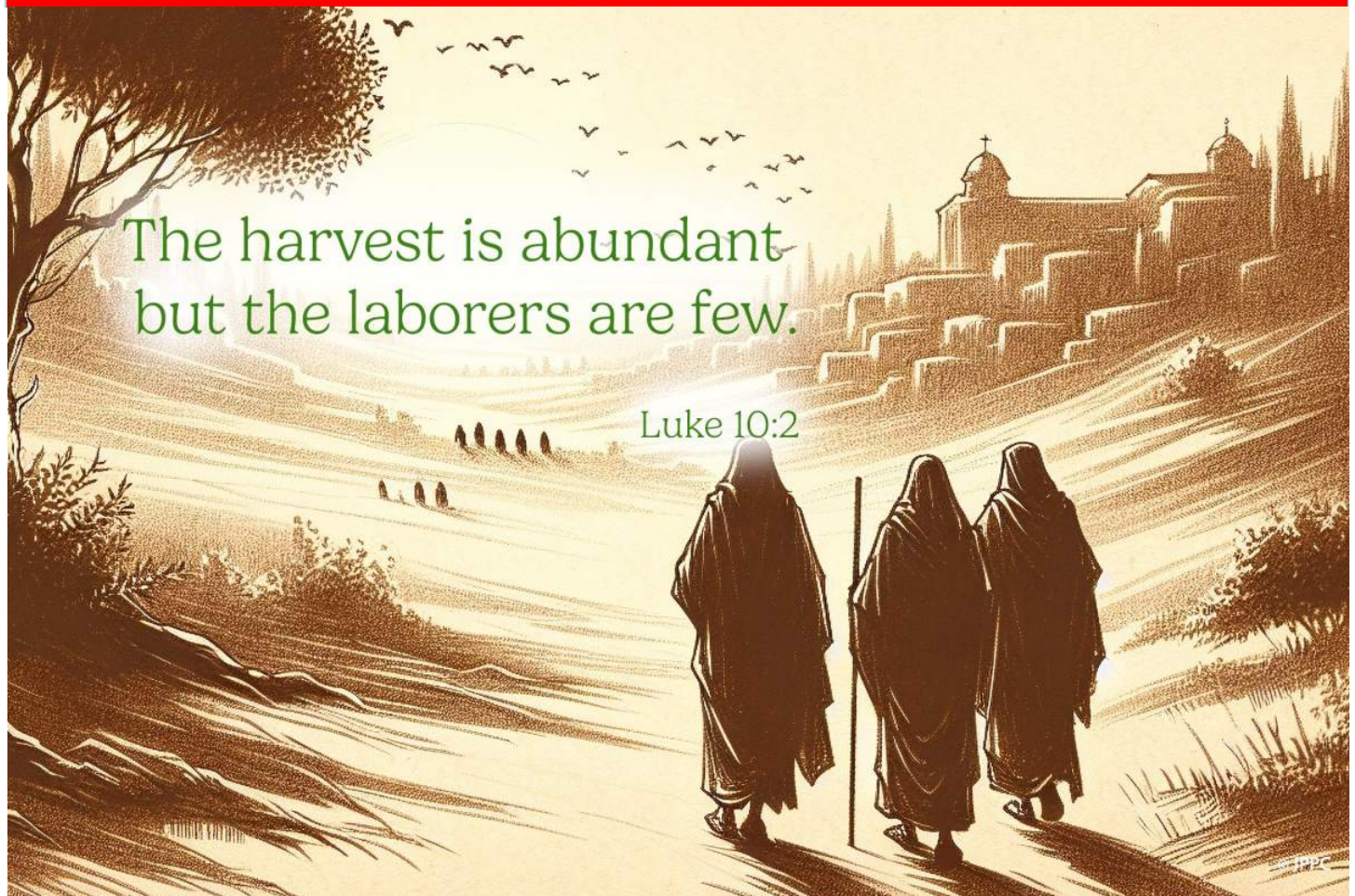

From the Desk of Fr. Joe:

Who are the saints who promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart and when did they live?

A number of saints throughout history have significantly promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, encouraging believers to focus on Christ's love and compassion for humanity. Here are some of the key figures and when they lived.

St. Bernard of Clairvaux (1090-1153)

A Cistercian monk, his writings encouraged a deeper look at Christ's heart as the source of love for God and others.



St. Bonaventure (1221-1274)

A Franciscan theologian and Doctor of the Church, he expressed a deep devotion to the Sacred Heart in his works, seeing it as the source of sacraments and grace.



St. Gertrude the Great (1256-1302)

A German Benedictine nun and mystic, she was an early proponent of devotion to the Sacred Heart, predating St. Margaret Mary. Her mystical experiences and writings reflected a deep love for Christ's heart.



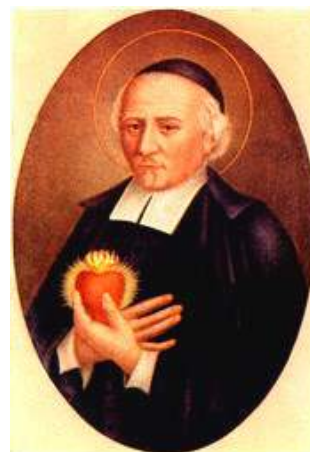
St. Francis de Sales (1567-1622)

A French bishop and writer, he promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart, highlighting Christ's gentleness and humility.



St. John Eudes (1601-1680)

A French priest, he is known as a tireless advocate of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. He wrote an office and promoted a feast for the Sacred Heart, gaining Church approval for its celebration.

St. Claude de La Colombière (1641-1682)

A Jesuit priest and St. Margaret Mary's spiritual director, he supported her visions and helped promote the devotion to the Sacred Heart. He wrote about her revelations and played a vital role in its early spread.



St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690)

A French Visitation nun and mystic, she is perhaps the most famous advocate of this devotion in its modern form. She reported receiving numerous apparitions of Jesus between 1673 and 1675, who revealed different aspects of the devotion, including the Importance of receiving Communion on the First Friday of each month and observing a Holy Hour of reparation. Her experiences were crucial in spreading the devotion throughout the Catholic Church.



St. Alphonsus Liguori (1696-1787)

The founder of the Redemptorist order, he actively propagated the devotion and composed the first Novena to the Sacred Heart.



St. John Bosco (1815-1888)

The founder of the Salesians, he encouraged devotion to the Sacred Heart among young people.



These are just a few of the many saints who have promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus throughout the centuries. Their lives and writings have inspired countless individuals to deepen their understanding and love for Christ's heart.

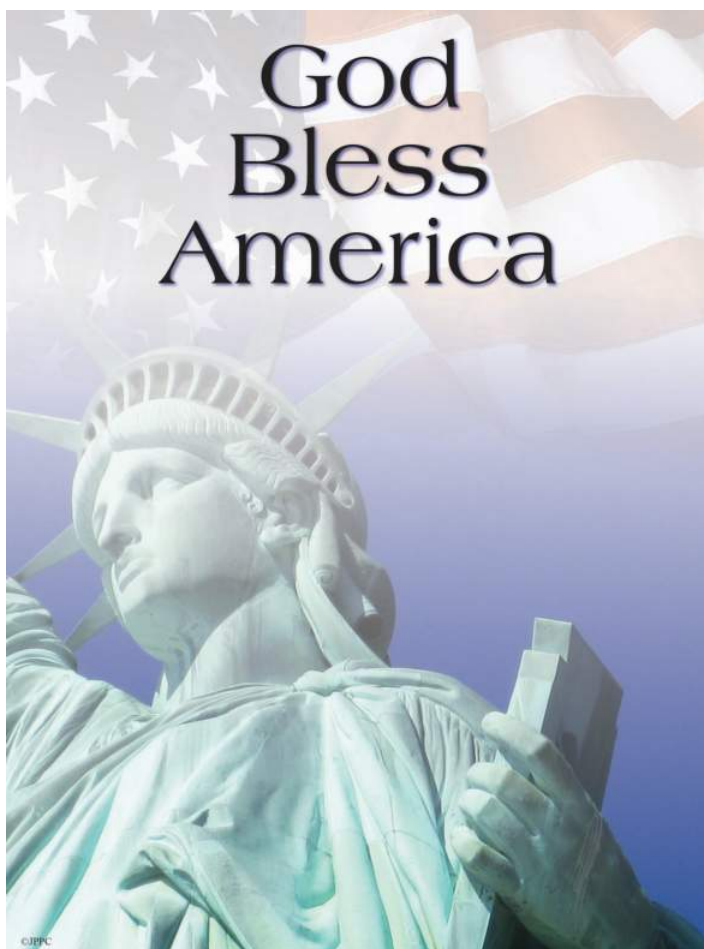

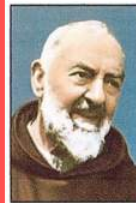

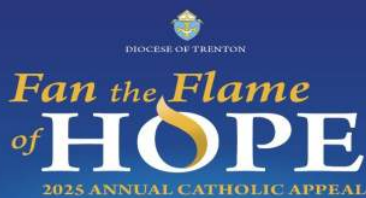

AED's and where to find them!

An AED, or Automated External Defibrillator, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet **easy-to-use**, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm. Sacred Heart has 2 AED units.



One in the Church (in the Usher's Closet near the front entrance) and one in Casey Hall on the wall nearest the Ladies Room. St. Pio's also has 2 AED units. One in the Church parking lot side on the back wall just before St. Pio's Room and one in the Parish Hall on the back wall (street side). Please familiarize yourself with where these are so they can be retrieved in an emergency.

FOCUS POINT: July is dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus. We receive and worship His Precious Blood each time we receive communion. But, what happens when we leave the altar? He shed His blood for the forgiveness of our sins and the promise of eternal life. Long after we have left the altar, we can renew our faith, continue our worship and give thanks for his suffering through prayer to His Precious Blood. By contemplating Jesus in the Garden at Gethsemane asking the Father to "take this cup" from His hands, we can feel the "agony" he then suffered for us by willingly shedding His blood. We can thank him through prayer for this gift of communion by not letting His blood shed be in vain. As we offer up our prayers, intentions and petitions we can pray to the Precious Blood of Jesus!

PRAYER TO THE PRECIOUS BLOOD OF JESUS: Dear Lord, Thank You for the gift of communion where I am privileged to receive Your Precious Blood. Help me to continue adoring Your Precious Blood long after communion. 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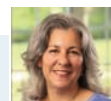
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
