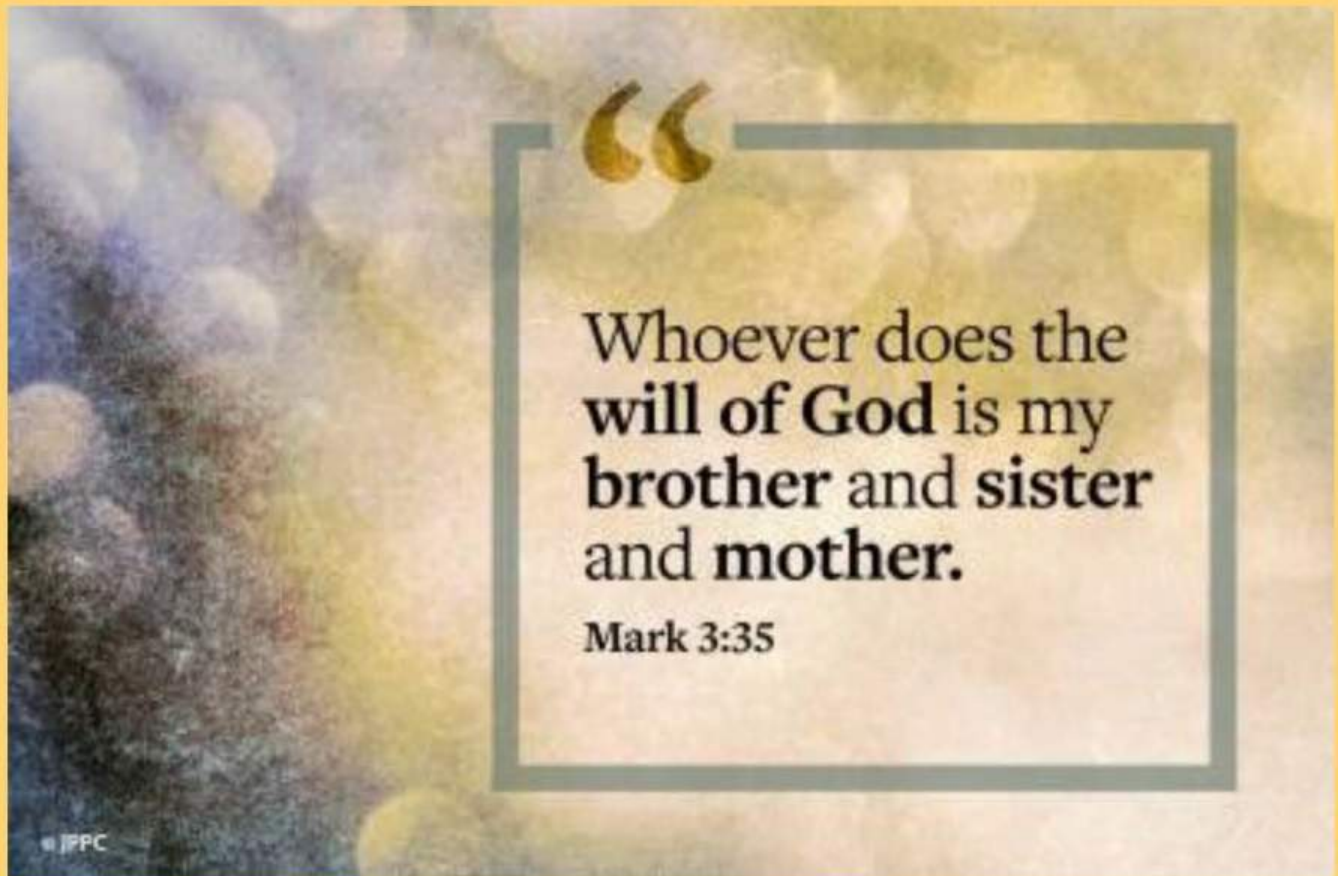

Binding the Strong Man

In today's Gospel Jesus has just been healing and casting out demons in Galilee. Along with the crowds, who flock to Him so that He can't even take a break to eat, come people who do not understand what He is doing. Even His friends think He has lost His mind and needs to be taken away for a while. But the scribes who came down from Jerusalem are not just honestly mistaken; they accuse Him of being possessed by the prince of demons.

The reality is just the opposite. Jesus is revealing Himself as the one promised in our first reading. He is the seed of the woman who has come to crush the head of the demonic serpent. In the parable of the strong man, Jesus reveals that He has come not just to punish the devil but to free those bound by him. As St. Bede explains, "The Lord has also bound the strong man, that is, the devil: which means, He has restrained him from seducing the elect, and entering into his house, the world; He has spoiled his house, and His goods, that is men, because He has snatched them from the snares of the devil, and has united them to His Church."

The scribes blaspheme by attributing this work of the Holy Spirit to demons. Jesus adds a statement that shocks us at first: "whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness." That does not mean that there are any limits to the mercy of God (CCC 1864). Rather, the only sin that cannot be forgiven is the deliberate refusal to accept the mercy offered through the Holy Spirit.

Instead, we must imitate those who sat at Jesus' feet. For, as He said, "Whoever does the will of God is my brother, and sister, and mother."

THREE POSITIVE WORDS

The Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Self-discipline, perseverance, and personal responsibility are the positive virtues highlighted in the recent book, *War on Virtue*, by Bill Donohue. People with self-discipline can control their impulses, feelings, and behavior. People with perseverance continue to work at something despite difficulty or opposition. People with a sense of personal responsibility hold themselves accountable.

In Sunday's First Reading (Genesis 3:9-15), we see how Adam and Eve failed in these vital virtues. When confronted by the temptation to become like God, they showed no self-control. They allowed themselves to be swayed by the evil forces embodied in the serpent.

When God came looking for them in the Garden, they hid. Adam and Eve were no longer comfortable in God's presence since they had not persevered in being obedient children of God. When God confronted them with their disobedience, Adam and Eve took no personal responsibility. Adam blamed his wife, and she blamed the serpent. But God rejected their excuses, held them accountable, and banished them from the garden of Eden. The virtues that Adam and Eve failed to keep are also a challenge for us.

Today, there seems to be an absence of self-discipline. People often allow themselves to be negatively influenced by social media and a self-centered culture. They engage in behaviors that harm their physical or mental health and destroy their relationships. There appears to be a shortage of perseverance. If people encounter anything that requires effort or sacrifice, they quickly give up. They look for immediate gratification and avoid any long-term commitment of time or energy. And there is an evident refusal to accept personal responsibility. Individuals blame others for their bad actions, or they view themselves as victims of the "-isms" of society. We might conclude that the inability of Adam and Eve to act with self-discipline, perseverance, and personal responsibility has been passed down to us. We might call it an effect of their original sin.

However, we are not bound to follow their example. In the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, the Lord has given us the power to live virtuous and holy lives. The Lord has given us the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit offers us the knowledge to recognize what is in keeping with God's will and what choices may lead us away from the Lord. The Spirit blesses us with the fortitude to remain strong in our desire to do what is right, to follow the Gospel, and to resist temptation. The Spirit gives us the wisdom and understanding to know ourselves and to appreciate that the mercy of God is always there, no matter our failures. We live in a society that seems to devalue self-discipline, perseverance, and personal responsibility. But with the help of the Holy Spirit, we can be victorious in this seeming "War on Virtue."

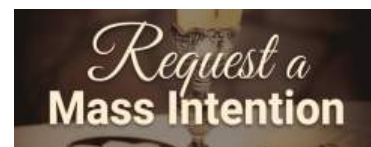
PROMISE TO PROTECT, PLEDGE TO HEAL, SECRETARIAT OF CHILD AND YOUTH PROTECTION

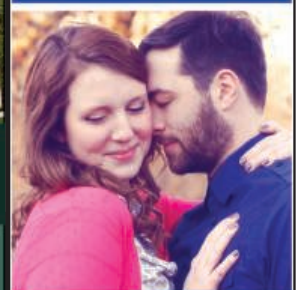

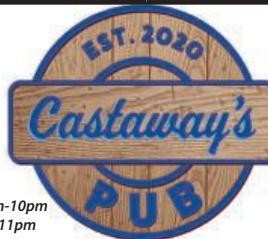
