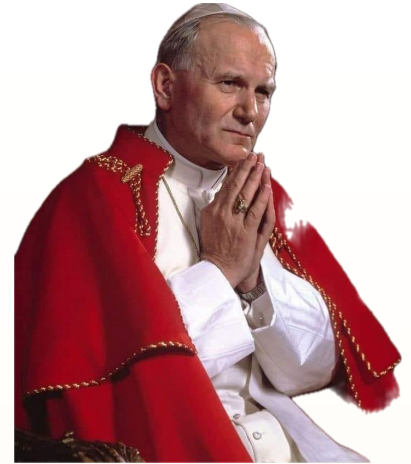

## THE SUNDAY BEFORE ELECTION DAY - A reflection for November 3, The Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

On Tuesday, November 5, this election season will finally end. Voters will have their last opportunity to cast their ballot. During the past months, those seeking elective office have been making speeches, holding campaign rallies, participating in debates, sitting for interviews with the press, and running ads on television, radio, and social media. They have been appearing on talk shows and in TikTok videos, plastering their messages on banners, billboards, and lawn signs, and doing everything possible to persuade their fellow citizens to vote for them.

In their election campaigns, all the candidates, no matter their party, have had the same basic message. They have been telling us all the good things they will do for us if they are elected: they will improve our lives, strengthen our economy, increase our national security, ensure our freedoms, and lead our families to a better tomorrow.

At the same time, these candidates have been warning us that if those running against them are elected, they will do just the opposite: they will damage our society, weaken our economy, limit our freedoms, and take our nation in the wrong direction.

It's interesting that the Gospel for the Sunday before Election Day does not focus our attention on the good things or the bad things that persons running for political office may or may not do.

Instead, the Gospel is about us. In it, Jesus highlights the expectations that God has for those he has elected and chosen to be part of his Church. We are to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength, and we are to love our neighbor as we love ourselves.

Such love of God and love of neighbor is not a matter of warm feelings but rather a matter of letting the Word of God, the example of Jesus, and the needs of our neighbor determine our decisions and actions and how we share the blessings God has given us.

Imagine if the candidates who are running for office embraced the message of this Gospel. Imagine if they told us that if elected, they would make every effort to love God with all their heart, soul, mind, and strength and to love their neighbor as themselves.

Making and keeping such a campaign promise would truly bring about all the good things that candidates continually promise but fail to deliver.

Such a promise would be surprising coming from a candidate, but it is something we have often pledged to do as Christians. May we truly strive to love God and our neighbor. May the great commandment in Sunday's Gospel be more than just another unfulfilled "campaign promise."

## AED's and where to find them!

An AED, or Automated External Defibrillator, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet **easy-to-use**, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm. Sacred Heart has 2 AED units.



Automated External  
Defibrillator

One in the Church (in the Usher's Closet near the front entrance) and one in Casey Hall on the wall nearest the Ladies Room. St. Pio's also has 2 AED units. One in the Church parking lot side on the back wall just before St. Pio's Room and one in the Parish Hall on the back wall (street side). Please familiarize yourself with where these are so they can be retrieved in an emergency.

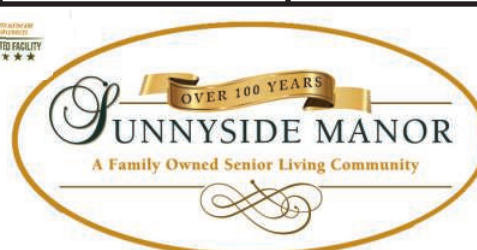
