

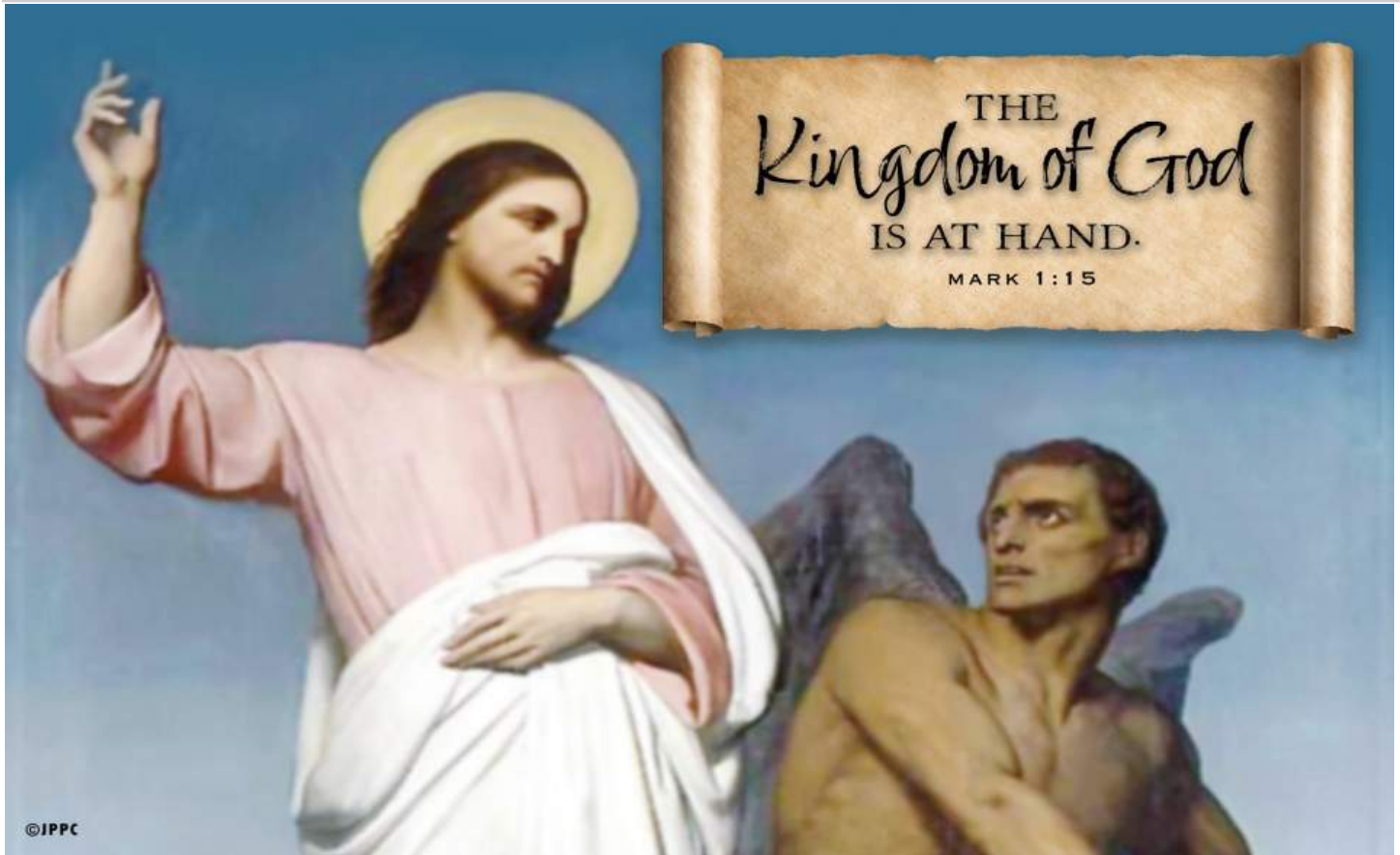

## **Lent 2024: What should I do? It's not difficult. It's right in front of you.**

**February 12, 2024 - by Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M. - excerpts from the text:**

Lent is traditionally a time for prayer and fasting. This year, I am especially drawn to these words from my reading: "Fasting is the soul of prayer, mercy is the lifeblood of fasting. So, if you pray, fast; if you fast, show mercy; if you want your petition to be heard, hear the petition of others. If you do not close your ear to others, you open God's ear to yourself." They are the words of St. Peter Chrysologus +450

St. Teresa of Calcutta once remarked, "As Lent is the time for greater love, listen to Jesus' thirst... 'Repent and believe' Jesus tells us. What are we to repent? Our indifference, our hardness of heart. What are we to believe? Jesus thirsts even now, in your heart and in the poor. He knows your weakness. He wants only your love, wants only the chance to love you."

Profound words, indeed! And our love for God and God's love for us is not a passive thing. It leads somewhere and to something concrete in our relationships with one another. Lent is not simply a time for our introspection and meditation, for disconnected fasting and sacrifice. It is a season of purpose, set apart for the conversion of our hearts and lives.

Lent is the right path and the right place to continue our personal journey of faith and spiritual growth. And, so, might I suggest these Lenten practices:

### **Make a plan and stick to it**

We should make a plan of those activities and stick to it as best we can. The key to a successful Lent is not to overcomplicate it with multiple, burdensome practices that we cannot sustain for its duration. Keep it simple.

### **Read the Scriptures**

Pick up your Bible and read it, especially the Gospels. Make a point of doing it daily or often during Lent. Create a habit that you can continue beyond these 40 days. It's not difficult. It's right in front of you.

### **Pray and give yourself the time to do so**

Prayer is something you can do anywhere, everywhere. Prayer is something you can do anytime, all the time. Just stop for a moment and remember that God is present. Pray alone. Pray with others, especially at Mass. Use your own words; use words that are familiar. Pray for yourself, pray for others, especially for those you love and who love you. Pray for those who do not. Pray with your family. Don't be embarrassed. Just do it. In his Lenten Message 2015, Pope Francis wrote: "Let us all ask the Lord: make our hearts like yours (Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus). In this way we will receive a heart which is firm and merciful, attentive and generous, a heart which is not closed."

### **Go to Confession**

Pope Francis once remarked: "Someone can say, 'I confess my sins only to God.' Yes, you can say to God, 'forgive me,' and say your sins. But our sins are also against our brothers, against the Church. This is why it is necessary to ask forgiveness of the Church and of our brothers, in the person of the priest." "The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a Sacrament of healing," he pointed out. "When I go to Confession, it's for healing: healing the soul, healing the heart because of something that I did to make it unwell (General Audience, February 19, 2014)." How often Pope Francis himself says, "I am a sinner!" And he's the Pope! Ask for God's mercy. It's not difficult. It's right in front of you.

### **Sacrifice something**

Give something up that might pinch a little. This is a long-standing Lenten tradition, and we can all think of something "to give up for Lent." The season of Lent begins with fast and abstinence on Ash Wednesday and continues with abstinence from meat on all its Fridays until the fast and abstinence of Good Friday. Fast and abstain when the Church asks you to and don't make excuses. Do it so that the hunger or emptiness you feel might remind you that you need God more in your life than anything else. Thomas a Kempis wrote in "The Imitation of Christ": "Nothing, how little so ever it be, if it is suffered for God's sake, can pass without merit in the sight of God." In his Lenten Message for 2014, Pope Francis wrote: "Lent is a fitting time for self-denial; we would do well to ask ourselves what we can give up in order to help and enrich others by our own poverty. Let us not forget that real poverty hurts: no self-denial is real without this dimension of penance. I distrust a charity that costs nothing and does not hurt." It's not difficult. It's right in front of you.

### **Show mercy, kindness and charity**

And not because others have earned it. Show mercy, kindness and charity especially when they don't deserve it. Forgive. Be slow to judge. Give people a break. Show a little compassion. That's what the Lord Jesus does and what we ask of him, sinners that we all are. Do something good for someone. It's not difficult. It's right in front of you.

**Forty Days is a significant period of time. Don't be discouraged if you stumble with any of your Lenten practices. Just pick up where you left off and keep going.**

### We Have a New Tenant!

St Pio welcomed a new tenant in January to our second floor Parish Hall offices. **Americans Gleaned Seafood** is now renting one of our meeting rooms for their office, along with our other tenant, Downeside Adoption.

*In 2018, Americas Gleaned Seafood, (AGS) a New Jersey 501 (c)(3) nonprofit was formed to make fresh, NJ caught, protein-rich seafood available to New Jersey's food banks on a regular, sustainable basis.*

New Jersey is home to a robust commercial fishing industry. The state's 6 major ports harvest more than 120 million pounds of seafood annually. But a large percentage - up to 25 million pounds - is "bycatch", meaning it is not the fishermen's targeted species or for a variety of reasons, it is not marketable (National Marine Fisheries Service & NOAA, 2013). Per current regulations, this bycatch is discarded overboard, but it is perfectly good and could be donated to help feed people in need. Most fishers would prefer to do so, but there's never been a workable process in place. That is the reason AGS was created.

AGS recruits fishing co-ops, docks, and commercial fishermen and each port maintains seafood gleaning boxes where fishermen can deposit their bycatch donations. Seafood processing partners pick up and process the gleaned seafood (clean, filet, freeze, and package at a reduced cost), which are labeled and delivered to partnering food banks. From there, the seafood (along with simple, corresponding recipes) is distributed to families in need through the food-banks pantries, soup kitchens, shelters, and other programs.

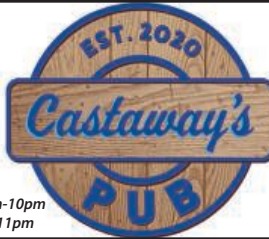
