





SECOND SUNDAY IN LENT

Message from Father Joe:

Abraham's near Sacrifice of Isaac, his beloved Son, from Genesis 22

The story of the near Sacrifice of Isaac by Abraham, as told in in Genesis, arouses many different reactions when it is heard or read. At first glance, it can come across as the utmost cruelty. Even though Isaac is eventually spared, it leaves us to question why God would ask this kind of a sacrifice in the first place. Ancient and contemporary Jews and Christians have struggled with this story, trying to make sense of it in its own right.

Some think of it as an ancient etiology (reason) that really conveyed that God really did not demand child sacrifice, and this story is used to emphasize that point, as in the end, in the Biblical version of the story, Isaac is spared, and a ram is used instead for the sacrifice. (In ancient Israel there were instances of child sacrifice in the Bible that had taken place.)

It could also be interpreted as to reason why lambs were used in the most common animal sacrifices. The explanation why lambs were sacrificed is that the lamb substituted for Isaac, so instead of human beings, God wanted to use lambs as the way of showing our faithfulness to the covenant, which was sealed in blood. It is by the martyrs' blood that the people are saved.

Some maintain that it is still to be interpreted simply as the ultimate test of obedience, Abraham's faithfulness even when God seems to demand the impossible.



In Christianity the story resonates with the story of Jesus, who out of love for His father and for us, becomes himself the sacrifice, to take away our sins. We tie the story of Isaac and his offering to the sacrifice of Passover, where the lamb substitutes for the life of the first born (as in the story of Abraham), which is spared by using the ram's blood.

All 4 gospels tie the sacrifice of Jesus to the Passover sacrifice and the theme of the paschal lamb.

In early Rabbinic Judaism (1st thru 7th centuries) the interpretation of the story became one of celebrating martyr heroes of Judaism. Some interpretations said that Isaac was a young man (about 25 years of age) who knew what was happening, and willingly allowed himself to be bound and sacrificed. Instead of being spared, he died, as the prototype for martyrs, in service to God. (Think of the revolt against Rome 66- 70 A.D.)

As we celebrate the Eucharist, we remember Jesus, the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

SCAM ALERT

The Diocese of Trenton has issued an alert regarding reports of email and text scams that will use the name of a pastor to solicit funds in the form of gift cards or cash donations. The Diocese takes this opportunity to advise parishioners that pastors do not raise money in this manner and to exercise the utmost caution when receiving this type of communication.

Some law enforcement in the area urge parishioners to question any email or text that doesn't come from a person in their contacts. If the person is not known, parishioners should call the person asking for funds to verify the story. If a pastor's name is used, parishioners should contact the parish to verify the legitimacy of the appeal. Anyone who feels that they have been the victim of this type of scam is urged to contact their local police department.

Welcome Fr. Joy!!

Fr. Joy was born in Kallara, Kerala, India, the second of five boys. Fr. Joy speaks fondly of his childhood. "I cherish it," he said. "Whenever I go back, it brings back happy memories. It was a great time. It was a beautiful time." As a family they would pray the Rosary every evening and attend Mass every morning.

It was after 10th grade that Fr. Joy received the call from God to become a priest. He completed his priestly studies from 1988-1991 at the Krist Premalaya, Bhopal Regional Theolgate Ecclesiastical Institute in Hyderabad, India in 1994. Fr. Joy was ordained on May 7, 1992, in St. Thomas Church in Kallara, India. He was quickly assigned as a parish priest at Infant Jesus Parish in Hoshangabad, India, where he led a Fathepur Mission and was a staff member and procurator of St. Therese's Minor Seminary.

Fr. Joy came to the United States in August 1994 at the recommendation of his Bishop who, he said, wanted him to "get out and learn from other parts of the world."

He was assigned as a temporary chaplain at Holly Patterson Nursing Home in the Diocese of Rockville Center, N.Y. as he awaited assignment in the Diocese of Trenton. Fr. Joy has served in St. Catherine, Middletown, Blessed Sacrament in Trenton, Incarnation in Ewing, Holy Name, Delran, St. Ann's, Keansburg, St. Veronica, Howell and most recently, St. Gabriel, in Marlboro.

Of his time in the Diocese, he said, "I am trying to be a man, a human being, a child of God and then trying to be a priest. That is the most beautiful thing I try to do."



Going to the Hospital?

- If you are scheduled to go to the hospital it is good to go to confession before you go.
- If you are having a scheduled surgery you might want to be anointed before you go.
- You can do this by calling the rectory and arranging a time with Fr. Joe or Fr. Joy.
- When you arrive at the hospital or if an emergency arises make sure that you or a family member let them know that you are Catholic and that you would like an anointing, Holy Communion and a visit by the Catholic priest chaplain.

These steps are important because HIPPA and Covid Restrictions. We cannot enter the hospitals and visit like the old days. The hospital often restrict chaplaincy to priests they have on call.

In case you cannot get the hospital to respond to your needs, please call the rectory and we will assist you in getting the spiritual help you need, or we will respond ourselves as best we can!

RECEIVING COMMUNION WITH A MASK ON




