christ.”(§1), What was different then, about this understanding of God’s Revelation, and what does that mean for us today?

...

Faith, then, was largely a matter of agreeing with, or submitting to, that list of teachings which were carefully preserved. As long as I believed what I received, and did what I was supposed to, I could be part of the Church and saved. When Revelation is a list, however, we can fall into the trap of worrying about the list more than the God it describes, and Scripture and Tradition of the Church seem to wrestle with each other for the final word.

The Council Fathers, however, rediscovered an ancient understanding of Revelation as being more like knowing a childhood friend, a shared past. Revelation is not (just) the content, but the process: the Living God, out of the abundance of His love speaks to men as “friends” to make himself known to us, most fully through the incarnate Word bursting into History in the person of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

When Revelation is God’s unveiling action, the “divine wellspring” from which “both Scripture and Tradition flow”, we do not throw away the teachings entrusted to the apostles and faithfully handed down to us through the ages by their successors, but we receive those teachings as they are meant to be, sure knowledge which point to the true depths of our human condition and to the God who “frees us from the darkness of sin and death to raise us up to life eternal.”

We believe, then, because we are able to encounter a living power who has reached out towards us by His self -disclosure, and our faith is a relationship with Jesus Christ. In friendship with God, already a fruit of the Holy Spirit, that same spirit “opens the eyes of our minds” so that we “commit our whole selves freely to God”, with full submission of intellect and will.”

That is how we come to know Christ, and how “the whole world may believe, by believing it may hope, and by hoping it may love.”

PREDICTING THE FUTURE - A reflection for December 1, The First Sunday of Advent

Sunday, December 1, and Wednesday, January 1, have something in common: both deal with predictions about the future.

On January 1, New Years Day, the media focuses our attention on what may happen in the coming year. We hear predictions about the economy, politics, world affairs, technology, sports, religion, medicine, climate, etc.

This Sunday, December 1, also focuses our attention on the future. The readings for this first day of Advent and this first day of the new liturgical year of 2025 look to the future.

In our First Reading, the Prophet Jeremiah speaks of the time to come when God will restore the line of David by raising up “a just shoot...who shall do what is right and just in the land.”

In our Second Reading, Paul urges the Christians at Thessalonica to be ready for the future coming of the Lord Jesus Christ and to make a greater effort to conduct themselves in a way pleasing to God.

In our Gospel, Jesus predicts the events that will announce his second coming in glory. He says, “there will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on earth nations will be in dismay...People will die in fright in anticipation of what is coming upon the world.”

These words of Jesus seem particularly relevant since our world seems to be falling apart. There is war in Ukraine and in the Holy Land, and violence and terrorism in Nigeria, Sudan, and Haiti. There is increasing polarization among people, the continuing breakdown of the family, and a decline in moral values. There is hunger and disease in a world that is yet to recover from the effects of the recent pandemic. God and religion are being pushed aside and societal structures are weakening.

Of course, such dire predictions have been made before. We hear them at the beginning of every Advent Season. Thankfully, they have not yet come to pass. If Jesus had come 100 years ago, the world would have ended, the kingdom of God would have come, and we would never have been created.

But we are here. And we continue to wait in hope for these Advent predictions to be fulfilled when Jesus returns in glory or when he comes to us at the conclusion of our personal lives.

As we wait, Jesus tells us, “Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life....Be vigilant at all times that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand firm before the Son of Man.”

This December 1 and January 1 we will listen to predictions about the future. The ones we will hear on New Year's Day may or may not come to pass. But the predictions we hear this Sunday, December 1, come with a Divine Guarantee: The Lord Jesus will return in glory. In fact, if we look with the eyes of faith, we can see signs of his presence even today in Word and Sacrament and in his Church.



Lord, our God, we praise You for Your Son, Jesus Christ, for He is Emmanuel, the Hope of all people. He is the Wisdom that teaches and guides us. He is the Savior of us all.

O Lord, let your blessing come upon us as we light the first (purple) candle of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise of salvation. May He come quickly and not delay. We ask this in His holy name. Amen.







Americas Gleaned Seafood is a Non-Profit organization that provides **Gleaned fish** (excess fish that the fishermen can't use) to be processed into a Protein-Rich food source and distributes these to foodbanks and food pantries for low-income families.



Thanks to Local, County, State, and Federal Grants, many of the expenses, like ice, boxes, and staffing are provided. The fishers do their part also by bringing in the fish for zero dollars, not even a tax write off. AGS need is the costs that are not covered by grants; like rent, utilities, and professional fees (attorneys and accountants).

To date, thousands of pounds of seafood have been gleaned and more than **100,000 meals in 2023 & 2024** have been provided to Monmouth, Essex and Ocean County families. Since AGS is utilizing many existing resources and systems, its primary expense is processing. This is where we need your help. The program is very cost-effective since fishers do not get paid and all seafood is donated.

A \$50 donation can provide eighty 4oz. portions (\$0.50/meal) of New Jersey seafood can be given to families, while also providing significant environmental, health, industry, and community benefits.

As part of our ministry to Feed the Hungry, we are having a Second Collection on December 14/15 to help AGS in their efforts to meet the needs of even more people by being able to accept and process more fish from the fishing boats to foodbanks. Please be as generous as you can.

It can be exhausting and time consuming and often leads to us forgetting about what it is we are truly preparing for: the Birth of Jesus. As we think about Mary and Joseph and what it was they were doing to prepare for His birth, we recognize that their preparations were quite drastically different from our preparations of today. So how, in this busy time, can we return to the focus that Mary and Joseph may have had as they awaited the birth of Jesus? Father Joe would say that "one important way is Prayer." Weekly lighting of the four Candles of the Advent wreath can help us to put aside time for and guide our Prayers. May the Spirit of Christmas fill you with all the meaning of Advent: **Hope, Peace, Joy and Love!!!**

Prayer for focus on the Birth of Jesus:

Dear Lord, Help me to prepare for the Birth of Jesus through daily Prayer. Let me thank the Lord each day for His many blessings. Thank You for the Hope that Jesus brought to all of us and continues to give us today in all of life's situations. Please let me be worthy of and thankful for Your continued Peace in my life. I know that through Your Grace, I can find true peace in all of life, even in my struggles. Thank You for the Joy I find in giving to friends, family and those less fortunate. I know that not everyone will have a "Merry" Christmas and I need to remember them in my prayers. I pray for the Holy Spirit to fill my heart with the same Love you give to me unconditionally. Thank you for the constant presence of You and Your love. And I pray that I share Your gifts of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love with others, especially this Christmas season as we prepare for the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.


