

Part 5

(continued from October 3rd Bulletin)

Friendship With The Saints Is of Eternal Value

Obviously, given the difficulties and trials we face here below, it is to our spiritual advantage to get to know and make friends with some of the saints. Because in doing so we are dealing with another person, it is necessary to open oneself up to that person through the initiation of a relationship; it is also necessary for that other person to open himself up also to us in some way. Communication must take place. An environment of mutual reception must be established. One person cannot know another in isolation but only through relationship, through communion. Prayer to the saints is simply to communicate, to initiate and foster a relationship. Who would ever try to grow a friendship with another person without ever contacting that person?

The goal of praying to the saints is to establish a friendship of unending and eternal value. It is to strengthen the union of the Church in the Spirit through the exercise of fraternal charity (CCC 957). Within the context of this friendship, our heavenly brothers and sisters in Christ intercede on our behalf that we may attain to the same kind of completeness and happiness they themselves possess. For this to occur, we too must become saints; we too must join in unity with Christ, our Divine King. And that is precisely what our friends dwelling above, the saints, pray for on our behalf.

It is important to remember that no one is born a saint; everyone must be made into a saint by the grace of God and everyone has the potential for that making. To become a saint is a process of transformation in cooperation with God. It begins with faith in Christ and baptism, it continues with a life lived sacramentally in the heart of the Church, strengthened by the Spirit and in union with Christ, the Master and King as his disciple, as another “Christ.” It is a life lived in harmony with God’s plan, not in opposition to it. It’s a life of love and happiness and, not without its sacrifice, a life of carrying one’s cross.

St Francis of Assisi

(from a Franciscan source)

The more you bow low before God, the greater the graces God gives you

When we think of St. Francis of Assisi, we tend to think of a somewhat naive, carefree, happy soul, who was a friend to everyone, and communed with nature, but by his own temperament, that was not the case.

Francis struggled throughout his entire life to grow in humility and love. As a youth he was filled with pride, and desired to be a valiant soldier of fame, and enjoy the luxuries of his family wealth, and accolades from people.

It was only when he recognized the truth of his own nothingness before God, that Francis saw himself as he really was, and that was as the worst of sinners, with many failings and faults. He struggled most of his life to become a true brother to others, even those of his own community. By his own nature, he preferred to live in solitude, going his own way in life, and doing his own thing.

He referred to himself as a worm, or maggot, and it was the truth he came to know and accept. He began to understand that it was only by the grace of God, that he was able to do any good at all. Once he acknowledged this truth, it set him free. He then offered his own woundedness and brokenness to God, and allowed God to slowly transform him, but it was a lifelong process- to the very end.

It was because of this humility, this truthfulness, that God rewarded him with the stigmata, the wounds of Christ. He shifted the focus from himself, to a focus on God. Whatever he saw Jesus doing in the Gospels, is what he wanted to do. He began to see God in the lowest of the low, and the lower he bowed before God, the greater the graces God bestowed on him, transforming Him into the image of His Son.

As we pray for the intercession of St. Francis this week especially, let us pray that God gives us the grace of ever increasing humility in our lives.

Quotes from Francis:

“Keep a clear eye toward life’s end. Do not forget your purpose and destiny as God’s creature. What you are in his sight is what you are and nothing more. Remember that when you leave this earth, you can take nothing that you have received...but only what you have given; a full heart enriched by honest service, love, sacrifice, and courage.”

“No one is to be called an enemy, all are your benefactors, and no one does you harm. You have no enemy except yourselves.”

Pray to St Faustina for the Gift of True Humility

Through the life and writings of St. Faustina we come to know that God is Love and Mercy itself, and that we can know God’s mercy only through humility and trust in God, offering to God our lives, sufferings and sacrifices, united with His on Calvary, for the redemption of the world.

This message is echoed through the lives and writings of many of the saints like St. John of the Cross who said: “To be taken with love for a soul, God does not look on its greatness, but the greatness of its humility.”

In her writings called the Dialogue, God the Father says to Catherine of Sienna: “Do you know daughter, who you are and who I am? If you know these two things you have beatitude in your grasp. You are she who is not, I AM HE WHO IS.”

St. Augustine says: If you should ask me what are the ways of God, I would tell you that the first is humility, the second is humility, and the third is humility. Not that there are no other precepts to give, but if humility does not precede all that we do, our efforts are fruitless.

Humility is that deep realization that we are nothing before God, which elicits in the soul a sense of gratitude and a freedom to be dependent on God; that is to trust in His Mercy. It’s no longer about me. The soul experiences a freedom from self-concern, and begins to focus on the things that are of concern of God. Humility then helps us to become vehicles of God’s Mercy towards all others.

Even our sufferings are no longer about nothing or a waste, but we use them as means of calling down God’s mercy on others, because our sufferings are part of Christ’s sufferings at Calvary, which was done out of God’s own mercy, love and justice.

As Pope St. John Paul II writes: “If one becomes a sharer in the sufferings of Christ, this happens because Christ has opened his suffering to man, because he himself in his redemptive suffering has become, in a certain sense, a sharer in all human sufferings. Man, discovering through faith the redemptive suffering of Christ, also discovers in it his own sufferings; he rediscovers them, through faith, enriched with a new content and new meaning.” The end of St. John Paul II’s own life is an example of his own experience of humility and suffering. As St Faustina said: “Have great confidence; God is always our Father, even when He sends us trials.”

If we are given the grace to truly realize humility and trust, we will be given the grace of true joy in God.

“Act in such a way that all those who come in contact with you will go away joyful. Sow happiness about you because you have received much from God; give, then, generously to others. They should take leave of you with their hearts filled with joy, even if they have no more than touched the hem of your garment.”

Receiving Communion:

- Holy Communion will be distributed in the hand. To receive on the tongue please wait until all have received, go to the end of the line of the priest distributing Communion.
- Anyone needing a **low gluten host**, please get in the communion line in the front, on the pulpit side. Ask the minister for a low gluten Host.
- To take Communion from Mass to **homebound family members**, go to the sacristy **after Mass** with your pyx. Ask the priest/minister to get you a host from the tabernacle. Hosts for others will not be distributed during Mass.

Collection Baskets are at the main doors of the Church or give your envelope to an usher as you exit. There is a secure drop box in the foyer of the parish office for contributions and correspondence. We recommend Online Giving, visit our website for easy signup information.

Sponsorship Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

Godparents and sponsors, together with the parents must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it. (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

A sponsor must:

- be at least 16 years of age.
- have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist & Confirmation.
- if married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.
- attend Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.
- be registered at the Parish of St. Pio of Pietrelcina for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Please note, if you received all your sacraments at St. Pio of Pietrelcina years ago but now live elsewhere, you are a member of the parish in whose territory you reside. This is where the sponsorship certificate must be obtained.
