Bishops of all the Dioceses of NJ: *Pro-Life Movement “Alive and Well”* - September 27, 2024

Thousands of pro-life activists gathered in Trenton on Thursday, September 26, 2024, for the inaugural New Jersey Mass and March for Life. The Mass, which was held at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption, was celebrated by Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, Archdiocese of Newark, Bishop David M. O’Connell, C.M., Trenton, Bishop, Kevin Sweeney, Paterson; Bishops Dennis J. Sullivan, and Joseph Williams, Camden; and Father Joseph Toborowsky, Bishop James F. Checchio’s delegate, Metuchen, concelebrated, along with more than 100 priests from parishes around the state. It was a standing room only crowd at the Cathedral, as more than 1,200 worshipers were in attendance.

Quotes by Bishop David M. O’Connell, C.M. Homily at the Pro life Mass

Diocese of Trenton, St. Mary of the Assumption Cathedral, Trenton - Sept. 26, 2024

“Duty to Protect.” In our document *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has reminded the Church in our country that “the threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed.” **Remember these words. Preeminent priority --- not the only priority but the preeminent (surpassing all others), fundamental basis of all other priorities. Directly attacks life itself--- not some other less significant aspect of reality but LIFE.. Takes place within the sanctuary of the family --- whether both parents contribute to the decision or not, they are still parents. Because of the number of lives destroyed --- ultimately, death is the choice and outcome whatever the reasons given.**

My sisters and brothers, the truth of that statement makes it unambiguously clear WHY we have a “duty to protect” ... the child in their mother’s womb, the child in their mother’s arms and beyond. All human life. Every human life. From conception to natural death. Ours is a “duty to protect.”

The USSCB has explained that "Given the scientific fact, the scientific truth that a human life begins at conception, the only moral norm needed to understand the Church's opposition to abortion is the principle that each and every human life has inherent dignity, and thus must be treated with the respect due to a human person. This is the foundation for the Church's social doctrine, including its teachings on war, the use of capital punishment, euthanasia, health care, poverty and immigration.

Today, in Trenton we in all the Dioceses of New Jersey affirm that “duty.” One need not be a Catholic to express and believe it. One needs only to be a rational, honest human being. But one cannot, however, BE a Catholic without that conviction rooted deep in our souls as a preeminent priority of our faith.

We are — all of us — created by God, created by God as we are. That is truth. *“Before I formed you in your mother’s womb, I knew you,”* --- the Prophet Jeremiah proclaimed this truth. *“Before you were born, I set you apart for my holy purpose (Jeremiah 1: 5).”* Our creation, our very lives, therefore, are no mistake, no accident and admit of no exception “to protect.” **That is truth.**

That is why it so important for us to join together as Catholics and to be counted together as pro-life. It is not simply one of many labels applied to us. **It is our “duty to protect” ... life.**

CONTRADICTION IDEAS

A reflection for October 6, The Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the beginning of creation, God made them male and female.

The man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.

What God has joined together, no human being must separate.

Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her, and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery.

Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them.

These words of Jesus in our Gospel are in sharp contrast to the ideas and beliefs that are current in society. Our society promotes the idea that individuals can be “re-created” and transition from one sex to another. Those who are created men can become women, and those who are created women can become men.

Our society no longer limits marriage to a male and female being joined together. Two men or two women can now be joined in “marriage.” Our society readily accepts divorce. Rather than being viewed as something that lasts until death, marriage is viewed more like a lease that can be broken easily. After all, relationships can weaken, people can outgrow one another, needs and expectations can change, and marriage vows are increasingly difficult to keep as life spans grow longer.

Our society no longer views children as a blessing that brings fulfillment and joy to a marriage. Rather children are seen by many as an inconvenience, a financial burden, a hindrance to one’s plans, a negative to be prevented or even eliminated in the womb.

Some might say that what Jesus preaches in Sunday’s Gospel is harsh, rigid, out of step with today’s world, and insensitive to the various circumstances in which people may find themselves.

Even the apostles seemed shocked when they heard the words of Jesus about divorce. For when Jesus and the apostles were in private, “the disciples again questioned Jesus about this.” In response, Jesus simply repeated what he said earlier. He reiterated God’s original plan for marriage that was built into creation itself. In the Book of Genesis, quoted in Sunday’s First Reading, we are told man and woman were created by God to share a partnership of love and community.

Today’s increasingly secular society has its views about the institution of marriage, the availability of divorce, the permanence of sexual identity, and the value of children. However, its views and ideas often contradict what God had in mind from the start of creation. That is very clear as we listen to what Jesus tells us in this Sunday’s Gospel.

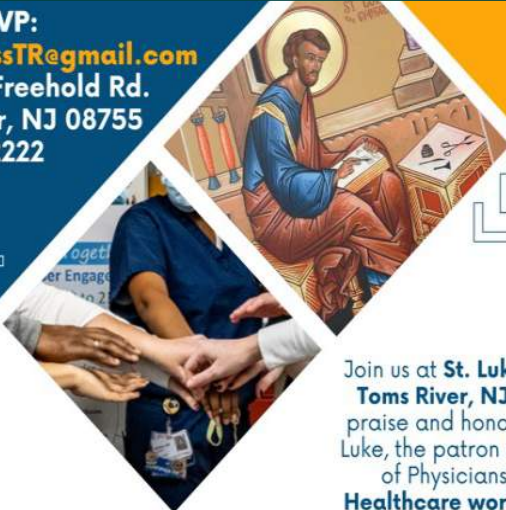

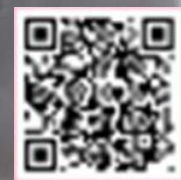
