## **Caution about how you celebrate Halloween**

**Jesus' own words about Satan:**

**“But I will show you whom you should fear:  
Fear him who, after your body has been killed,  
has authority to throw you into hell.  
Yes, I tell you, fear him.” (Luke 12:5)**



As we approach Halloween, there arises fascination and temptation to know about the occult, fortune tellers, tarot cards, ouija boards, satanism and witchcraft. Many people are attracted to these things which seem to be a source of information about the dead and the afterlife, and about magical power.

Halloween has become the second most popular holiday, next to Christmas.

Stores and websites now offer all kinds of products to meet the growing demands associated with this holiday. Christians need to be very cautious as many exorcists of today warn us about these temptations and the dangers of fooling around with them.

**There are only 2 sources of spiritual power that exist, God and satan.**

Scripture warns us that **satan is the father of lies and deceptions** no matter how much they present themselves as something good. Read the story of the temptation of Adam and Eve in the book of Genesis of the Bible, and you will find out. Evil twists and manipulates the truth in a way that it presents itself as a good, at least at first. But once you allow yourself to be influenced or captured by the “dark forces,” you will gradually learn the consequences of participating in these groups and activities. You can easily be enslaved by them. Ask any Catholic priest exorcist! Halloween has become a major holiday for the “dark forces”. Actual witches and satanists are tempting us to fall for their deceptions. Do not toy with this evil, you will be sorry in the long run!

If you fall into these sins of witchcraft, satanism, or playing with the occult, I strongly recommend that you go to confession.

Don't allow your children or grandchildren to be drawn into these things which are portrayed as “fun.” They are not fun, and often lead to depression or cause other spiritual and psychological harm. Focus children's imaginations and creativity on things they desire to be and on who people who are forces of good and heroes of today or yesterday; saints and heroes.

## WHAT DO YOU WANT?

### *A reflection for October 27, The Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Jesus asks a question that may sound familiar since we heard the same question last Sunday. In last week's Gospel, James and John came to Jesus and asked him to do something. Jesus responded, "What do you wish me to do for you?" They replied, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left."

In today's Gospel, Bartimaeus, the blind beggar, cries out, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." Jesus asks him, "What do you want me to do for you?" Bartimaeus responds that he wants to see.

Jesus asks the same question in each Gospel, but his response is different. He refuses the request of James and John. He tells them that greatness in his kingdom comes not through holding positions of power, but rather through being of service to others. However, Jesus grants the request of Bartimaeus. Jesus tells him, "Go your way, your faith has saved you." Immediately, the eyes of Bartimaeus are opened.

The question that Jesus asked James, John, and Bartimaeus is one that we might imagine the Lord asking us when we pray: "What do you want me to do for you?"

When we pray, we lift our hearts to the Lord, and we give him thanks for our blessings. But if we are honest, we often spend more time telling the Lord what we want him to do for us.

For example, we may ask the Lord to bless us with happiness, to show us the purpose and meaning of our life, to heal us of a certain disease, to guide us in dealing with family problems. We may ask the Lord to advance our careers, to help us overcome a particular addiction or sin, to protect us from harm, to show us mercy, to grant us and our loved ones eternal life—our list of requests is endless.

We are more than ready to tell the Lord what we would like him to do for us. As we know, sometimes the Lord answers our requests as he did for Bartimaeus. But sometimes, the Lord seems to refuse to do what we ask, as happened with James and John.

But there is one request that we can make with the assurance that the Lord will do as we ask. It is the request made by Bartimaeus: "Master, I want to see." Jesus not only gave Bartimaeus physical sight, more importantly he gave Bartimaeus spiritual sight.

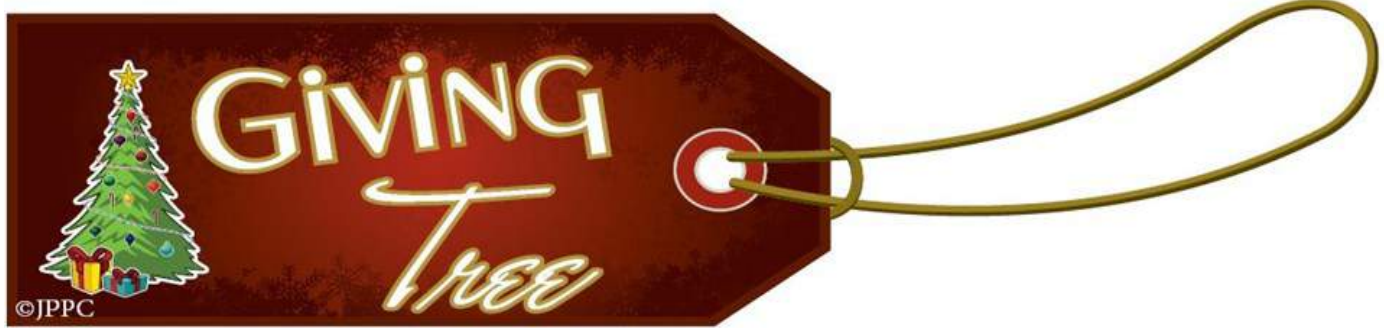
Bartimaeus was able to see the face of Jesus and able to recognize him as his Savior and Lord. That is why we are told that after his eyes were opened, Bartimaeus began to follow Jesus "on the way." He became a disciple.

We make many requests of the Lord, but perhaps the most important thing that we can ask Jesus to do for us is to open the eyes of our mind and heart. Then like Bartimaeus, we will be able to recognize Jesus as the Holy One in whom we discover the meaning and purpose of life and the way to eternal life.

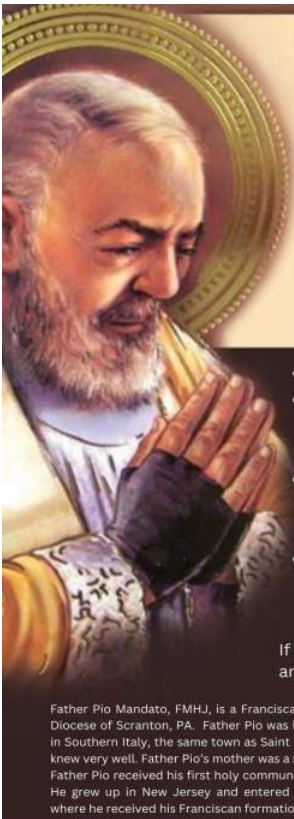

His parents came to Pietrelcina in Southern Italy, the same town as Saint Pio, the famous stigmatist priest, whom they knew very well. Father Pio's mother was a spiritual daughter of Saint Padre Pio. Father Pio received his first holy communion from Saint Pio before coming to the USA. He grew up in New Jersey and entered the Capuchin Franciscans at the age of 17, where he received his Franciscan formation and later his priestly ordination in 1985.

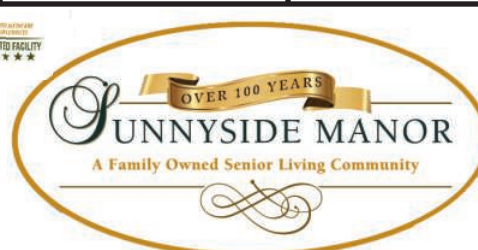
