

### **How did we get the Hebrew Bible? (Old Testament) ?**

There is a lot of interest today about the role of scribes in the making of the final version of the Hebrew Bible. It seems they were sometimes more than copyists. The article attached a summary of a new book which investigates the role of Scribes. It is interesting enough that I am going to try to understand the author's perspective. **"Why the Bible Began: An Alternative History of Scripture and its Origins"** and author Jacob L. Wright. November 3, 2023 By Yonat Shimron

(RNS) — Studying the Bible from a historic and critical lens is a longstanding project dating back to the 18th century. As new archaeological evidence comes to light, that project of better understanding the ancient world and its most influential text keeps evolving.

Jacob L. Wright, a professor of Hebrew Bible at the Candler School of Theology at Emory University, has now written a book that takes all the latest findings to help illustrate how the Hebrew Bible came together — and critically, why.

In “Why the Bible Began,” he concludes that successive expulsions and exiles — first the Assyrians, then the Babylonians, the Persians, and later the Greeks and Romans — forced the ancient scribes to forge from their defeats a new identity as a people.

Beginning around the destruction of the first Jerusalem temple in 586 B.C., elite scribes took some older writings from two traditions he identifies as the “Palace History” of Kings Saul, David and Solomon, and the “People’s History” of the patriarchs (Abraham, Isaac, Jacob) and later Moses — a tradition completely indifferent to the monarchy — and stitched them together.

In doing so, they reunited the memories of the divided kingdoms of Judah to the south and Israel to the north into a single people with a shared history.

This project of composing, recomposing, redacting and merging the biblical corpus gave a previously divided and defeated peoples a vision of a reimagined past and a possible shared future.

### **AN ACT OF GOD - A reflection for June 23, The Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

It was an “*act of God*”. We may assume these words refer to a dramatic act of God in human history, for example, the Chosen People being brought out of slavery in Egypt. But an “act of God”. is also a term used in the insurance industry. It refers to an unavoidable catastrophe beyond human control such as an earthquake, a hurricane, or some other severe natural disaster. In Sunday’s Gospel, the disciples of Jesus encounter an “act of God” as they attempt to sail across the Sea of Galilee. “A violent squall” comes up and threatens to sink their boat. In fear of their lives, they call upon Jesus who commands the storm to cease.

We can approach Sunday’s Gospel in a figurative way. We can see it as a reminder that Jesus is with us when “violent squalls,” such as the death of a family member, the loss of a job, or a diagnosis of cancer disrupts our lives and threatens to plunge us into a sea of despair. But perhaps that Gospel reading, might be taken in a more literal way. It might have something to say about the “acts of God” referenced by insurance companies. Recently, there seems to be an increasing number of such “acts of God.” We hear reports of destructive tornados, floods, blizzards, hurricanes, wildfires, heat waves, etc.

Of course, we do not believe that God is the reason for such disasters. If God were the cause, Jesus would not have gone against the will of God by calming the storm on the sea. However, such so called “acts of God” can remind us that we are powerless before the forces of nature, that human life is fragile and can end unexpectedly, that physical possessions can be destroyed in moments but spiritual possessions like faith, hope, and love can endure. “Acts of God” can remind us of our dependence upon the Lord, the One who can ultimately bring us safely to shore.

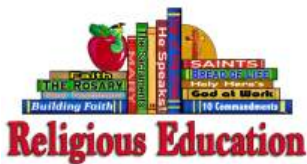
