



Our deacon, John H. Hanna, has announced his retirement. He has served our parish since 2002. Please join us for his farewell Mass followed by a brunch in our Parish Hall.

Deacon John H. Hanna, Ordination and career history

John Hanna applied to the Diocese of Metuchen in 1991 for admission into the Deaconate Program. He then completed four years of education by St Elizabeth College, Convent Station, NJ and attended hands on training almost every weekend. He was Ordained by Bishop Hughes on May 5, 1996.

He was sponsored by the pastor at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in Whitehouse Station, NJ and first assigned to that parish, serving, preaching, and doing baptisms and weddings. He and his wife, Donna, ran the Pre Cana program, worked on the RCIA team, and served in leadership roles in the Parish Renewal programs. They also chaired major social events.

After five years of service at OLL Parish they moved to the Shore and in early 2002 Msgr. Troiano agreed to have Deacon John serve, in the Trenton Diocese, at St Bonaventure Parish. There, in addition to his normal Deacon duties, he was part of the Pastoral Council, responsible for scheduling Lectors and EM's, and in charge of the RCIA program.

After St Bonaventure was merged with Our Lady of Peace in Normandy Beach he was assigned by Msgr. Troiano, in early 2005, to be the on site administer of the OLP Parish responsible to supervise the office, publish the bulletin, manage the Parish accounts and safe-guard the revenue, schedule the priests and lay ministers, co-ordinate liturgy planning, manage the music and maintain the condition of the Church. During 2006 he was incardinated into the Diocese of Trenton, Diaconate program by Bishop Smith.

He assisted Msgr Troiano in the process to combine the two parishes. When the merger was completed in February 2007, he moved back to Lavallette to work in the new St Pio Parish. His wife Donna joined the Parish staff and ultimately became the Parish Secretary. In addition to his Diaconal services, his responsibilities were to fully implement the Ministry Schedule Program for both locations, implement the Call Management System, manage the RCIA program, and be spiritual director for the KofC, Holy Name Society, Rosary Altar Society, the St Vincent de Paul Society. He has led the current Faith Sharing Group (for over fifteen years!). He also led a Men's Faith Sharing group for about five years.

Deacon John served as President of the Holy Name Society (2years) and Donna was President of the Rosary & Altar (2 years). Currently, he serves as Spiritual Director to HNS and RAS and leads the Faith Sharing Group. During the Covid-19 period (March 2020 till now) he kept the Faith Sharing Group connected with daily spiritual phone calls to their homes.

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

From Fr. Joe:

What does it mean to believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty? God “dwells in unapproachable light, whom no human being has seen or can see” (1 Tm 6:16). Revelation tells us that He is living and personal, profoundly close to us in creating and sustaining us. Though He is totally other, hidden, glorious, and wondrous, He communicates Himself to us through creation and reveals Himself through the prophets and above all in Jesus Christ, whom we meet in the Church, especially in Scripture and the Sacraments. In these many ways, God speaks to our hearts where we may welcome His loving presence. We do not confuse the word mystery with the term as it applies to a detective story or a scientific puzzle. The mystery of God is not a puzzle to be solved. It is a truth to be revered. It is a reality too rich to be fully grasped by our minds, so that while it continues to unfold, it always remains mostly beyond our comprehension. The mystery of God is present in our lives and yet remains hidden, beyond the full grasp of our minds. God, who always remains beyond our comprehension, has shown Himself to us throughout the history of salvation. His relationship with Israel is marked by all kinds of loving deeds. He, ever faithful and forgiving, is ultimately experienced by human beings through His Son, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit. His love is stronger than a mother’s love for her child or a bridegroom’s for His beloved. St. John proclaims, “God is love” (1 Jn 4:8). Jesus has revealed that God’s very being is love. The Old Testament shows God as one, unique, without equal. “Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone” (Dt 6:4; Mk 12:29). He created the world, made a covenant with His people, and is the Father of the poor, the orphan, and the widow. In the Creeds, we profess our faith in God as “Father almighty.” His fatherhood and power illumine each other by His care for us, by adopting us as sons and daughters in Baptism and by being rich in mercy to forgive our sins. Scripture constantly praises the universal power of God as the “mighty one of Jacob” and the “Lord of hosts” (Gn 49:24; Is 1:24ff.). God’s power is loving, for He is our Father. God’s parental tenderness can also be expressed by the image of motherhood, which emphasizes God’s immanence, the intimacy between Creator and creature. The language of faith thus draws on the human experience of parents, who are in a way the first representatives of God for man. But this experience also tells us that human parents are fallible and can disfigure the face of fatherhood and motherhood. We ought therefore to recall that God transcends the human distinction between the sexes. He is neither man nor woman: He is God. He also transcends human fatherhood and motherhood, although He is their origin and standard: no one is father as God is Father. (CCC, no. 239) Jesus revealed God as Father in a new sense. God is Father in His relation to Jesus, His only begotten Son. At the Last Supper, Jesus calls God “Father” forty-five times (cf. Jn 13-17). The Son is divine, as is the Father (cf. Mt 11:27). In a later chapter, Jesus as the Second Person of the Trinity will be discussed further. Before the Passion, Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit as teacher, guide, and consoler. The Spirit’s appearance at Pentecost and at other events in the New Testament gives ample evidence of the Holy Spirit as the third Person of the Trinity. This, too, will be discussed in a later chapter. The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. God reveals Himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity includes three truths of faith. First, the Trinity is One. We do not speak of three gods but of one God. Each of the Persons is fully God. They are a unity of Persons in one divine nature. Second, the Divine Persons are distinct from each other. Father, Son, and Spirit are not three appearances or modes of God, but three identifiable persons, each fully God in a way distinct from the others. Third, the Divine Persons are in relation to each other. The distinction of each is understood only in reference to the others. The Father cannot be the Father without the Son, nor can the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and the Son who both send Him forth. All Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Trinity illuminates all the other mysteries of faith.

RECEIVING COMMUNION Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand. Anyone receiving on the tongue please wait until all have received and then go to the end of the line of the priest distributing Communion. Anyone requesting a **low gluten host**, please see the celebrant priest before Mass begins. When ready to receive, go to the end of the line of the celebrant priest.

Whoever wants to take Communion from Mass to **homebound family members**, must ask the priest before Mass begins, and present him with your pyx. After Mass, you may come to the priest and receive the pyx with the Host. Hosts for others will not be distributed during Mass. You **must** get the host either before or after Mass from the priest

Collection Baskets are at the main doors of the Church to drop your envelopes and contributions. You can also give them to an usher as you exit the Church. There is a secure drop box in the foyer of the parish office for contributions, and correspondence. We also recommend Online Giving, visit our website for easy signup information. Until further notice, ushers will pass the baskets during Mass only once, at which time you can put both the main weekly contribution and any other second collection envelopes. Thank you.



Sponsorship Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.



Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

Children of parishioners over 21 years of age should register independently.


