

Poverty in the first-century Galilee

After the death of Herod the situation in Judea and Galilee soon grew worse. His kingdom was divided among his three sons. Archelaus became the ethnarch (ruler of the people) of Judea, Samaria and Idumea. His reign was short-lived because his rule was so autocratic and aroused the hatred of his subjects to the extent that, in 6 CE, they sent a delegation to Rome to ask for his removal. Judea became directly under Roman control. The new governor, Quirinius, the Roman legate of Syria, conducted a census for tax purposes as part of the Roman takeover. The census produced a rebellion led by Judas the Galilean. The rebellion was defeated cruelly by the Romans. However, this uprising is the only one recorded in Judea at the first three decades of the Common Era. The Roman prefects of the era were Valerius Gratus and Pontius Pilate, both of whom ruled 10 years, which has often been regarded as an indication of no severe violent uprisings at the time. Also the Roman historian Tacitus reports that in Judea under the Emperor Tiberius (14-37 CE) 'things were quiet'. However, under the Roman governors, recorded or not, there was plenty of violence in Judea and Galilee. Valerius Gratus (15-26 CE) was the first procurator who arbitrarily appointed and deposed the high priests. Josephus portrayed Gratus as manipulating Jerusalem's temple politics by deposing the incumbent Sadducean high priest Hanan I (6-15 CE), as well as three short-termed successors, before finally finding Joseph Kayyafa (Caiaphas), who had a long tenure collaborating with Roman military rule (18-37 CE). He put down two formidable bands of robbers that infested Judea during his government, and killed with his own hand the captain of one of them, Simon, formerly a slave of Herod the Great.²¹ Gratus assisted the proconsul Quintilius Varus in quelling an insurrection of the Jews.

Pontius Pilate's first serious clash with the Jews took place in his very first year in office when his troops marched into Jerusalem at night with their regimental standards bearing medallions with the emperor's image. Jewish reaction included a large delegation to Caesarea. The very next year, 27 CE, Pilate attempted to have an aqueduct built. The point of conflict seemed to have been around the use of sacred temple money set aside for sacrificial animals for God, for the project. Indignant at this proceeding, the populace formed a ring round the tribunal of Pilate then on a visit to Jerusalem, and besieged him with angry clamour. Pilate took money from the Temple treasury to build an aqueduct for Jerusalem. His disguised troops slaughtered Jewish people in the temple courts during their protest. In 29-30 CE Pilate introduced coins engraved with symbols of Emperor-worship on one side and Jewish symbols on the other. In 32 CE he attempted - again - to bring in golden standards honouring Tiberius into Herod's Palace in Jerusalem. In 36 CE a Samaritan would-be-messiah asked the Samaritan people to go up to Mount Gerizim with him, where he promised to show them sacred vessels hidden by Moses. Pilate blocked their route of ascent with cavalry and heavily armed infantry. In the clash that followed, some were killed and the rest scattered or taken prisoners. Pilate then executed the ring-leaders and those who were most influential.

During the time when Jesus Christ was in Rome, the Roman Empire was under the rule of Emperor Tiberius. Tiberius issued a Tribute Penny during his reign. In fact, the Tribute Penny has become significant not just in Roman history, but in religious history as well.

The Tribute Penny was a silver coin that was used to pay the annual tribute imposed on the Jews by the Romans. It featured an image of Tiberius on the obverse side, and the inscription "Tiberius Caesar Divi Augusti Filius Augustus." Moreover, this translates to "Tiberius Caesar, Son of the Divine Augustus." On the reverse side is a seated female figure, commonly believed to be the goddess Pax, the personification of peace in Roman mythology.



The Presentation of the Lord - WHAT'S ON FEBRUARY 2?

On the Church's liturgical calendar, this Sunday, February 2, is the [Feast of the Presentation of the Lord](#).

But most people do not connect February 2 with the Presentation, but rather with Ground Hog Day. This is probably true for most Catholics as well, for the observance of the Lord's Presentation most often falls on a weekday, not on a Sunday as it does in 2025.



Strange as it might seem, there may be a connection between these two celebrations that both occur on February 2.

On Ground Hog Day, thousands of people gather at sunrise in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania, to watch as a famed ground hog emerges from its burrow. According to tradition, if this ground hog sees its shadow there will be six more weeks of winter. If it sees no shadow, spring will come early. Most people hope that no shadow is seen; they want the cold of winter to be quickly overcome by the warming light of spring.

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, which comes 40 days after Christmas Day, is also about light and hope.

This feast commemorates the day when Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem. There Mary offered the sacrifice required to be made 40 days after giving birth to ensure her ritual purification. Then, as required by the Law of Moses, Mary and Joseph dedicated their firstborn son to God.

In the Temple, the infant boy being dedicated to the Lord was noticed by Simeon, who "was righteous and devout...and the Holy Spirit was upon him."

Inspired by the Spirit, Simeon realized this baby boy was the long-awaited Messiah, who would be "a light for revelation to the Gentiles" and a source of glory for the people of Israel.

The Prophetess Anna, a widow who had devoted most of her life to prayer, also saw and recognized the identity of the infant Jesus. "She gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem."

Both Simeon and Anna were blessed with the realization that Israel's long, cold winter of waiting for the promised Messiah was coming to an end. In the infant being held by Mary, they saw the arrival of the light that would overcome the dark shadow of sin and death. Israel's many years of waiting for the "spring" of salvation had come to an end.

February 2, the day when the media focuses society's attention on a weather prediction, the Church directs our attention to a day of lasting significance. We remember the wondrous day when the Lord Jesus was recognized by Simeon and Anna as the hoped for Messiah, the source of light and salvation for us, and for all people.





What renovation work was done?

The entire chapel was repainted, and then the stenciled images reproduced to keep the charm of the old motif. Additionally, the stars behind the tabernacle were rearranged to be more in line with the arches over the left & right statues of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Padre Pio. So all is now symmetrical and calling attention to the focal point of the chapel: the cross, the tabernacle and the altar. A dove representing the Holy Spirit was added to the highest arch in the center.

Additionally, all the pews, and all the woodwork were varnished to match the color of the moldings around the windows. The artist that did the stencils also enhanced the Stations of the Cross with gold-leaf and numbered them on the wall. Our electrician installed 4 new ceiling fans.

Behind the scenes the Priest's Sacristy was totally overhauled with new flooring and cabinetry for both vestments and altar supplies. A beautiful new countertop with undermount sinks were installed for washing and a new sacrarium for purifying vessels. Attic access was relocated to the adjacent work sacristy/boiler room so workman no longer need to disturb the Priest's sacristy to work on our HVAC equipment located in the attic. And, a window was added to the sacristy so that the room could be used as a Confessional on occasion.


