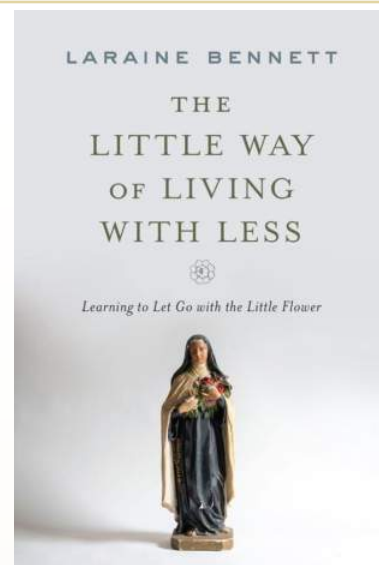

WISE CHOICES - A reflection for October 13, The Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

As Americans, we live in a nation where people have the freedom to make choices. Sometimes these choices are contrary to our Catholic Faith.

For example: People can believe in God, or they can deny God's existence. They can seek to live according to the commandments, or they can ignore them.

People can be faithful to their promises and commitments, or they can break them. They can express their political opinions and ideas, or they can decide to say nothing.

People can accept that they were created male or female, or they can choose to deny that reality. They can welcome the child that results from an act of sexual intimacy, or they can choose to end that child's development in the womb. They can care for the body God gave them, or they can abuse that body with alcohol, drugs, or risky behavior.

In short, people can make choices. The freedom to choose comes with being an American, but more importantly it comes from God. God did not program the humans he created to act only in certain way. God gave us free will.

The first people to use that free will made a choice that negatively affected them and all their descendants. Adam and Eve chose to disobey the command of God. Their original sin started humanity off in the wrong direction.

If we are to use our free will to make choices that benefit us and our world, we need the gift of wisdom. That was the gift that King Solomon prayed for in this Sunday's First Reading, "I pleaded, and the spirit of wisdom came to me. I preferred her to scepter and throne."

The wisdom that Solomon desired has also been granted to us. It is among the gifts given to us at Baptism and given more fully at Confirmation. As the bishop prayed at our Confirmation, "Send upon them, O Lord, the Holy Spirit...give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding."

We come to realize the correct choices to make by reading the scriptures, praying for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and by looking at the life of Jesus, the one who embodies the very Word and Wisdom of God.

If we look at the problems affecting our lives and our society, we will realize they all began with people making bad choices motivated by greed, self-interest, ambition, a thirst for power and control, a wish for revenge, lust, hate, and other evil desires.

If we are to make good choices, we need to seek the wisdom of God. The wise choices we make will help us to grow as God's holy people, increase our freedom, and help the kingdom of God to come into our world.

We need the gift of wisdom to make choices that will be Pro-Good and Pro-God!
