



## THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

### WOMEN AT THE CROSS:

#### Why Jesus' female followers Hold a Powerful Role in Salvation History

The women at the Cross are so important to salvation history that Mark's Gospel is not the only one to highlight the presence of Jesus' faithful female followers. All four Gospels, as well as the Stations of the Cross emphasize the presence of women during Jesus' crucifixion, burial, and resurrection because the existence of these women matter-they were the primary witnesses of these events. While we know little of their personal lives, their actions speak volumes about their fidelity.

**Salome:** The Gospels of Matthew and Mark list Salome as a witness at the Cross, but they give her different titles. Mark calls her by her name, Salome (Mark 15:40-41), and Matthew calls her "the mother of the sons of Zebedee." (Matthew 27:56). This makes Salome the wife of Zebedee and the mother of the apostles James and John-as in John, the only apostle present at the Cross. It also makes Salome the bold mother who asked Jesus to command her sons to sit at his right and his left in His kingdom.

**Mary Magdalene:** All four Gospels mention the presence of Mary Magdalene during Jesus' final hours. This Mary clearly plays a leading role as a female follower as she is the first person Jesus appears to after His resurrection (Mark 16-9, John 20:11-18). Mary Magdalene's relationship with Jesus goes back to Galilee when he cast out seven demons from her (Luke 8:2). While she is not mentioned again until the cross, Luke makes it clear that from the time of her healing, Mary Magdalene, along with a handful of other women, traveled with Jesus and his twelve apostles.

**Mary, the Mother of God:** Mary is the most prominent woman in the Gospels. She was with her Son from the moment of his conception (Luke 1:26-38) to His very last breath (John 19:25-27). In between we encounter her at her visitation to her cousin Elizabeth (Luke 1:39-56), at Jesus' birth in Bethlehem (Luke 2:1-20, Matthew 1:18-23), at Jesus' presentation at the temple (Luke 2:22-39), at His finding in the temple (Luke 2:41-52), at the wedding at Cana (John 2:1-12) and more.

**Veronica:** Veronica, who wiped the face of Jesus as he carried His cross, is not noted in any of the Gospel account. However, her story is memorialized as the 6th Station of the Cross. Tradition holds that Veronica was the hemorrhaging woman healed by touching the hem of Jesus' garment (Matthew 9:20-22). This event happened right after Jesus called Matthew which tells us that Veronica's first encounter with Jesus took place in Galilee during the early days of His public ministry.

**Mary, the Mother of James and Joses:** the Gospel of Mark introduced her sons when Jesus was visiting Nazareth. In the scene, Mark refers to James and Joseph as Jesus' brothers (Mark 6:3). However, the Greek word for "brother", adelphos was used for siblings, cousins and other blood relative. Scholars believe this Mary and her two sons were relatives of Jesus.

**Joanna:** the final witness named in the Gospel is Joanna. While Luke only records her presence, it is likely she would have witnessed Jesus' death and burial. Twice in his Passion account, Luke refers to "the women who had followed Him from Galilee" (Luke 23:49,55). Luke 8:2-3 tells us that in Galilee Jesus cured Joanna, and like Mary Magdalene, after that moment, she followed Him.

**Why do these women matter?** When all others abandoned Jesus, the presence of His faithful female disciples would have been the primary source of support extended to Him during His Passion, despite the danger to them. They were there for Him despite the emotional agony it must have caused them. They were there because they loved Him.

**Padre Pio Prayer Anthology**

Our first parish prayer anthology will include many types of prayers. We will begin our collection with prayers that you can use to develop a relationship with God that is more personal and intimate.

**Prayer #35: Focus Point:**

How wonderful it must have been to have lived in Jesus's time and been able to have seen first hand the kindness and mercy that He showed to others! Imagine the joy and inspiration that those individuals felt having met Jesus in person! That love and inspiration has been passed down through the generations, and grown exponentially! Look at how so many of us respond in times of crises. We model Christ's earthly behavior, as we sacrifice to help others that are helplessly suffering. But not ALL of us do. Many act selfishly, and even worse, many are the CAUSE of the needless suffering of others! Is it within our power to try to remedy this situation? How can we effectively change the hearts of others to make the world a better place? Fr. ## *Sponsorship Certificates Letters of Eligibility*

*Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).*

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


