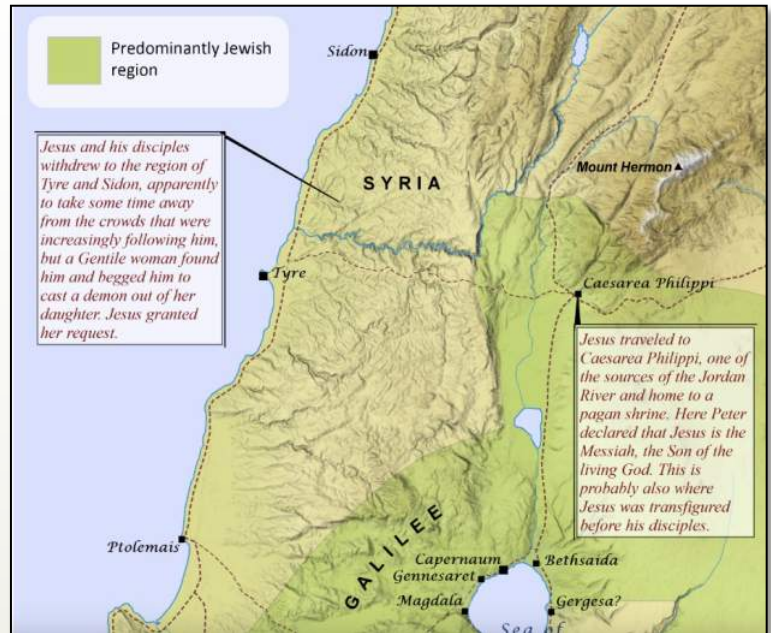

Peter acknowledges Jesus the Messiah, the Christ at Caesarea Philippi at the base of Mt. Hermon

The city of Caesarea Philippi was a Greco Roman city during the time of Jesus. It was a strategic location for travelers, merchants, and armies that wanted to travel from the east to journey to Greece, Italy (Rome), and Europe by way of Syrian Damascus to The Mediterranean coastal port of Tyre. They would then travel by ship from Tyre to those locations. Caesarea Philippi was located at the north-eastern corner of Galilee, and is at the base of Mt. Hermon, a mountain range which is 43 miles long. The peak of Mt. Hermon itself is over 9200 ft. above sea level. It is the tallest mountain in all of Israel and Syria. On a clear day, you can see the snow covered peak from various places on the western shore of the Sea of Galilee, about 25 miles to the south west. Since ancient times it has been considered a sacred mountain to the Hebrews and Canaanites.



The very name “Hermon” means sacred, taboo, or set apart. The northern-most outpost of Israel, the city of Dan, was one of the two religious cultic sites of the Northern Kingdom. Dan was destroyed by the Assyrian Armies about 732 B.C. who conquered N. Israel.

The area for miles around Mt. Hermon, receives over 60 inches of rain a year. The snowmelt and rainfall water provides the water for the Jordan river emanating from the streams at the base of Mt Hermon and flows south to the Dead Sea. Even the dew of Mt. Hermon was noted in the Psalms, for the blessing of its’ dew that waters and gives life to the lands.

After the Syrian Greeks took control of Judea, they built a shrine to the Greek god Pan at the base of Mt. Hermon, where a spring flowed from a cave in an outcropping of rugged red rock. They called the site “Panias.” Pan was a Greek god of nature, forests, shepherds, and fertility. Pan was also a god of lustful sexuality. It was believed the stream flowed from the bottomless pit inside the cave. At times animal and human sacrifices were offered there and thrown into the pit. When the Romans came, they called this jagged rock-faced cave with its’ spring “the gates of Hades” or “Hell.” Some believed the waters connected to the subterranean “Waters of the Deep,” that Scripture mentions.

Herod the Great built a temple to Caesar Augustus here and when he died, this territory was granted to Herod Philip, one of his sons. Herod Philip made Caesarea Philippi the capital and administrative center of his tetrarchy. At the time of Jesus, mostly pagans lived there.

Ancient folklore and beliefs about Mt. Hermon and the surrounding area. Some were contained in the 1st Book of Enoch, a non-biblical apocryphal text popular at the time. It contained the story of the “son of man” the “Messiah” who would come as the judge of the world

It is at this site, that Jesus declares Peter “the rock” and that the “gates of Hell” will not prevail against His Church and names Peter its’ head. It is at this place that Peter comes to believe Jesus is the “Messiah,” the son of God.

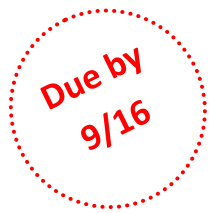

WHO AM I?

A reflection for September 15, The Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"You are the Christ." This was Peter's response when Jesus asked his disciples, "But who do you say that I am?" The disciples had just told Jesus that people were saying he was John the Baptist, or Elijah, or some other prophet. When Peter gave the right answer, Jesus warned him and the other disciples not to share that information with anyone. It may seem strange that Jesus would not want his disciples to reveal his identity.

Jesus ordered his disciples not to announce that he was the Christ because people had a wrong understanding of what that title meant. For them, the Christ would be a military and political leader who would free them from the power of Rome and restore the Kingdom of David.

Since this belief fit Peter's understanding, he was upset when Jesus began to tell his disciples that the Christ "must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days."

In fact, Peter was so disturbed by what Jesus said, that he took Jesus "aside and began to rebuke him." Peter was thinking of the Christ, thinking of the Messiah, in terms of worldly power and glory. As Jesus told Peter, "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." It was only after the Resurrection of Jesus that Peter and the other disciples came to truly understand what it meant for Jesus to be the Christ: it meant suffering and the cross.

The mistake that Peter made in understanding Jesus is an error that is still made today. Many people view Jesus in terms of their own expectations and try to fit Jesus into their pre-conceived notions. Some people view Jesus Christ as an ethical teacher or philosopher who offers advice for moral living. Others view him as a glorified "life coach" who reveals the way to personal fulfillment and even financial success.

Some people consider Jesus to be an activist for social change, who attacks unjust systems and advocates for the poor and the forgotten. Others make Jesus into a supporter of a particular cause or issue of the moment. Some people quote only the words of Jesus that speak of acceptance, mercy, and understanding, and like Peter, want to silence Jesus when he speaks of suffering, judgement, and the cross.

Our Gospel gives us an important part of the answer to Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?". Jesus is the Christ who tells us, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."
