RESPECT LIFE REFLECTION

Called to Serve Moms in Need

Our Blessed Mother models a profound witness to love and life in the Gospel account of the Visitation. Luke's Gospel tells us that, when Mary learns that her cousin Elizabeth is pregnant, she travels to the hill country "*in haste*" (Lk 1:39). Despite being unexpectedly pregnant herself, Mary responds to this news with urgency.

She embarks on a long and perhaps difficult journey to be with her cousin during her time of need, bearing Christ to her as He lay quietly hidden in Mary's womb. And, although Jesus is veiled from view, when Mary first arrives John the Baptist leaps for joy in Elizabeth's womb, recognizing the presence of Christ (Lk 1:44). Mary, with Jesus, spends the next three months at Elizabeth's side.

The witness of our Blessed Mother invites us to become more aware of the needs of pregnant and parenting moms in our own parishes and communities. A woman with an unexpected pregnancy may have any number of fears and challenges: facing judgment from her friends and family, losing her job or housing, or being abandoned by the father of her child.

Following Mary's example, we can ask ourselves how to better know these mothers, listen to them, seek understanding, and help them obtain the necessities of life for themselves and their children. How can we, like the Blessed Mother, lovingly support mothers in welcoming and caring for God's gift of life?

Throughout the whole of Scripture, Mary's words are few. Yet, in her sacred encounter with Elizabeth, a powerful declaration pours from her lips. Mary proclaims to all generations that the Lord *lifts up the lowly, fills the hungry with good things, and remembers his promise of mercy from age to age* (Lk 1:46-56). In both word and deed, Mary speaks a message of *hope*—not only to Elizabeth, but also to every mother in need and to each of us.

Mary's witness is an invitation to step out in love and compassion. It is a summons to *make haste* to help vulnerable women who may be isolated and alone. By doing so, we too can bear Christ within us and help others experience His presence.

Inspired by the Blessed Mother's example and guided by the Holy Spirit, may we offer Christ's presence and love to mothers in their time of need through our faithful service and support.

Going to the Hospital?

- If you are scheduled to go to the hospital it is good to go to confession before you go.
- If you are having a scheduled surgery you might want to be anointed before you go.
- You can do this by calling the rectory and arranging a time with Fr. Joe or Fr. Joy.
- When you arrive at the hospital or if an emergency arises make sure that you or a family member let them know that you are Catholic and that you would like an anointing, Holy Communion and a visit by the Catholic priest chaplain.

These steps are important because HIPPA and Covid Restrictions. We cannot enter the hospitals and visit like the old days. The hospital often restrict chaplaincy to priests they have on call. In case you cannot get the hospital to respond to your needs, please call the rectory and we will assist you in getting the spiritual help you need, or we will respond ourselves as best we can!

Receiving Communion:

- Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand. Those wishing to receive Communion on the tongue should wait until the end of the Communion distribution and receive from the Priest.
- Only Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion with a valid Sacred Heart/St. Pio ID card can receive Communion in a Pyx to take to the sick and home-bound. For anyone that is not a Eucharistic Minister and is requesting a Host needs to see the Priest before or after Mass. Hosts will not be distributed during Mass.
- If you need a low gluten Host, please go to the Communion line in the front on the pulpit side, and ask the Eucharistic Minister.

Sponsorship Certificates Letters of Eligibility

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

50 FACTS Part Two.....

Pope Benedict XVI

The Benedict name

27. Ratzinger chose the pontifical name Benedict, which comes from the Latin word meaning “the blessed”, in honour of both Pope Benedict XV and **Saint Benedict of Nursia**.

28. Speaking on his choice of pontifical name, Benedict said, “Filled with sentiments of awe and thanksgiving, I wish to speak of why I chose the name Benedict. Firstly, I remember Pope Benedict XV, that courageous prophet of peace, who guided the Church through turbulent times of war. In his footsteps I place my ministry in the service of reconciliation and harmony between peoples. Additionally, I recall Saint Benedict of Nursia, co-patron of Europe, whose life evokes the Christian roots of Europe. I ask him to help us all to hold firm to the centrality of Christ in our Christian life: May Christ always take first place in our thoughts and actions!”

Some papal moments

29. In September 2010, Pope Benedict visited the United Kingdom, where he beatified Cardinal John Henry Newman.

30. On 7 October 2012, Pope Benedict XVI named Hildegard of Bingen and John of Avila as Doctors of the Church.

Encyclicals

31. During his papacy, Benedict wrote three encyclicals: Deus caritas est (“God is Love”), Spe Salvi (“Saved by Hope”) and Caritas in veritate (“Love in Truth”).

32. At the time of his resignation, Benedict had completed a draft of a fourth encyclical entitled Lumen Fidei (“The Light of Faith”).

Papal resignation

33. Benedict XVI’s papacy ended on 28 February 2013, when he became the first pope in 600 years to resign – the previous being Pope Gregory XII in 1415.

34. He said his resignation was due to a “lack of strength in the mind and body”.

35. Upon his resignation, Benedict decided to keep his papal name, but would now have the title “Pope Emeritus”.

36. Pope Benedict’s Fisherman’s Ring, of which a new one is created for each pope, is usually destroyed by Vatican officials on the death of a pope, but was returned to the Vatican.

Literature

37. To date, Benedict XVI has written 68 books, three encyclicals, and three apostolic exhortations.

38. Benedict XVI coined the term “dictatorship of relativism”, stating “Today, a particularly insidious obstacle to the task of education is the massive presence in our society and culture of that relativism which, recognising nothing as definitive, leaves as the ultimate criterion only the self with its desires. And under the semblance of freedom it becomes a prison for each one, for it separates people from one another, locking each person into his or her own ego.”

39. Pope Benedict was once asked which two books he would take with him to read on a deserted island. His answer was the Bible and Augustine’s Confessions.

40. There is an authorised biography of Pope Benedict XVI, based around the life of a real cat of his called Chico, titled “**Joseph and Chico: The Life of Pope Benedict XVI as Told by a Cat**”. (Continued)

Music

41. Benedict is an accomplished pianist.
42. His favorite composer is Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, saying "His music is by no means just entertainment; it contains the whole tragedy of human existence."
43. Benedict's favorite works of music are Mozart's Clarinet Concerto and Clarinet Quintet.
44. He recorded an album of contemporary classical music in which he sings and recites prayers to the Blessed Virgin Mary.
45. He released **Alma Mater: Music from the Vatican** to celebrate the 2009 Christmas season and to provide income for music programs for underprivileged children.
- Other facts**
46. Benedict XVI has a pilot's license, and liked to fly from the Vatican to the papal summer residence, Castel Gandolfo, but he doesn't have a driver's license as he never learned to drive a car.
47. Many people have talked about his debating skills and his desire to reach out to people who have different points of view about religious subjects.
48. He is also known to be fond of cats. As Cardinal Ratzinger, he was known (according to former neighbours) to look after stray cats in his neighborhood.
49. Benedict XVI is fluent in German, English, Italian, French and Spanish, whilst also possessing knowledge of Portuguese and the ability to speak classical Latin.
50. He has German and Vatican citizenship.






Good News on Attendance

The diocese released some interesting statistics this week on the average attendance over the past 5 years. This report includes 10 churches; our two and the surrounding churches - from Point Pleasant to Whiting to Brick to Seaside. The good news is that while overall attendance is down at all churches, our two parishes are down between 21-27% - but this is compared to all the other parishes that are down between 33-49%. So, while the trend is down, we're not down as much as the others. This is cause for at least small celebration; something good is happening in our two parishes! And let's pray for the other parishes that they too can recoup the attendance lost.




