Epiphany House Blessing for 2022

Whether you've just moved into a new home or you've lived in the same house for 20+ years, here is a simple house blessing you and your family can do together. You are welcome to take home Holy Water from the baptismal font in the Church on January 2nd when the Epiphany water is blessed - any container is fine!

Begin with making the sign of the cross together.

Opening Prayer: "When Christ took on flesh, He made his home with us. Let us now pray that He will enter this home and bless it with his presence. May He always be here among us; may He nurture our love for each other, share in our joys, and comfort us in our sorrows. We pray this in the name of Jesus our Lord."

Scripture Reading from the Letter to the Colossians:

"You are God's chosen ones. He loves you. You should be clothed in sincere compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with one another; forgive each other. The lord has forgiven you; now you must do the same.

Over all these, put on love. And may the peace of Christ reign in your hearts. Be thankful. Let the message of Christ, in all its richness, find a home with you. Never say or do anything except in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." (Col 3: 12-17)

Blessing the rooms of your home:

Sprinkle each room with holy water (available from baptismal font of the Church on Jan. 6). At the home's entrance: O God, protect our going and coming. Let us share the hospitality of this home with all who visit us.

In the living room: O God, give your blessings to all who share this room that we may be knit together in companionship.

In the kitchen: O God, You fill the hungry with good things. Send your blessing on us as we work in this kitchen, and make us ever thankful for our daily bread.

In the dining room: Blessed are you, Lord of heaven and earth, for You give us food and drink to sustain our lives and make our hearts glad. Help us to be grateful for all your mercies and mindful of the needs of others.

In each bedroom: Protect us Lord as we stay awake; watch over us as we sleep, that awake we may keep watch with Christ and asleep, we may rest in his peace.

Together, pray the Our Father.

Final prayer: "Be our shelter, Lord, when we are home, our companion when we are away, and our welcome guest when we return. And at last receive us into the dwelling place You have prepared for us in your Father's house, where You live forever and ever. Amen.

Conclude with the sign of the cross.

Going to the Hospital?

- If you are scheduled to go to the hospital it is good to go to confession before you go.
- If you are having a scheduled surgery you might want to be anointed before you go.
- You can do this by calling the rectory and arranging a time with Fr. Joe or Fr. Joy.
- When you arrive at the hospital or if an emergency arises make sure that you or a family member let them know that you are Catholic and that you would like an anointing, Holy Communion and a visit by the Catholic priest chaplain.

These steps are <u>important</u> because HIPPA and Covid Restrictions. We cannot enter the hospitals and visit like the old days. The hospital often restrict chaplaincy to priests they have on call. In case you cannot get the hospital to respond to your needs, please call the rectory and we will assist you in getting the spiritual help you need, or we will respond ourselves as best we can!

PADRE PIO PRAYER ANTHOLOGY

Our first parish prayer anthology will include many types of prayers. We will begin our collection with prayers that you can use to develop a relationship with God that is more personal and intimate.

Prayer #31

<u>Focus idea</u>: All of us have probably used the expression, 'heaven help us' when we are shocked or amazed at something that has recently happened, either in the world or in our personal lives. Most likely we are feeling sad, scared or discouraged. And then what? Do we do anything about it, or do we just let the feeling fade away? Most likely we really don't know what to do. So maybe we should pray. When we pray, we shouldn't expect that God will solve our problems for us, but rather that God will inspire us with an idea for what we can do to solve our own problems or at least to lessen the pain of our concerns or circumstances. And then we need to listen! And then we need to trust in the response that the Holy Spirit brings into our hearts! And then most importantly, we need to act upon God's response to our prayers! As Fr. Joe has said, "So many times we are confused by what is happening to us in life. But God will take the worst circumstances and make them a vehicle of strengthening us and inspiring us, IF we are people of prayer." So 'heaven' will always help us, IF we ask, and IF we listen!

Prayer for Trust in the Inspiration of the Holy Spirit: Dear Jesus, please help me to feel that I am never alone. My life's journey here on earth will have some serious 'bumps in the road'. You know when I am in need. Call out to me. Remind me to pray, to spend intimate time with You, and to truly feel that I can always turn to You when I feel alone or distraught. Please send the Holy Spirit into my heart with Your message. And help me to listen, and to trust in that message. Bless me with Your grace, so that I may have the strength and courage to act upon Your message. I love You with all my heart. Thank You for loving me back, and for the glorious feeling that Your love brings to me! Amen.

<u>Closing thoughts</u>: Tell Jesus what is in your heart. Thank Him for your gifts and most of all, thank Him for loving you with His most Sacred Heart!

<u>Anointing of the Sick</u> - This sacrament is for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass to receive this sacrament or call the parish office for an appointment.

Receiving Communion:

- Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand. To receive on the tongue please wait until all have received, go to the end of the line of the priest distributing Communion.
- Anyone needing a <u>low gluten host</u>, please get in the communion line in the front, on the pulpit side. Ask the minister for a low gluten Host.
- To take Communion from Mass to <u>homebound family</u> <u>members</u>, go to the sacristy <u>after Mass</u> with your pyx. Ask the priest/minister to get you a host from the tabernacle. Hosts for others will not be distributed during Mass.

Sponsorship Certificates Letters of Eligibility

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

Children of parishioners over 21 years of age should register independently.
