From the Desk of Fr. Joe:



Dear Parishioners,

I'd like to take the time to thank you for filling out the Survey that was in the bulletin a few weeks ago. I appreciate your feedback to help me decide about the bulletin, mass times, holy days, and confession. Plus, so many of you took the time to write out your feelings on a variety of topics. These will be very useful in planning for next year.

Below is a very brief summary of your replies. We will address some specific concerns in upcoming bulletins throughout the year.

Weekend Mass Times

- Most people seem to like the current Mass times
- Several from St. Pio and Sacred Heart would like the evening Mass to stay at 4:00 PM all year round
- People like the early morning Sunday Mass. They want the Mass without music

Holy Day Mass Times

- Some said there needs to be an evening Mass for working people at 5:00pm, or 6:00pm, or 7:00pm
- A couple of people suggested that weekday Masses be earlier, so working people could attend, especially at Sacred Heart

Confessions

- A few said they regularly go to confession
- Several said they never sin
- Some believe that all sins are forgiven at Mass
- One person said they didn't go because of the priest scandal
- One wanted general confession – *NOTE: They are forbidden by our Bishop*
- One person said they did not believe in confession to a priest
- A few want the priests to use the confessional, not face to face

Other Comments

- 1 person wanted to get rid of Fr. Joe
- Several are upset when Fr. Joy sings at the early morning Masses
- Several people feel the prayers of the faithful are too political
- A few people at St. Pio complained that the music is played too slowly, and a few wanted more contemporary hymns
- A few actually expressed gratitude for our priests and ministries

Actions that I am considering: (please note these are not officially changed YET, I am considering these actions).

- Weekday Mass times will stay at both parishes at 8:30am, however we may change one mass at Sacred Heart to an earlier time to accommodate working folks who want to attend Daily Mass. Watch the bulletin for when we make this change.
- Weekend Sunday Vigil Mass will be at 5:00 PM in July & August and 4:00pm the rest of the year at both parishes
- Weekend Sunday Mass schedule at Sacred Heart will change to 7:15am, 9:00am, and 10:30am
- Holy Day Masses at Sacred Heart will be at 8:30 AM and 7:00 PM on the day of the feast
- Holy Day Masses at St. Pio will be at 10:00 AM and 7:00 PM main Church, on the day of the feast
- Confessions will be Saturdays 40 minutes before the vigil mass at both parishes - using the confessionals!

Change in Progress

- We will keep printing the weekly bulletin. The bulletin is printed at NO COST to the parishes, it is funded entirely by the ads at the end. We encourage you to patronize our advertisers when you can.
- We will change the bulletin to a larger size type, and begin to incorporate some of the suggestions made about organization and readability. Watch it evolve in the next few weeks. We also will put the more detailed information on our website, so that if something piques your interest in the printed bulletin, you can look to the website for more info or directly call the person running the event.

Again, thank you for your input. Remember, these were only a very brief summary of your replies. I will be addressing some specific concerns in upcoming bulletins throughout the year and you will be notified well in advance of changes to schedules if and when they are made.

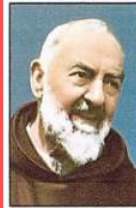

St Peter in Acts implores the people to repent. Jesus, upon entering Galilee, proclaimed the Kingdom of God and said "repent and believe in the Gospel". But what does repent mean.

Repent and repentance come from the Hebrew word *nacham* to turn around and the Greek word *metanoia* meaning to change the mind. We must reject our sins and at the same time turn around to face and fully accept Our Lord Jesus Christ. So turn your back on sin, especially abortion, and faithfully, lovingly embrace Jesus and live a full life.

Do you know that National Right to Life praises the current administration for the work it has done on behalf of life in its first 100 days.

STILL WORKING *A reflection for June 8*

A booming sound like a driving wind catches the attention of the people of Jerusalem.

Flaming tongues of fire appear and come down upon each of the disciples.

These followers of Jesus then go forth and boldly proclaim the mighty works of God in words that everyone can understand.

There was no mistaking the presence and power of the Holy Spirit on that day, the first Pentecost Sunday.

The Holy Spirit would continue to work in those first disciples. It would help them to more fully understand the Gospel, begin to form them as the Church, and empower them with the gifts needed to carry on the mission of the Risen Lord.

Today, we might wonder if the power of the Spirit has diminished during the past 2,000 years. The amazing signs of the Spirit that astonished the people of Jerusalem that first Pentecost are no longer seen.

But if we look, there still are strong signs that indicate the power and action of the Holy Spirit, signs perhaps even more amazing than those recorded in Sunday's First Reading (Acts 2:1-11).

We witnessed the power of the Holy Spirit this past month when the Cardinals of the Church gathered to choose the successor to Pope Francis. Cardinal Prevost was not the expected choice, and the announcement that an American had been elected Pope left Catholics, and the world, as astonished as the people of Jerusalem were on that first Pentecost Sunday. Pope Leo XIV was a surprise of the Spirit.

We can also see the Holy Spirit, who worked in the Apostles, working in the lives of other contemporary people to build up the Church and hasten the coming of God's kingdom.

For example, Pope St. John Paul II traveled the world, courageously preached the Gospel, confronted a culture of death, and hastened the fall of Communism.

St. Teresa of Calcutta, Mother Teresa, founded a religious order to serve the poor, won the admiration of millions for her selfless service, won the Nobel Peace Prize for her ministry to suffering humanity, and challenged the rich and comfortable to see and serve those ignored by society.

Some sixty years ago, the power of the Holy Spirit was evident when over 2,000 bishops of the Church


gathered for the Second Vatican Council. This Spirit-led gathering renewed the life and liturgy of the Catholic Church in ways that continue to impact us to this very day. No one could have predicted the results that would come from this gathering, but the Spirit of God moves as it chooses.

Each time we gather for Mass, we see the wondrous power of the Holy Spirit in action as the priest prays, "Therefore O Lord, we humbly implore you by the same Spirit graciously make holy these gifts we have brought you for consecration, that they may become the Body and the Blood of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ" (Eucharistic Prayer III). The Spirit changes ordinary things into something extraordinary—the very presence of God.

We believe that this same transforming, powerful presence of the Holy Spirit has also come down upon us through our Baptism and Confirmation. That Spirit can inspire us to do good, to think of others, and to turn from sin. It can fire us up to share our faith and motivate us to use our talents for the benefit of our neighbor and for the sake of the Church.

The Spirit that dramatically came down upon the disciples that First Pentecost Sunday is still powerfully working in the Church and in our lives. Come Holy Spirit, open our eyes to your presence!

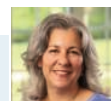
