For everyone will be salted with fire!

Mark's gospel reading presents ways for the disciples (including ourselves) to grow and be transfigured (changed) to be more in-synch with the mind of Jesus. It is a pain-filled transformation. Unfortunately, the Lectionary left out verse 49 of Mark 9, which is the culmination of this series of teachings which says, **"For everyone will be salted with fire."** This is a difficult saying to interpret. The phrase combines the images of salt and fire, both of which purify. Salt purifies through burning, while fire purifies through refinement (like gold refined in fire). The Paulist Press Biblical Commentary states: "it is preferable to understand the saying as referring to the trials through the faithful become a pleasing sacrifice to God... to gain life (eternal life) one must be prepared to suffer loss."

The loss is the loss is our old "comfortable" way of thinking, and acting in the new way, which is the challenges of Jesus' words in the Gospel. It's like Jesus saying that we need to put new wine into new wineskins. I suggest you read all of Chapter 9 of Mark's Gospel, especially if you have a family and children, and are trying to teach them the way of thinking with the mind of Christ.

A few more teachings Jesus presents in the gospel today:

Don't strive to be the best known and well liked, to be the most important one with all the power and prestige; rather be a humble servant of the servants. Kids can easily relate to this if they play team sports. Individuals must sacrifice for the team to win "together." View everyone as having a vital part to play.

Don't simply stay in your own clique, don't be exclusive. Be open to the truths that others, (outsiders) can teach and do, some may be very good things as well. Listen deeply to others, before we accept or reject their ideas. Look for the good in them, even if it seems small.

Make sure the way you talk and what you do are consistent. It's called "integrity." If you do not, people will see you as a hypocrite. Be an example. Look for the root causes, not the external (feet, hands eyes) obvious ways we sin that we keep doing over and over (habitual faults or sins). That is what an "examination of conscience is all about." Find the cause and work to eliminate it. We don't have to be perfect, but we must strive. Know that that is what confession is for: to help us be accountable, and to grow in the "mind of God."

SPIRITUAL HEALTH

A reflection for September 29, The Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

If we want to be in good health, we know there are certain things we should do.

We need to exercise. We need to eat a nourishing diet. We need to get sufficient sleep. We need to quit smoking and stop relying on alcohol or drugs to get us through the day.

Medical professionals have been giving us such advice for years. But as we know, there is a big difference between knowing and doing.

In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells us that if we want to be spiritually healthy, there are things we need to do. That begins with getting rid of those things that lead us into sin.

Jesus tells us, "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off...If your foot causes you to sin, cut it off...If your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out." Jesus was not telling people to disfigure their bodies to grow in holiness. Rather, in dramatic fashion, Jesus is telling us to take a close look at what we are doing with our hands, our feet, and our eyes.

We are to make sure we are using our hands to do good, to assist our neighbor, and to build up God's kingdom on earth. Hands were not made to do evil or to hurt others.

We are to make certain our feet are taking us to places where we can pray with our fellow Christians and grow in faith. We are not to frequent places where temptations abound, where Christian values are mocked, or sinful behavior is extolled.

We are to make sure that our eyes are focused on Jesus, on the teaching of the Gospel, on our obligations to our families, and on the promises that we have made to God. We are not to allow our eyes to be captured by all the enticing objects and lurid images that society sets before us to pull us away from the Lord.

If we want to be physically healthy, there are certainly things we need to do and certain behaviors we need to avoid.

That is equally true when it comes to our spiritual health. There are things we need to do, and certain behaviors we need to cut out of our lives. If we fail to do so, we not only damage our spiritual health, but we also run the risk, as Jesus tells us, of being "thrown into Gehenna where...the fire is not quenched."

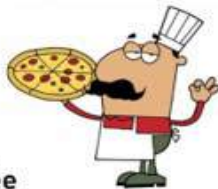

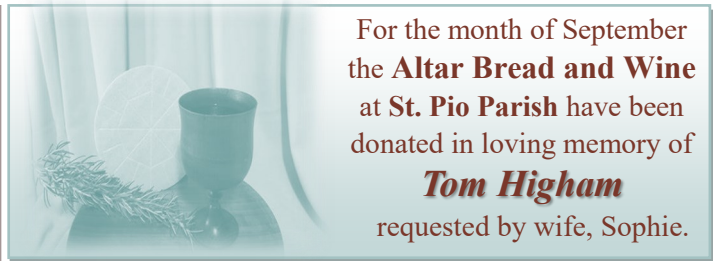

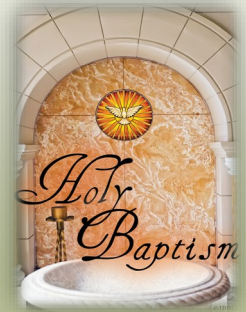
