POPE FRANCIS' STRONGST STATEMENTS AGAINST ABORTION

February 18, 2016: Abortion is ‘against the Hippocratic oath’

“Abortion is not the lesser of two evils. “It is a crime. It is to throw someone out in order to save another. That what the Mafia does. It is a crime, an absolute evil.”

“Abortion is not a theological problem. It is a human problem. It is a medical problem. You kill one person to save another, in the best case scenario...It’s against the Hippocratic oaths doctors must take. It is an evil in and of itself.”

June 18 2015: Care for creation is “incompatible with the justification of abortion”

“Since everything is interrelated, concern for the protection of nature is also incompatible with the justification of abortion.” “How can we genuinely teach the importance of concern for other vulnerable beings, however troublesome or inconvenient they may be, if we fail to protect a human embryo, even when its presence is uncomfortable and creates difficulties?”

Sept. 15, 2021: “Abortion is murder”

“Scientifically it’s a human life. The textbooks teach us that. But is it right to take it out to solve a problem? This is why the Church is so strict on this issue because accepting this is kind of like accepting daily murder.”

September. 25, 2020:

“It is troubling to see how simple and convenient it has become for some to deny the existence of a human life as a solution to problems that can and must be solved for both the mother and her unborn child.”

October 10, 2018:

“How can an action that ends an innocent and defenseless life in its blossoming stage be therapeutic, civilized or simply human? I ask you: Is it right to ‘do away with’ a human life in order to solve a problem? Is it right to hire a hitman in order to solve a problem? One cannot. It is not right to ‘do away with’ a human being, however small, in order to solve a problem. It is life hiring a hitman.”

“Children truly are the family’s greatest treasure and most precious good. Consequently, everyone must be helped to become aware of the intrinsic evil of the crime of abortion. In attacking human life in its very first stages, it is also an aggression against society itself. Politicians and legislators, therefore, as servants of the common good are duty bound to defend the fundamental right to life, the fruit of God’s love.”

September 20, 2013: Every unborn child unjustly aborted has the face of Jesus

“Every child who, rather than being born, is condemned unjustly to being aborted, bears the face of Jesus Christ, bears the face of the Lord, who even before he was born, and then just after birth, experienced the world’s rejection.”

Doctors “ are called to care for human life in its initial stage in all its phases and at any age, human life is always sacred.


Dear Parishioners,

As this election is upon us, there are critical moral issues we are faced with including abortion, I hope you are convinced of the sacredness of a human life developing in it's mother's womb, from conception to birth, as well as the life of all newborn babies. Church teaching, since its' beginning, has taught that abortion is a grave moral sin. Certainly, at later stages of development, it approaches and can be considered murder, as Pope Francis has stated.

That abortion is a grave evil has been a firm conviction of the Church since the first century. Every recent pope, including Paul VI, John Paul II, Benedict XVI, and Pope Francis as you can see from these excerpts from articles demonstrate.

There are also other critical LIFE issues including: erroneous teachings on human sexuality and sexual activity among minors that are being pushed and promoted by some politicians, as well as a diminishment of parental rights in raising their children.

10 Weeks Gestational Age



This drawing shows the actual size of the fetus at 10 weeks. The fetus is now about 1 1/2 inches long and weighs almost 1/2 ounce.




- During this period the embryo reaches a transition point. It is now called a fetus, a Latin word meaning young one or offspring.
- The head is about half the size of the fetus and the tail has disappeared.
- The fetus now has a distinct human appearance.
- Arms, legs, fingers and toes are distinctly visible.
- The first real bone cells begin to replace the cartilage.
- Eyelids are formed.

We need to be vigilant about this and a whole host of moral issues, euthanasia, eugenics, border security, human sex trafficking as we go to the polls to vote this week.

12 Weeks Gestational Age



This drawing shows the actual size of the fetus at 12 weeks. The fetus is about 2 1/2 inches long and weighs about 1 ounce.

- The eyelids fuse together.
- Fingernails are developing.
- Between 10 and 12 weeks, the fetus begins small, random movements that are too slight to be felt by the mother.
- The fetal heartbeat can be detected electronically.
- All major body organs are formed although they are not able to function outside of the uterus. The rest of the pregnancy is needed to allow these organs to grow and mature.

Receiving Communion:

- Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand. Those wishing to receive Communion on the tongue should wait until the end of the Communion distribution and receive from the Priest.
- Only Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion with a valid Sacred Heart/St. Pio ID card can receive Communion in a Pyx to take to the sick and home-bound. For anyone that is not a Eucharistic Minister and is requesting a Host needs to see the Priest before or after Mass. Hosts will not be distributed during Mass.
- If you need a low gluten Host, please go to the Communion line in the front on the pulpit side, and ask the Eucharistic Minister.

Sponsorship Certificates Letters of Eligibility

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

GOD OF LOVE AND LIFE FATHER, SON and HOLY SPIRIT



Padre Pio Prayer Anthology

Prayer #41: Focus Point: Life's events challenge us time and time again. Difficult moments are not punishments from God. God is the source of goodness, not the source of evil. Natural disasters, terminal illnesses, and many other major problems can occur randomly through no fault of our own. We also can create our own dilemmas through a lack of good judgment. These are our crosses. They come to us through the imperfection of our world, and our own imperfections. They are not always easy to shake off, because they can overwhelm our thoughts! In Msgr.Phil's words, "The only effective way to deal with your cross is to carry it, to consent to it. At times the cross is a heavy burden, but Christ will be with us! 
