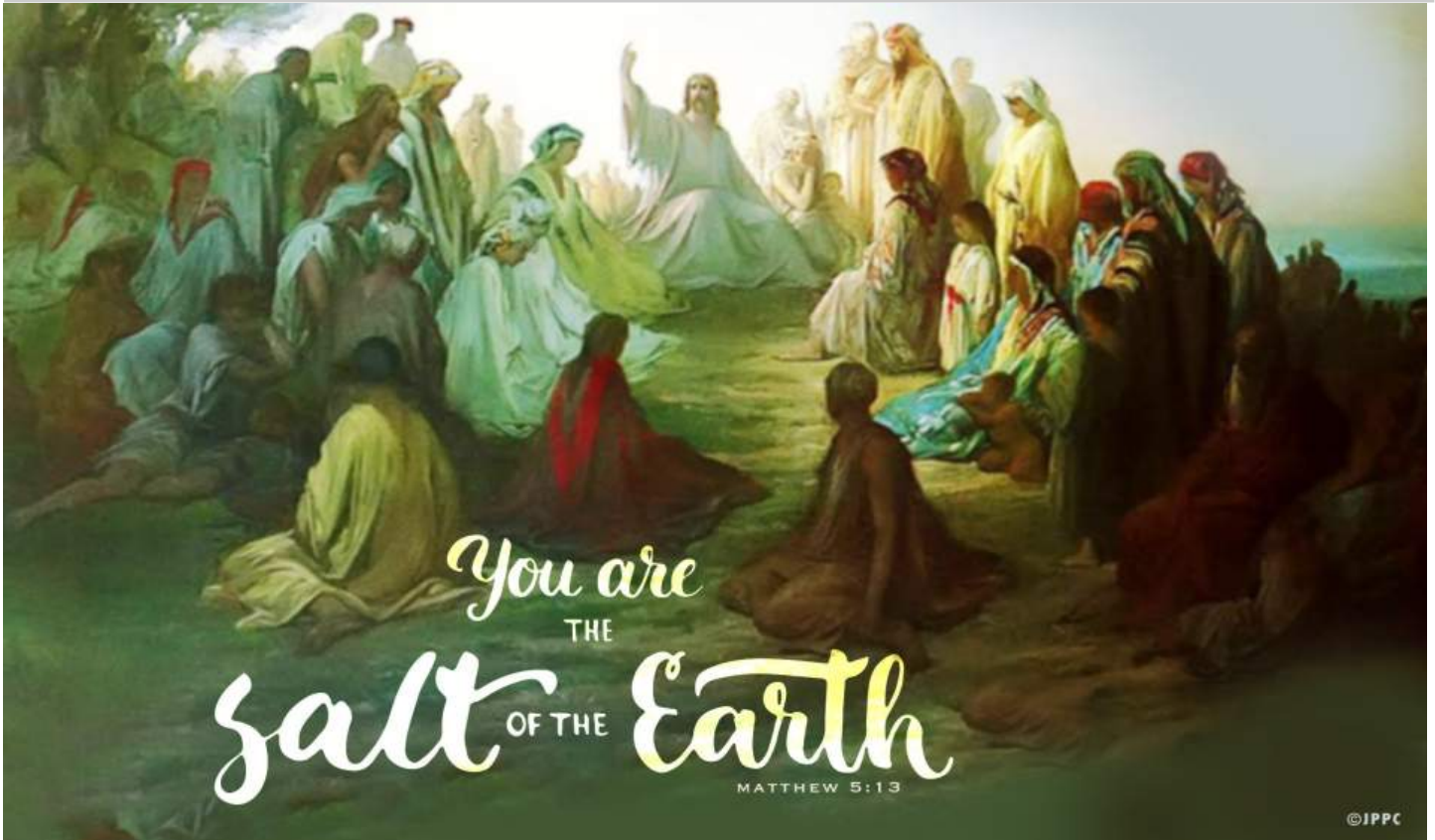

Bishop David O'Connell's Homily for Pro-Life Mass-January 20, 2023 — continued

There are those who think imposing a medicinal, canon law penalty on these individuals will change that. If medicine doesn't cure, if medicine doesn't work, what good purpose does it serve? Will it save the life of a single child in the womb. Hearts have become so hardened. God will be their judge.

50 years and 64 million abortions later, the Supreme Court at long last has overturned its tragic decision Roe v. Wade. Sadly that reversal has not ended abortion in our country. It simply "passed the buck" to the states. Here in New Jersey, we have on the books the most permissive abortion laws in our nation thanks to the hardest of hearts. The fight is in our hands.



There is no doubt our presence marching on the front line, our persistence, our prayers have made a difference as Roe v. Wade fades into saddest chapters of American history. Now is not the time for us to fade with it, to diminish our presence and persistence, to weaken our witness, to minimize the constancy of our prayers.

That is why it so important for us to stand up together as Catholics and be counted together as pro-life. It is not simply one of the many labels applied to us. It is, as the bishops of our country have reminded us, our "pre-eminent priority." Let that conviction strengthen voices...and our votes.

Today, I do not wish to focus time or attention on those who oppose us, including those who hold the highest offices in our nation and state, those who labor under the banners of "pro-choice," "reproductive rights" or a "culture of death." Again, Almighty God will be their judge. Let us continue, more than ever, to up our pro-life cause to foster building a "culture of life," for the born and unborn.

We "stand together for life." We come together here in our state and in Diocese in prayer and solidarity to proclaim the sanctity of all human life from conception to natural death.

The saint of the streets of Calcutta, Mother Teresa, once reminded us: "The so-call right to abortion has pitted mothers against their children and women against men. It has shown violence and discord at the heart of the most intimate human relationships. It has aggravated the derogation of the father's role in an increasingly fatherless society. It has portrayed the greatest of gifts-the child-as a competitor, an intrusion, and an inconvenience...Any country, or state that accepts abortions is not teaching its people to love, but to use violence to get what they want. That is why the greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion. If we have no peace, it is because we have forgotten that we belong to each other.

Today, as we stand together in the greatest of all prayers, the Eucharist, let us ask the Lord Jesus who gave his life for all of us, born and unborn, to give us the grace to protect the innocent, most vulnerable child in the womb; to love and support and encourage their mothers and fathers to let them live; to walk with mothers and fathers, to work with renewed strength to build a "culture of life" and a "civilization of love." Together, let us give thanks to God as "we stand together" for the gift of human life!

Receiving Communion:

- Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand. Those wishing to receive Communion on the tongue should wait until the end of the Communion distribution and receive from the Priest.
- Only Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion with a valid Sacred Heart/St. Pio ID card can receive Communion in a Pyx to take to the sick and homebound. For anyone that is not a Eucharistic Minister and is requesting a Host needs to see the Priest before or after Mass. Hosts will not be distributed during Mass.
- If you need a low gluten Host, please go to the Communion line in the front on the pulpit side, and ask the Eucharistic Minister.

Sponsorship Certificates Letters of Eligibility

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

Good News on Attendance

The diocese released some interesting statistics this week on the average attendance over the past 5 years. This report includes 10 churches; our two and the surrounding churches - from Point Pleasant to Whiting to Brick to Seaside. The good news is that while overall attendance is down at all churches, our two parishes are down between 21-27% - but this is compared to all the other parishes that are down between 33-49%. So, while the trend is down, we're not down as much as the others. This is cause for at least small celebration; something good is happening in our two parishes! And let's pray for the other parishes that they too can recoup the attendance lost.

Padre Pio Prayer Anthology

Prayer #43:

Focus Point: As the season of Lent will now be shortly upon us, we might be asking ourselves how to make this Lent more meaningful to our hearts, more beneficial to our souls, and more impactful on our lifestyle. We have all heard the quote from scripture, "Repent and be saved". That might be a good place to start. Examine your life, recognizing your faults and selfish choices. Make an active decision to help meet the needs of others. Remember to do what Jesus would do, as new opportunities to be helpful arise. Reflect upon the times in your own life when you needed help and be thankful that God has always been your steadfast source of help and comfort. His agony and death on the cross provided each of us with the opportunity to receive the gift of eternal life in heaven. May we be worthy of this gift by the merit of the way we live our lives. As Fr. Joy explains it, "We should do the best we can in our daily lives to help those less fortunate. Pray hard that we will be inspired by the Lord to achieve this for our world!"

Dear Lord, help me to set aside time to spend with You this Lent. 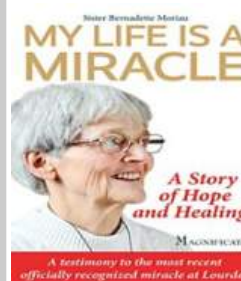
