Over the next 2 weeks I will be explaining the prayer I often pray out loud at Mass as a Communion Meditation. The prayer is below. I hope you enjoy praying this prayer as much as I do.

The Unity prayer of the “Flame of Love” A beautiful prayer of Thanksgiving after receiving Holy Communion

*My adored Jesus,
May our feet journey together
May our hands gather in unity
May our hearts beat in unison
May our souls be in harmony
May our thoughts be as one
May our ears listen to the silence together
May our glances profoundly penetrate each other
And may our lips pray together,
to gain mercy from the eternal Father.
Amen*

*Immaculate Mary, Mother of Jesus
spread the effect of grace of your
flame of Love (Jesus)
over all of humanity
now and forever.*



The purpose of this prayer is to unite our whole being, every part of it, with that of Jesus, and allowing him to transform us into His eternal self-giving life, death and resurrection, for our salvation and the salvation of everyone living in the world. Everywhere we go, we are to exhibit that burning, welcoming love of Jesus to others. It reminds me of one of the “secret” prayers of the Mass that I often audibly pray when mixing the water with the wine. That prayer is:

**By the mingling of this water and wine,
may we come to share in the divinity of Christ,
who humbled Himself to share in our humanity.**

It is the recognition that we are called to share (in some small, mystical way), in the Divinity of Christ. We are to become that flame of love, Jesus Christ!

IN DESPERATE SITUATIONS A reflection for November 10

Today, our scripture readings tell us about two widows, each in a terrible situation. One widow was on the threshold of starvation, and the other on the verge of absolute poverty.

In our First Reading, we learn about a widow in the city of Zarephath. The land was in the grip of a severe drought, food was scarce, and hunger was everywhere. That widow and her son had only enough food for a final meal, after which they would wait for hunger to take their lives.

In our Gospel, we hear of a poor, lonely widow who came to the Temple in Jerusalem. There she deposited her last two coins into the Temple treasury. Without money, and without family, that widow would become just another beggar on the streets of Jerusalem.

The first widow experienced a radical change in her situation when she encountered the Prophet Elijah. He asked her for water to drink and then requested that she bake him a little cake with her remaining flour and oil. Elijah told her that God had promised that her supply of food would last until the famine was over. Amazingly that widow, her son, and Elijah were able to eat for an entire year for “the jar of flour did not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry.”

However, we might wonder what happened to the second widow. We are told that Jesus had been observing “how the crowd put money into the treasury” when he noticed the widow. Jesus must have been aware of her financial situation for he told his disciples, “This poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood.”

Knowing that, Jesus must have acted. The one who gave sight to the blind, opened the ears of the deaf, enabled the lame to walk, fed the hungry crowds, healed the sick, raised the dead, and proclaimed the coming of God’s Kingdom, would not simply have used that poor widow as an object lesson and watched as she blended back into the crowd, penniless and alone.

Perhaps, Jesus invited that widow to join the group of women who were among his followers. Perhaps, he instructed one of his disciples to provide for her from their common purse. Perhaps, he hoped that one of his disciples would invite that widow into his or her family circle. After all, that was something that Jesus would later ask John to do for another widow, namely, Mary, his mother.

This Sunday, we meet two widows in terrible situations who are not unnoticed by the Lord. For as we are told in our Responsorial Psalm, “the fatherless and the widow he sustains, but the way of the wicked he thwarts.”

AED's and where to find them!

An AED, or Automated External Defibrillator, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet **easy-to-use**, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm. Sacred Heart has 2 AED units.



Automated External
Defibrillator

One in the Church (in the Usher's Closet near the front entrance) and one in Casey Hall on the wall nearest the Ladies Room. St. Pio's also has 2 AED units. One in the Church parking lot side on the back wall just before St. Pio's Room and one in the Parish Hall on the back wall (street side). Please familiarize yourself with where these are so they can be retrieved in an emergency.
