Children of our Parishes and Their Parents,

We have begun the season of Lent in the year 2023. The name derives from an Old English word “*lencten*,” which means lengthen. We experience the day by day lengthening of the hours of sunlight, as we await the coming of spring and summer. In the Church it is a 40-day period of preparation before the celebration of Jesus’s Passion, death and Resurrection.

Lent is a season of preparation before the most Holy days of Jesus’ passion, death and resurrection, during the Holy Triduum : the Holy 3 days which include Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Saturday evening celebration of the Easter Vigil Mass of the Lord’s Resurrection, and Easter Sunday.

Some of our children in our religious education program are already leading us praying the Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings at 7:00 p.m. at Sacred Heart Church. Please join us if you can, with your family. During Lent we are called to repent of our sins by examining our consciences, going to the sacrament of confession, and doing works of penance. Penances are acts of humility: prayers and works of charity and goodness that show that we are sorry for having offended God and our neighbors, and even our enemies. As a part of going to the sacrament of confession, the priest will give us a prayer or act of penance to recite or do after we have been absolved from our sins.

We know that the only one that can absolve us from sin is God. Many times during His lifetime Jesus absolved people from sins. He gave His Apostles the ability to forgive, or absolve sins. Bishops and priests since that time act as instruments (a means or way) by which God works to forgive us, and give grace to begin again, strengthened by his grace.

To this day Jesus (God) continues to forgive sins, especially very serious sins, through His Apostolic successors, the bishops and priests of the Church. When the priest says the words “I absolve you from your sins,” he speaks God’s word of forgiveness.

Examining our consciences and going to confession is a very important way for each of us to get ready for Easter. By examining our consciences frequently we come to realize which sins are most frequent in our lives, so that we can learn how to avoid them in the future. Even if you think your sins are not serious, confessing our sins to a priest gives us wonderful grace and blessings.

I appeal to you with all of my heart, to come with your family to Our Lenten Parish Penance Service at St. Pio’s Church in Lavallette at 4pm on March 9th to take advantage of this sacrament of pardon and healing.



EUCARISTIC REVIVAL MUSICAL COMPETITION

PURPOSE - The Solemnity of Corpus Christi (6/19/22) marked the beginning of a Eucharistic Revival in the U.S. - a 3 year invitation to a renewed love of Our Lord in the Eucharist. The celebration of the Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith, and we desire to foster a increased devotion to the Lord in all we do. The mystery of the Eucharist is expressed particularly poignantly through the beauty of poetry and music. Congregational song unites us as a community and reminds us that we are one Body of Christ. The musical tradition of the universal Church, which continues to grow and expand with the contributions of each generation of composers, is "a treasure of inestimable value," forming an integral part of the solemn Liturgy" (Constitution of the Sacred Liturgy, 112). In this time , we call on the creativity of the Catholic artist to give fresh voice to the truths of our faith. The US Conference of Catholic Bishops invites Catholic composers, hymn-writers, and poets to submit entries for the Eucharistic Revival Musical Competition. The purpose of this competition is to renew our zeal for the great gift of the Eucharist through music, which is so apt for expressing the ineffable. There will be 2 categories: Hymn-writing and Theme song. One winning submission will be selected in each category and will be featured at the National Eucharistic Congress, taking place in Indianapolis in 2024. Sponsorship Certificates Letters of Eligibility

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.





Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, until Holy Thursday morning, April 6, 2023 --- the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for “these forty days” was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE. The pastor of a parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to individual parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

2. Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat): this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat). The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter. The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called “Easter duty” --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the First Sunday of Lent, February 25 -26, 2023, to Trinity Sunday, June 3-4, 2023. However, the Church’s law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause. I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those who are conscious of serious sin, to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church. We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

The Holy Season of Lent brings with it the serious annual penitential obligation to abstain meat on Fridays of Lent. This year, 2023, however, Friday of the second week of Lent corresponds with Saint Patrick’s Day (March 17th), which has traditionally been an occasion for special celebrations.

As Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton, I am granting a dispensation from the obligation to abstain from eating meat to Catholics of the Diocese of Trenton, as well as to any visitors or travelers who may be physically present with the territory of this Diocese on Friday, March 17th.

Those Catholics taking advantage of the dispensation, however, are asked to transfer the Friday abstinence obligation to another day of their choosing in Lent or to perform a work of charity (for example, a donation to the poor) or some exercise of piety (i.e. a visit to Church and prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, a rosary, or some other prayer, etc.) to fulfill the spirit of obligation.


