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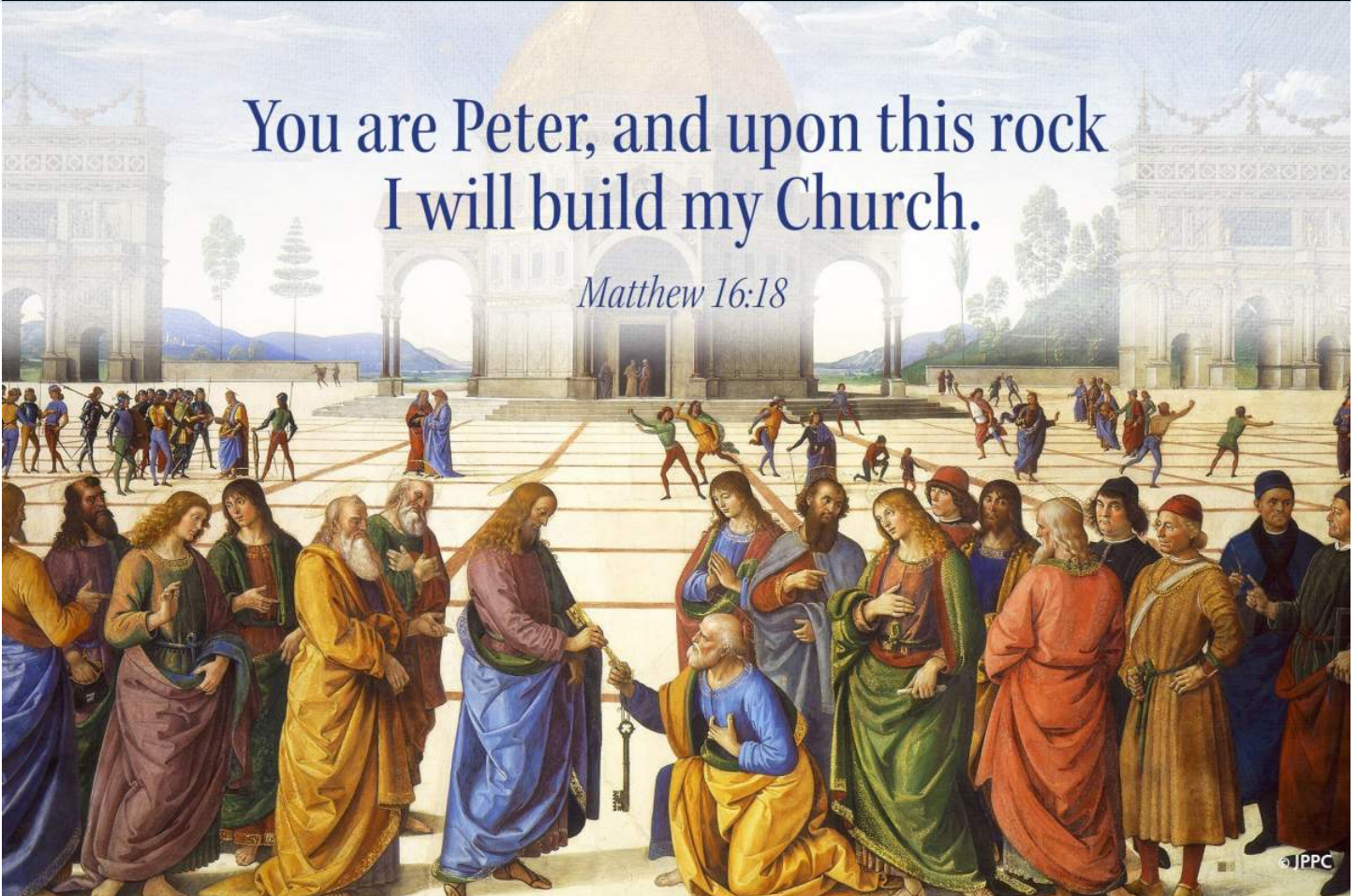

From the Desk of Fr. Joe:

The missionary travels and stories of the Apostles of Jesus and how they died

The missionary journeys of the Apostles of Jesus, and their subsequent deaths, are pivotal in Christian history, signifying their commitment to spreading the Gospel.

Missionary Journeys and Accounts

- **The Great Commission:** After Jesus' death and resurrection, He instructed the apostles to *"go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them... and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you"*. This commission was the foundation for their missionary efforts, which involved extensive travel to spread the Gospel and establish churches.
- **Apostle Paul's Journeys:** Paul, originally known as Saul, played a key role in the expansion of Christianity, particularly to the Gentiles. He undertook numerous missionary journeys throughout the Roman Empire, establishing churches and writing epistles to guide them.
- **Other Apostles:** Information about apostles besides Peter and Paul is often derived from later traditions. These traditions describe the apostles traveling to various regions, including:
 - Matthew in Ethiopia
 - Mark in Egypt
 - Thomas in India
 - Bartholomew in Armenia

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Deaths of the Apostles

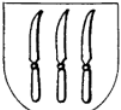
Martyrdom: Christian tradition suggests that most of the Apostles, except John, were martyred for their faith. Their willingness to suffer and die for their belief in Jesus' resurrection is often cited as evidence of their sincere conviction.

Specific Deaths:

- **James the Greater (son of Zebedee):** The first apostle to be martyred, killed by King Herod Agrippa I. In Catholic tradition, Saint James the Greater is symbolized by the scallop shell, the pilgrim's staff, and the Cross of St. James.
- **Peter:** Traditionally crucified upside down in Rome during the reign of Nero, as he felt unworthy to die in the same manner as Jesus. Inverted cross and keys are the symbol of Saint Peter.
- **Paul:** Beheaded in Rome, possibly around the same time as Peter. St. Paul is often symbolized by a sword and a book or scroll.
- **John:** The only apostle believed to have died of natural causes, having survived persecution and later served as Bishop of Edessa. A winged eagle, the creature that dwells closest to heaven, symbolises St John, because of his visions and the heavenly opening of his Gospel.

- **Judas Iscariot:** The betrayer of Jesus, who died by suicide. The specific details of his death are described differently in Matthew and Acts. His symbol is thirty pieces of silver.

Other Apostles: The deaths of other apostles are described as follows:

- **Matthew:** Died in Ethiopia by sword wound. He is symbolized by a winged man or angel.
- **Mark:** Dragged through the streets of Alexandria, Egypt, until his demise. He is symbolized by a winged lion.
- **Luke:** Hanged in Greece. His symbol is a winged ox or bull.
- **James the Just, James the Less, Brother of the Lord (leader of the church in Jerusalem):** Thrown from the Temple pinnacle and beaten to death. A saw is used as a symbol.
- **Bartholomew:** Martyred in Armenia, possibly by being flayed alive.
- **Andrew:** Crucified on an X-shaped cross in Greece.
- **Thomas:** Stabbed with a spear in India.
- **Jude:** Killed with arrows for refusing to renounce his faith.
- **Matthias:** Stoned and beheaded.

Note: These accounts are commonly accepted in Christian tradition. However, many rely on later historical sources and legends, and specific details may vary.

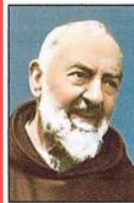

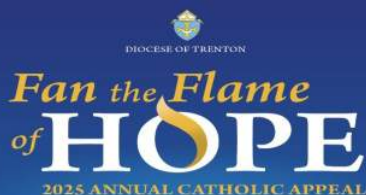
St. Francis Food Pantry in Seaside Heights is open Wednesdays from 10am until 12 noon.

SECOND AND THIRD *A reflection for June 29*

Who are the three most significant saints in the Catholic Church?

Without a doubt, the first among the saints would be the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of the Lord. Her significance is readily apparent. Thousands of church buildings throughout the world are named in her honor. We celebrate several feasts throughout the liturgical year that highlight moments in her life, such as the Immaculate Conception, the Annunciation, the Visitation, and the Assumption. Each time we say the Hail Mary or pray the Rosary, we bring Mary to mind and call upon her intercession.

If there is any question about who would be second and third on the list of significant saints, that doubt is removed by this Sunday's Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul.

In the apostle Peter, we have someone who went from being Simon the fisherman, the son of Jonah and the brother of Andrew, to being summoned by Jesus to follow him. As we hear in Sunday's Gospel ([Matthew 16:13-19](#)), Peter was the first disciple who recognized that his teacher was "the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Peter was also the one chosen by Jesus to be the rock on which he would build his Church. Even when Peter denied Jesus just hours after sharing the Last Supper, Jesus did not revoke his choice of Peter. After his Resurrection, the Risen Lord challenged Peter to reaffirm his love, and he commanded him to feed and care for the sheep of his Church.

Peter's critical role continues to this very day. Just recently, Pope Leo XIV became the latest chosen to fill the shoes of the fisherman from Galilee, to hold the keys to the kingdom of heaven, and to make decisions with heavenly consequences.

In Paul, the other apostle honored this Sunday, we have a man who went from being a fierce persecutor of Christians to being the greatest preacher of the Gospel.

On his way to Damascus to arrest the followers of Christ, Saul encountered the Risen Lord who opened his eyes to the truth of the Gospel and radically transformed his life. Saul, who had been hunting down the followers of Jesus and doing all in his power to put an end to this "Christian heresy" became Paul, the one who would preach the message of Jesus to Jews and Gentiles throughout much of the Roman Empire.

Paul preached the Gospel through his words, by the example of his life, and by his many letters to various Christian communities. As we listen to his letters that continue to be read at Mass, we hear the voice of Paul preaching to us.

As Paul himself tells us in Sunday's Second Reading (2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-8), "The Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the proclamation might be completed and all the Gentiles might hear it."

The honored place that Peter and Paul hold in the Church is beautifully summarized in the Preface of Sunday's Mass. "The blessed Apostles Peter and Paul bring us joy: Peter, foremost in confessing the faith, Paul, its outstanding preacher, Peter, who established the early Church from the remnant of Israel, Paul, master and teacher of the Gentiles."

After the Blessed Mother, the greatest saints of the Church are the two we remember this Sunday.

Saint Peter and Saint Paul pray for us that by our words and example we may lead others to Jesus, the way, the truth, and the life!

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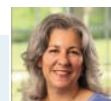
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
