Mortal Sin Prevents a Person From Worthily Receiving Holy Communion at Mass (Part 3 of 4 continued from last week)

If you do receive, you are committing another grave sin of sacrilege, which may be mortal. If you are uncertain you must go to confession before you receive. The article below is a relatively good understanding of classifying sins as mortal and venial. I have made **edits (bold face type)** and **crossed out** a few words or lines.

2. Taking a life

The fifth commandment states that a person should not kill because taking a life is a very grave matter. That's why acts like the following are some of the worst examples of mortal sins:

Abortion.

Abortion is killing a baby while it's still inside the womb. In Catholic doctrine, abortion still counts as ~~murder~~ **(mortal sin)** because a fetus has a life **(is a human being)** too. **(We do not know when a soul is instilled in a person, but as St. Pope John Paul II stated, we must reverence the baby in the womb as a caution against murdering a baby and in reverence for all human life. Disregarding a human life is serious, or grave matter.)**

Euthanasia. Also known as "mercy killing", euthanasia is still a grave matter and is considered a mortal sin. Regardless of the motive, it's still an act of murder.

Suicide. Taking a life, whether other people's or your own, is a grave offense. Life is life, no matter whose it is. **Many people are in a desperate condition when they consider or attempt suicide or attempt. We might say they are out of their mind (right thinking). We just don't know. Conditions 2 and or 3 may not be met (full knowledge and deliberate consent) very frequently they are not.**

Murder/Manslaughter. The fifth commandment literally prohibits this. Thus, you know full well that it's a sin, and yet you deliberately did it. All these make it one of the gravest of the mortal sins on this list.

3. Marital infidelity

Aside from the sixth commandment, many verses in the Bible have repeatedly emphasized that we should not commit adultery or marital infidelity. It's inherently immoral. Not to mention that it can tear families apart. Hence, any sexual act you do with someone other than your wife or husband is a mortal sin. Examples of this include:

Pornography. These days, watching or reading pornographic materials have become more common. But that doesn't make it less sinful. Pornography, in whatever medium, is a direct violation of the commandment against adultery. Even though there is no physical contact, it still involves lustful thoughts. As Mathew 5:28 says, just looking at someone with lustful intent is already committing adultery in your heart. **(Pornography and sexual addiction can be addictive sin, similar to alcoholism, and so full consent might not be present.)**

Fornication. Fornication is a sexual interaction between two people who are not bound by matrimony. ~~According to the bible,~~ **According to Church teaching** God prohibits it, and thus it can also be considered a mortal sin.

Prostitution. Prostitution is also a mortal sin unless you're a victim of sex trafficking. It is when you use your body for sex and ask for money in return. This act defiles your body and dishonors God.

Rape. Forcing yourself on someone is a grave matter and an act of pure evil. This mortal sin violates the integrity and freedom of the victim and can damage their soul for the rest of their life.

Sacred Heart Stained Glass Window Repair Update

Good News: the repair of our windows is ahead of schedule and should be complete in the next 10 days.

The reason we are doing the repairs is WATER; water has infiltrated the windows and caused damage. In the past, caulk and other sealants were placed on the interior perimeter to mitigate water issues but it only hid the problem and caused further damage. The steel ventilators rusted out and spalled (expanded) and caused some of the glass to break. Also, moisture got trapped between the exterior glass and stained glass, this caused the wood frames to swell and put additional pressure on the windows; the glass cracked and the lead was starting to fail. Minor bowing was found on some of the glass panels, some of the wood frames are mishapen and do not fit properly. The large exterior glass panel over the nativity window broke due to frame pressure.

The windows were removed, taken back to the studio and restored, each piece of glass was cleaned by hand, each panel was rebuilt with new lead. Broken glass was repaired with glass epoxy and shattered glass was recreated by internationally trained stained-glass artists. New aluminum cross bars are being installed on the restored glass. Once completed, laminated glass with ventilation holes will be placed on the exterior and sealed. The cost for the repair of our altar windows and the choir loft windows is \$77,363.

Prayer Anthology #63

Focus Point: Much of the "theme" during Ordinary Time is the Eucharist. As we reflect we are reminded that we are called to be One in Christ through the Sacrament of Communion. The Lord asks us to do unto others as He would do. Father Joy tells us that God asks us to love every person as God loves them. In these times of unrest, we need to gain that ability to love each time we receive the Eucharist by receiving God's grace and mercy. So, as Jesus suffered on the Cross for us, are we making it important to remain in grace and receive the body, blood, soul and divinity of the Eucharist as often as possible? Padre Pio tells us to ask the Lord to stay with us after Communion and remember that He is our only light and salvation.

Prayer after Communion:

Dear Lord, I give You thanks for the gift of of the Sacrament of the Eucharist. And through my confession to You, I am strengthened in my desire to reject sin and obtain Your gift of obedience. 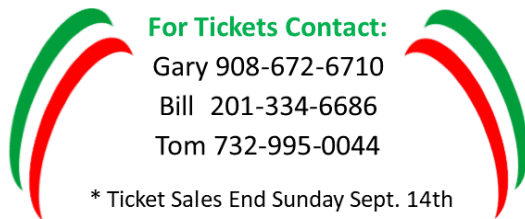

HEART & MIND

A reflection for September 1, The Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

What part of the human body is most associated with Christianity?

If we were asked that question, we might respond the “heart.” The heart often symbolizes love, and Christianity is certainly focused on love. As Jesus told his disciples, “*You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.... You shall love your neighbor as yourself.*” (Matthew 22:37, 39).

Jesus tells his hearers that what defiles people is not anything that comes from outside but rather from what comes from their hearts, namely, “evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly.”

To fully understand these words of Jesus about what comes from the human heart, we need to appreciate how the people Jesus was addressing viewed the “heart.” For them, the heart was not simply associated with love and feelings. It was the place where thinking, decisions and choices were made. The heart was the organ of human will and intellect.

The essence of our faith is not simply a matter of feelings of the heart but is also the center of our thinking and choices that we make. Evil thoughts and actions that Jesus condemns, come from our hearts and minds.

Those Jesus criticizes for honoring God only with their lips are those who say the right words but fail to make choices and decisions in accord with God’s law. Their “hearts” are not in the right place.
