FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Perpetual Virginity of Mary, and the Cousins/Close Relatives of Jesus in this Week's Gospel

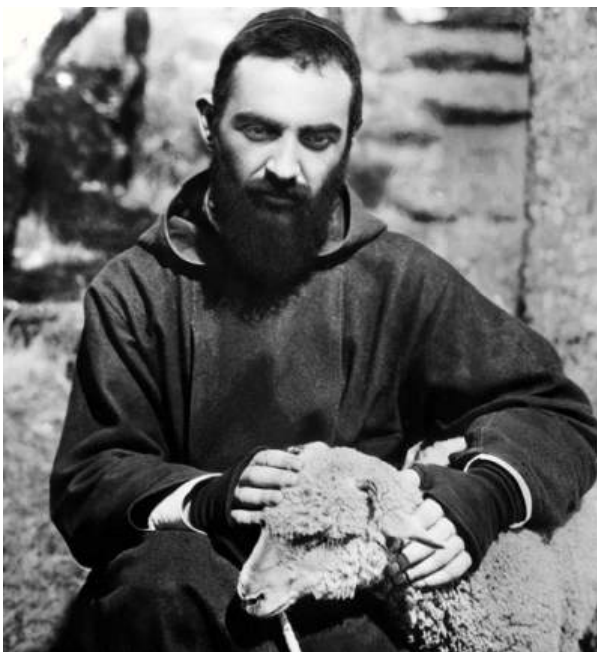
Dr. Brant Pitre is the Distinguished Research Professor of Scripture at the Augustine Institute, Graduate School of Theology. He earned his Ph.D. in Theology from the University of Notre Dame, where he specialized in the study of the New Testament and ancient Judaism. He is the author of the best-selling books, *Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist* (Image, 2011), *The Case for Jesus* (Image, 2015), and *Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary* (Image, 2018).

Excerpts from the article:

The Church celebrates Mary as Aeiiparthenos, the "Ever-virgin." Against this doctrine the objection is sometimes raised that the Bible mentions brothers and sisters of Jesus [Cf. Mk 3:31-35; 6:3] The Church has always understood these passages as not referring to other children of the Virgin Mary. In fact, James and Joseph, "brothers of Jesus," are the sons of another Mary, a disciple of Christ, whom St. Matthew significantly calls "the other Mary." [Mt 13:55; 28:1; cf. Mt 27:56]

It is important for us to recognize that although some Catholics in the pew may be scandalized by the reading from today and have a reaction to it that makes them wonder, "well, wait what about the perpetual virginity of Mary?" The reality is, that this passage from the Gospel of Mark in no way undermines the perpetual virginity of Mary, actually it supports it because it provides evidence to the fact that James and Joseph, two of the so-called brothers of Jesus, are actually children of another woman named Mary, who is mentioned in the Gospel of Mark as simply "the mother of James" or "the mother of Joses." One of whom, by the way, would go on to become the Bishop of Jerusalem and one of the first leaders in the early church, whom Paul tellingly refers to as James, the so-called brother of Jesus, in the Book of Corinthians and the Book of Galatians. So in closing then, the gospel for today is packed, there's a lot in there but it brings home to us the fact that Jesus the Messiah, who is revealing himself through his words and actions in the Gospel of Mark, is going to be a prophet who is not accepted and will ultimately be rejected, not just by his own relatives in his hometown, but by the people of Jerusalem, who will bring him to the cross and ultimately through the cross to his resurrection.

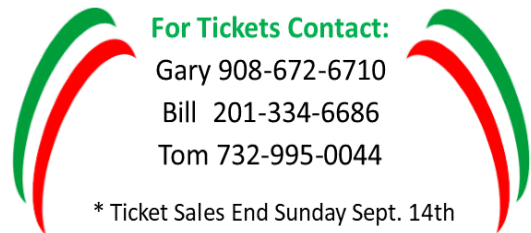

AUDIENCE APPROVAL

A reflection for July 7, The Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Politicians and entertainers know the importance of playing to an audience. If a candidate for public office receives applause and approval as he highlights his support for a particular proposal, he will continue to stress his position. But if voters remain silent or show disapproval, that politician will nuance his words and move on to another issue.

Entertainers do the same thing. A singer with dozens of hits may decide to avoid these songs at her concert. Instead, she may start performing songs by other artists. The lack of response from her audience will lead her to realize her fans had other expectations. She will quickly adjust her program.

Politicians and entertainers are attuned to the reaction of their audiences.

In Sunday's Gospel, we hear of someone who did not play to his audience. Jesus came home to Nazareth. "When the sabbath came he began to teach in the synagogue." At first, many in the hometown audience were "astonished." But as he spoke, that initial surprise morphed into criticism "and they took offense at him."

But as the audience turned on him, Jesus did not attempt to win them back by altering his words. Disapproving looks, cruel comments, and the clenched fists of his audience would not keep Jesus from proclaiming the truth of the Gospel.

Jesus did not seek the approval of his audience in Nazareth or in any other venue. He was concerned with the approval of just one audience: his Father in heaven, the Holy One who at his baptism had told Jesus, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Mark 1:11). That divine approval was then confirmed again at the Transfiguration.

Today's society is sorely in need of Christians who, like Jesus, do not "play to the audience." Unfortunately, there are many Christians who alter their words and ideas to suit popular opinion. Their stances on issues of life, healthcare, poverty, race, sexual morality, gender identity, migration, financial inequality, housing, drug use, etc. are based not on the sound foundation of the Gospel and the teaching of the Church, but rather on the shifting sands of societal opinion and social approval.

Like Jesus, Christians are not to be concerned about winning over any human audience. We are to work at gaining the approval of an audience of One: the Holy One who will be the ultimate judge of our performance in life.
