Five Quotes from Pope Benedict XVI on Faith by Joseph Bakuras-Catholic New Agency

Pope Benedict XVI's death marks the end of an era in which the prolific writer and speaker conveyed his reflections on the Catholic faith. In both speaking and writing about the faith, the late pope consistently emphasized the importance of faith itself and its necessity in fostering one's relation with God. Below, are five times Pope Benedict XVI spoke about the virtue of faith.

Faith is more than "intellectual assent"

"Faith is not a mere intellectual assent of the human person to specific truths about God; it is an act with which I entrust myself freely to a God who is Father and who loves me; it is adherence to a "You" who gives me hope and trust."

Faith is meeting God

"Having faith, then, is meeting this "You," God, who supports me and grants me the promise of an indestructible love that not only aspires to eternity but gives it; it means entrusting myself to God with attitude of a child, who knows well that all his difficulties, all his problems are understood in the 'you' of his mother." "Being saved through faith, Benedict said, is a gift that God offers to everyone."

The Faith of the Blessed Virgin Mary

How did the Mother of God live her life full of faith, given all of the trials that she had to endure? Pope Benedict answers by giving the example of the Gospel of Luke's first chapter where Mary both "reflects" and ponders" on the greeting of the Archangel Gabriel to her.

'Mary reflects, she ponders on the meaning of this greeting" This means that Mary enters into a deep conversation with the Word of God that been announced to her, she does not consider it superficially but mediates on it, lets it sink into her mind and her heart so as to understand what the Lord wants of her." It is the profound humility of the obedient faith of Mary , who welcomes with her even what she does not understand in God's action, leaving it to God to open her mind and heart."

Faith: a proof of things unseen

"Faith is not merely a personal reaching out towards things to come that are still totally absent: it gives us something. It gives us even now something of the reality we're waiting for, and this present reality constitutes for us a "proof" of the things that are still unseen. Faith draws that future into the present, so that it is no longer simply a 'not yet.' The fact that this future exists changes the present, the present is touched by the future reality, and thus the things of the future spill over into those of the present and those of the present into those of the future."

Faith that bears no fruit

"Faith without charity bears no fruit, while charity without faith would be a sentiment constant at the mercy of doubt." "Faith and charity each require the other, in such a way that each allows the other to set out along its respective path. Indeed, many Christians dedicate their lives with love to those who are lonely, marginalized, or excluded." "Through faith, we can recognize the face of the risen Lord in those who ask for our love."


Clothing Drive What's in your closet?

Going to the Hospital?

- If you are scheduled to go to the hospital it is good to go to confession before you go.
- If you are having a scheduled surgery you might want to be anointed before you go.
- You can do this by calling the rectory and arranging a time with Fr. Joe or Fr. Joy.
- When you arrive at the hospital or if an emergency arises make sure that you or a family member let them know that you are Catholic and that you would like an anointing, Holy Communion and a visit by the Catholic priest chaplain.

These steps are important because HIPPA and Covid Restrictions. We cannot enter the hospitals and visit like the old days. The hospital often restrict chaplaincy to priests they have on call. In case you cannot get the hospital to respond to your needs, please call the rectory and we will assist you in getting the spiritual help you need, or we will respond ourselves as best we can!

Anointing of the Sick - This sacrament is for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass to receive this sacrament or call the parish office for an appointment.

Receiving Communion:

- Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand. Those wishing to receive Communion on the tongue should wait until the end of the Communion distribution and receive from the Priest.
- Only Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion with a valid Sacred Heart/St. Pio ID card can receive Communion in a Pyx to take to the sick and home-bound. For anyone that is not a Eucharistic Minister and is requesting a Host needs to see the Priest before or after Mass. Hosts will not be distributed during Mass.
- If you need a low gluten Host, please go to the Communion line in the front on the pulpit side, and ask the Eucharistic Minister.

Sponsorship Certificates Letters of Eligibility

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

Universal Prayers for Pope Benedict XVI

PART ONE.....

Benedict's family

1. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI's birth name is Joseph Aloisius Ratzinger.
2. Joseph Ratzinger was born on 16 April 1927 in the German town of Marktl, Bavaria.
3. His parents are Joseph Ratzinger Sr, who was a policeman, and Maria Ratzinger.
4. Joseph is the youngest of three children. His brother, Georg Ratzinger, is a retired priest, and his sister, Maria Ratzinger, was a housekeeper.

World War 2

5. Following his 14th birthday in 1941, Joseph was conscripted into the Hitler Youth, as membership was required by law for all 14-year-old German boys after March 1939.
6. One of his cousins, a 14-year-old boy with Down syndrome, was taken away by the Nazis and murdered during their eugenics programme.
7. In 1943, while still in seminary, Joseph was drafted into the German anti-aircraft corps as Luftwaffenfunker.
8. In 1945, he deserted back to his family's home in Traunstein after his unit had ceased to exist, just as American troops established a headquarters in the Ratzinger household.
9. As a German soldier, he was interned in a prisoner of war camp, but released a few months later at the end of the war in May 1945. (Continued).....

Ordination and study

10. Joseph and his brother Georg entered Saint Michael Seminary in Traunstein in 1945.
11. Ratzinger was ordained a priest in 1951 in Freising, Bavaria.
12. In 1953, he obtained a doctorate in theology with the dissertation, “The People and House of God in St. Augustine’s Doctrine of the Church”.

Academic career

13. Joseph Ratzinger became a professor at the University of Bonn in 1959. His inaugural lecture was on “The God of Faith and the God of Philosophy”.
14. In 1963, he moved to the University of Münster.
15. In 1966, Ratzinger was appointed to a chair in dogmatic theology at the University of Tübingen.
16. In 1969, he returned to Bavaria, to the University of Regensburg, and became its Vice President from 1976 to 1977.

Rising the Church ranks


17. On 24 March 1977, Ratzinger was appointed Archbishop of Munich and Freising.
18. Later that year, on 27 June 1977, Pope Paul VI elevated him to Cardinal.
19. In 1981, he was appointed Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith.

Elected Pope Benedict XVI

20. Benedict XVI was elected Pope on 19 April 2005, becoming the 265th pope.
21. Saint John Paul II was Benedict’s predecessor and Pope Francis is his successor.
22. Pope Benedict XVI was the oldest person to be elected pope since 1730.
23. Around the time of the election, Benedict said that he’d hoped he wasn’t going to be elected, saying, “At a certain point, I prayed to God ‘please don’t do this to me’. Evidently, this time He didn’t listen to me.”
24. He became the ninth German to be elected to the highest office in the Church.
25. Benedict and his Polish predecessor John Paul II were the first consecutive non-Italian popes since the seven consecutive Frenchmen of the Avignon Papacy (1309–78).
26. Pope Benedict’s first public words as pontiff were, “Dear brothers and sisters, after the great Pope John Paul II, the Cardinals have elected me, a simple, humble labourer in the vineyard of the Lord. The fact that the Lord knows how to work and to act even with insufficient instruments comforts me, and above all I entrust myself to your prayers. In the joy of the Risen Lord, confident of his unfailing help, let us move forward. The Lord will help us, and Mary, His Most Holy Mother, will be on our side. Thank you.”


STANDING TOGETHER FOR LIFE






