



Compiled by Sacred Heart parishioner William J. "Duff" Duffy who ensures that our nation's Fallen Heroes are remembered.

Bloom, Harry S., age 29, U.S. Army, Sergeant, 1st Battalion, 22nd Infantry, 4th Infantry Division. Bloom died on 28 August 1944 when he was Killed in Action, in France, while combatting hostile enemy German forces during World War II. Bloom is interred at the Epinal American Cemetery, France, and was survived by his parents, Peter and Emily, brothers, Theodore, John, and Peter Jr., and sister, Emily.



Gavio, Martin J., age 25, U.S. Army, 32nd Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division. Gavio died on 15 February 1952 from wounds Received in Action, in Korea, after combatting hostile enemy Chinese/North Korean forces during the Korean War. Gavio is interred at St. Catharine's Cemetery, Sea Girt, NJ, and was survived by his parents, Philip and Ophelia, and sister, Patricia.




Kurmin, Adolph, age 24, U.S. Army, Company M, 315th Infantry Regiment, 79th Infantry Division. Kurmin died on 26 September 1918 when he was Killed in Action, in France, while combatting hostile enemy German forces, during World War I. Kurmin is interred overseas at the Meuse-Argonne American Cemetery, France, and was survived by his parents, David and Lydia, brother, Robert, and sisters, Bertha and Tillie.



Osborn, Isaac J., age 21, U.S. Navy, PBY Catalina Pilot, Patrol Squadron #34. Osborn died on 10 March 1944 while a POW of the Japanese Army, when he was escorted out of camp, with other POWs, he was blindfolded, handcuffed, and never seen again. To this day his classification is "executed/missing in action". Osborn was survived by his parents, Isaac and Margaret, brother, Austin, and sisters, Esther and Margaret.



Pollin, George J., age 25, U.S. Air Force, 366th Tactical Fighter Wing, 7th Air Force. Pollin died on 29 April 1967 when he was Killed in Action while co-piloting an F-4C Phantom and was shot down over North Vietnam during the Vietnam War. Originally classified as Missing in Action, his remains were repatriated in January of 1991. Pollin is interred at the Arlington National Cemetery, Va., and was survived by his fiancé, Sue Johnson, parents, George and Ann Marie, brother, Lawrence, and sister, Barbara.



Skinner, Donald A., age 22, U.S. Army, Company C, 4th Battery, 31st Infantry, 196th Infantry Brigade. Skinner died on 23 May 1967 when he was Killed in Action while combatting hostile enemy Vietnamese forces during the Vietnam War. Skinner is interred at St. Joseph's Cemetery, Toms River, NJ, and was survived by his parents, Nathaniel and Betty, sisters, Patricia and Betty Lou, and brothers, Michael, William, Skip, Kevin and Jerry.

"For with God nothing shall be impossible"
Luke 1:37

Here in the US, we are overcoming the struggles and effects of Covid, or some maybe still experiencing the struggle and hoping for the better. The fact that we are here, protected and saved from the menace of this virus because of God's grace and mercy. He has plans for us to reach out to His afflicted people, be His hands and feet, and be His heart full of love and goodness..... Sponsorship Certificates Letters of Eligibility

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.
