

From: A Catholic's Guide To Halloween

What IS Halloween?

The word “Halloween” comes from All Hallow's Eve. All Hallows Eve is the vigil of All Saints Day — also known as All Hallows Day. The word “hallow” means “holy.” (In the Our Father we pray, “Hallowed be thy name.”)



All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation, and thus a major feast on the Catholic Church's liturgical calendar. All Saints Day honors not only the saints in heaven whom we know by name, but also any saints in heaven whose names are unknown.

Why is Halloween on October 31st?

Pope Gregory III (731–741) transferred the Feast of All Saints from its former day of May 13th to November 1st to coincide with the foundation of a new chapel in St. Peter's Basilica which he dedicated to all the saints in heaven. Halloween is on October 31st because All Saints Day is November 1st. All Souls Day is on November 2nd. These three days taken together are the "Days of the Dead," a triduum of feasts also called Allhallowtide, Hallowtide, or Hallowmas (Hallow meaning saint or holy and mas meaning Mass).

Halloween is, therefore, the first day of Allhallowtide, the time of year when the living (the Church Militant) honor all the dead in Christ: the saints in heaven (the Church Triumphant) as well as all the holy souls detained in purgatory on their way to heaven (the Church Suffering). It is a beautiful celebration of the Communion of Saints!

Pope Gregory IV (827–844) extended the Feast of All Saints—which was previously a local feast in Rome—to the universal Church. That is why the eve of All Saints Day (Halloween) came to be celebrated by Catholics around the world in their own cultural ways. It was customary in historic Catholic Europe to have evening vigils with pious celebrations on the day before a major feast or solemnity; the rhythms of people's lives and culture moved with the liturgical calendar. That's why a vigil was kept the evening before All Saints Day—and why Halloween exists at all.

Even today, Catholics begin celebrating major feasts the evening before the big day. Christmas has Christmas Eve. All Hallows Day has All Hallows Eve.

Why do Catholics celebrate “The Days of the Dead”?

Celebrating these Christian holy days helps remind the faithful of the reality of heaven and hell, the saints and the damned, demons and angels, and the holy souls suffering in purgatory. It reminds us to pray for the souls of the deceased. It is also a reminder that we, too, will one day die, and should always strive to live good and holy lives so that we can be ready to enter eternity and stand before God.

SYMPATHETIC

If we were asked to make a list of adjectives that could apply to Jesus, we might mention the following: good, obedient, generous, prayerful, thoughtful, understanding, merciful, courageous, self-aware, concerned, creative, smart, decisive, inspiring, and influential.

There is another adjective that we might mention after listening to this Sunday's Second Reading (Hebrews 4:14-16): "Sympathetic."

In that reading, we are told that in Jesus "we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin."

Though he was the Divine Son of God, Jesus can sympathize with us because he was also fully human. As such, Jesus can sympathize with the challenges we experience as we live our lives.

Jesus can relate to our moments of temptation, for he was tempted by Satan during his time in the desert after his baptism.

Jesus can understand the injustice we suffer when we endure false accusations or slander. He healed the sick, opened the eyes of the blind, and made the deaf hear, and then was falsely accused of being in league with the devil.

Jesus knows the heartbreak we feel when we are betrayed by people we trusted. In his Passion, he was handed over by Judas, abandoned by his disciples, and denied by Peter.

Jesus recognizes how our faith can be tested when God seems deaf to our prayers and blind to our suffering. On the Cross, Jesus cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Jesus can relate to the sorrow, grief, and tears that overwhelm us when we lose a loved one to death. Jesus experienced such pain when he wept at the tomb of his friend Lazarus.

The God in whom we have placed our faith is not a distant spectator, who dispassionately watches over the people he created. Rather, God took on flesh in Jesus Christ and came among his creatures.

As Saint Paul tells us, "Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross" (Philippians 2:6-8).

Jesus, the incarnate Son of God, can sympathize with us, for he experienced the joys, the pain, the sorrow, and the challenges that come with being human and that test our faith.

As result, we have a God who can sympathize with our human condition, and in turn, we have a God to whom we can relate.





Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion.



Father Pio Mandato, FMHJ, is a Franciscan priest living as a missionary hermit in the Diocese of Scranton, PA. Father Pio was born in Italy. His parents came to Pietrelcina in Southern Italy, the same town as Saint Pio, the famous stigmatist priest, whom they knew very well. Father Pio's mother was a spiritual daughter of Saint Padre Pio. Father Pio received his first holy communion from Saint Pio before coming to the USA. He grew up in New Jersey and entered the Capuchin Franciscans at the age of 17, where he received his Franciscan formation and later his priestly ordination in 1985.






